THIRD GENERATION OF EARLY BREMERTON FAMILY IN SAME BUSINESS

The Lewis Funeral Chapel of Bremerton is now in the 3rd generation of the Lewis family since its beginning in 1908. Fred R. Lewis, the first of this family, was born at Essex, Page County, Iowa to the David R. Lewis's on June 10, 1876. Fred Lewis and his wife Josephine had the following children: Lester M., Paul R., Frederick Richard, Arlene & Georgia. The family came to Seattle, Washington in the early 1900's where Fred Lewis was employed by the Butterworth & Sons Undertakers. He came to Bremerton to manage their office here and in 1908 he purchased this office and it became the Fred R. Lewis Undertaker, and was located on Burwell Street where the Roddy Studio is now. In 1912 a new building was constructed on 5th street with the new name of the Lewis Funeral Chapel. In 1922 Lester M. Lewis joined his father in the business. Fred R. Lewis passed away April 14, 1935 at the age of 59 years and at this time Lester M.& Paul Lewis and George Cassity formed a partnership, Paul Lewis left the partnership after a short time and George Cassity died in 1954 and Lester M. Lewis became sole owner. Lester M. Lewis has one son, Lester M. Lewis Jr. who joined his father in the business in 1956 for the 3rd generation. Lester Lewis Jr. has two children, Kathleen age 12 years and Steven R. age 9. Will they be the 4th generation in the Lewis Funeral Chapel business???

Other additions to the Lewis Funeral Chapel was in 1924 the purchase of the Poulsbo Mortuary and in 1957 a new stone building was constructed as a new home for the Poulsbo Mortuary. The community of Poulsbo referred to this new building as the Stone Chapel and it has retained this name. An interesting side note is that the Poulsbo Mortuary was purchased from the Paul Paulson estate and it was from this family that Poulsbo got its name.

The only Cemetery in Brmerton was Ivy Green Cemetery until 1931 when the Lewis's purchased the land for the Forest Lawn Cemetery, first burial in this new cemetery was in 1934.

Lester M. Lewis Sr. has seen a lot of changes in the mortuary business over the years, some that he told me about were, prior to 1920 all funerals were from the homes so the undertaker would take his equipment to the homes to prepare the body. They would go by horseback, or with horse and buggy or wagon. Funerals were at least one hour to one and a half hours, if shorter "people weren't laid away properly" Over the years this has changed to what we now have of about 30 minutes. Slumber rooms as we know them did not exist prior to 1930's. All bodies were kept in one large room, which was very plain and bare, no drapes on the windows and no carpets on the floor. It was beleived that the room was much cleaner without all these "frills".

Following are listings of early burials from the Lewis Funeral Chapel, Bremerton Washington. Some of this writting in the old books was very difficult to read, we did the best we could but some of the names may be misspelled. SKETCHES OF BREMERTON CITY OFFICERS -- FROM December 7, 1901 BREMERTON NEWS

AND THE POLY OF LEADING THE STREET

A. L. CROXTON (Mayor)

A. L. Croxton, elected at the Laws of incorporation and re-elected Tuesday, was born in Warsaw, Wis., in 1868, and received his education in the high schools there and at La Crosse and at Minneapolis, Minn. While yet in school he began the study of electricity and followed electrical work in several cities of the East. From 1890 to 1896 he was employed by the Standard Electric Co., of Chicago, as superintendent of the Hyde Park electric plant, superintendent of their world's fair exhibit, representative of the company at the California mid-winter exposition and in other important positions. In 1896 he came to California. He was employed in the Mare Island yard for two years, coming to Bremerton in 1899. He received the appointment as master electrician, yards and docks department, which position he has since held.

M. J. HOLT (Treasurer)

M. J. Holt, elected at the time of incorporation and re-elected Tuesday, was born in Cottage Grove, Minn., in 1871. When quite young he moved with his parents to Iowa and later went to Wyoming. After spending about eight years in the western states, he came to Seattle in the fall of 1893 and in the spring of 1894 came to Port Orchard bay. Here he has lived and shown an interest in the growth of our city until the present time. Since 1895 he has been employed in the Yard in charge of the general storehouse under the paymaster.

A. P. STIRES (Councilman)

A. P. Stires, elected at the time of incorporation and re-elected Tuesday, was born in Ohio in 1855, and there he resided for twentynine years. After receiving his education at the public schools there, he began work as a carpenter. In 1884 he moved to Iowa and later to Kansas. In January 1892 he came to Washington and in February first saw Bremerton, consisting at that time of two houses, but only remained a short time. From here he went to Snohomish. Returning to Bremerton in the fall of the same year, he put up the building that was later used by J. H. Nibbe as a store and postoffice. After a trip East he returned in 1897 to Bremerton, entered the government employ as a carpenter and has resided here continuously since that time.

J. J. KOST (Councilman)

J. J. Kost was born in Pittsburg, Pa., in 1864, and there reared and there received his education in the public schools. While still quite young he begun work in a ship yard near Pittsburg. When about eighteen years of age he left for New York city where he worked as ship joiner for about four years, but having heard of the land of promise in the west, came direct to Seattle in 1887. Between this time and the year 1895 he worked at the joiners trade at different points on the Pacific Coast. He then, after a trip to South America, returned

to New York city, but again in the fall of 1898 returned to Seattle. In May, 1900, he accepted employment as ship joiner at the Navy Yard and has been located in Bremerton most of the time since.

THOS. DRISCOLL (Councilman)

Thomas Driscoll was born in Ireland in the year 1845. When

eighteen years of age he emigrated to the United States arriving in Boston in 1863 and soon after enlisted in the U. S. navy. In 1866 he went to Buffalo, New York, where he was married to Miss Alice McCabe in 1869. He engaged in the grocery business a(nd) was later a police officer in that city. In 1882 he moved to North Dakota and located at Jamestown where he engaged in the hotel business and where he was elected to three successive terms in the city council. In 1893 he moved to Superior, Wis., and in 1899 came west to Butte Co., Cal., where he engaged in fruit raising. In November, 1900, he moved to Şeattle and in February of this year attracted by the bright prospects of the Navy Yard town, invested in property and located here.

F. W. CODER (Councilman)

F. W. Coder was born in Goshen, Ind., in 1860. When quite young he moved with his parents to Iowa, Missouri and Kansas, and in 1874 to California. There he received his schooling in the public schools of Oakland. After leaving school he learned the carpentering trade of his father and for some years worked at the trade with him. On his twenty-first birthday he was married to Miss Bettie Hepworth at Ukiah, Cal. On February 15, 1898, the day the Maine was destroyed in Havana harbor he arrived in Bremerton but located first at Decatur and begun the work of contracting and building. Later, in March of last year, he moved to Bremerton. He has worked continuously at his trade and has constructed several of the largest buildings in Bremerton.

C. HANSON (Councilman)

C. Hanson was born in Lincolnshire, England in 1848. When five years of age he came with his parents to this country and located at Oswego, N. Y. In Oswego he received a public school education and while yet young begun work in and later, for several years, had charge of the box factory for the Oswego Starch Co. He then learned the trade of pattern maker and builder and had charge of the Omer ironworks pattern shop for five years. In 1879 he moved to Chicago and then to Janesville, Wis. In November, 1890, he arrived in Seattle. After

working at the A. B. Todd Foundry Co., Tacoma, and other shops on the Sound, at the San Francisco Union Iron Works, and at the Fulton Iron Works of that place, and as head pattern maker for the Puget Sound Iron and Steel Works for two years, he arrived in Bremerton in April, 1900, where he has since been employed as pattern maker in the Yard.
