# BOOK REVIEW

New at the Kitsap Regional Library:

Genealogical Register of Plymouth Families, by William T. Davis, Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1975, 363 pp. Originally published as Part II of Ancient Landmarks of Plymouth in 1899, this work has no index, but it is in alphabetical order for major surnames. Shelved in the reference room--R929.1097.

Shorey's Book Store in Seattle stocks a booklet which might interest "natives" of this area: Supplement to "The Port Orchard Independent"—Kitsap County Business Review of 1901. This illustrated booklet covers early days in Kitsap County, Bremerton, Port Blakely, Port Gamble, Pleasant Beach, Poulsbo, etc. The price is \$4.50.

From Heritage House, Rt. 1, Box 211, Thomson, Illinois 61285:

OHIO MARRIAGES Extracted from the Old Northwest Genealogical Quarterly, edited by M. Smith, 1975, 354 pp., \$15.00. "The Old Northwest" Genealogical Quarterly was published from 1898 through 1912. The marriages in the resulting 15 volumes have been extracted and arranged alphabetically under the grooms' surnames and the brides' maiden names in this single volume. Dates and places of the marriages are given, as well as the names of the persons performing the ceremonies. The book is hardbound and  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$  in size.

From The Reprint Company, P. O. Box 5401, Spartanburg, SC 29304:

Military Annals of Mississippi, J. C. Rietti, compiler; 1976; 244 pp.; \$15.00; Indexed. This reprint edition has a complete name index and contains brief historical sketches and rolls and rosters of military organizations in the service of the Confederacy from the state of Mississippi.

Has your <u>Revolutionary War</u> ancestor still got you stumped? The <u>Seattle Public Library</u> has more than 150 books which are especially useful in genealogical research for that time period—not all of them are in the part of the library designated as the "Genealogical Section"—don't forget to check the main card catalog!

This list doesn't even scratch the surface—there are 6 volumes dealing with Revolutionary War pensions alone. Books are available on more than half of the States—including Washington. In a future "Book Review", I'll cover some of these.
