

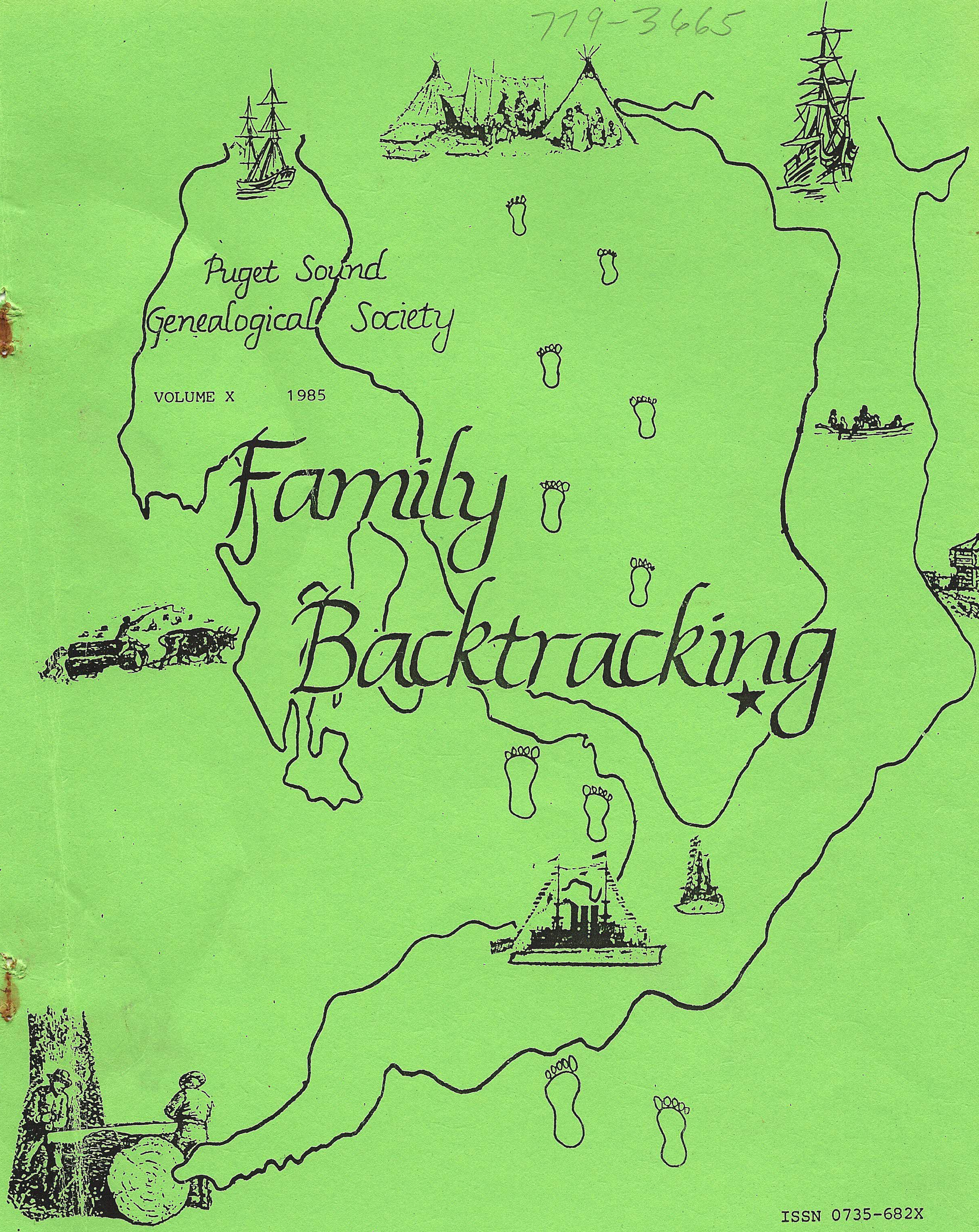

In closing many, many thanks to this year's officers and much gratitude to those who have volunteered their time and energy to head committees in the club. This club simply would not function if not for these volunteers!!

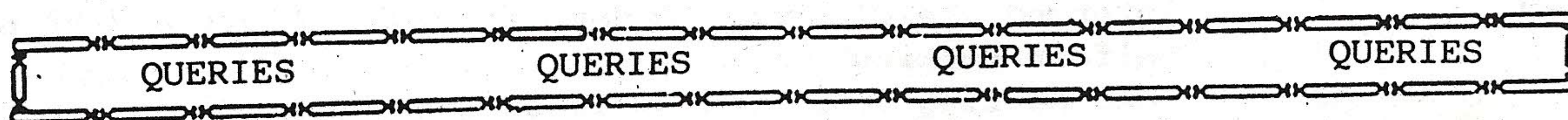

Our French-Canadian Ancestors. Volume 2. by Thomas J. LaForest. 1984.

PUGET SOUND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY
BY-LAWS

Revised May 13, 1983

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this club shall be Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES

The purpose of this club shall be to:

1. Develop a closer contact among genealogists.
2. To stimulate education in the practices and procedures of genealogy.
3. To encourage and promote the organization of chapters.
4. To support the Federation of Genealogical Societies.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

There shall be four (4) classes of members, with qualifications for each as follows:

1. Regular Membership: Regular membership shall be composed of any person who is interested in and is researching family history.
2. Family Membership: A family membership shall be composed of a husband and wife and children under 18 years of age. Those joining at the family rate shall receive only one club bulletin.
3. Honorary Membership: Any chapter membership by their vote may recognize exceptional service, distinction and loyalty to our club by recommendation to the Executive Board a member or non-member as an Honorary Member for one (1) year. Recommendation is subject to the approval of the Executive Board.
4. Lifetime Membership: Lifetime Membership may be granted upon recommendation by the Executive Board and voted by the membership; however, to maintain the Lifetime Membership the person must actively support our club.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this club shall be a President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. All officers must be actively engaged in genealogy research and must have been a paid-up member for at least one (1) year.

Section 2. These officers shall be elected at the October meeting, and shall hold office for one term, or until their successors are duly installed. a period of twelve (12) months shall constitute a term. Officers may serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms in any one office.

Section 3. If any office except that of President becomes vacant during the year, a successor to fill the unexpired term shall be named by the Executive Board. A vacancy in the office of President shall be filled by the 1st Vice President for the unexpired term.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of our club and the Executive Board, shall appoint all committees not already provided for, shall be ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee, shall in general supervise all the activities of our club, and perform such other duties as pertain to this office.

Section 2. Vice Presidents

(a) The 1st Vice President shall perform the duties of the President when the President is absent and shall be Chairperson of the Educational Committee. Shall perform other duties as pertain to this office.

(b) The 2nd Vice President shall be Chairperson of the Membership and Publicity Committee and shall perform other duties as pertain to this office.

Section 3. Secretaries

(a) The Recording Secretary shall keep a complete record of all meetings of the club and of the Executive Board, making a copy for the President. Shall keep an accurate record of attendance of each meeting and shall monthly submit a list of all guests to the Membership Chairperson. Shall perform other duties as pertain to this office.

(b) The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence and keep copies of all correspondence on file. She/he shall be responsible for keeping the Club's Pedigree, Surname and Locality files up to date. Shall perform other duties as pertain to this office, and shall be Chairperson of the Research and Surname Committee.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall make deposits monthly, pay all bills as authorized by the club, and sign all checks. Shall issue receipts for all monies received, submit monthly reports to the President, maintain an up-to-date set of record books as established and adopted by the Club's Executive Board, and shall present books for auditing by the Auditing Committee quarterly or as directed by the President. Shall be Chairperson of the Budget Committee and shall perform other duties as pertain to this office.

ARTICLE VI EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1: The Executive Board shall consist of the elected officers of PSGS and shall include two (2) elected members from each chapter and the PSGS Librarian, Bulletin Editor and Ways and Means Chairperson plus the immediate Past President of PSGS.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall determine and control all financial expenditures with the approval of the majority of the club members at a regular meeting.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall meet four (4) times each year. Special meetings may be called by the President, or by a majority of the Board at any time and place they shall designate.

ARTICLE VII DUES

Section 1. Dues of this society shall be \$10.00 per year for an individual member and \$12.00 per year for family memberships. Dues are due and payable by January 1 and delinquent after February 1 of each year. New members joining between July 1 and November 30 pay one-half year's dues (\$5.00 single, \$6.00 family). New members joining in December shall pay a full year's dues, this to cover dues through the following December.

Section 2. Members may not vote, hold office or receive any official publications until dues are paid. When half-year dues are paid, that member will only receive half of our Club bulletins; family memberships received only one Volume of our Bulletin per year. Memberships are automatically cancelled if dues are not paid on or before February 1.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

Section 1. The annual election of officers shall be at the October meeting each year. The club year begins January 1 and ends December 31.

Section 2. Regular meetings of this club shall be held the second Thursday of each month and the Club Library open on the fourth Thursday of each month, or at such time and place as the Executive Board shall designate.

Section 3 Special meetings shall be called by the President or upon the written request of three members of the club. No business shall be transacted except that specified in the call to the meeting.

ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES

Section 1. The President shall appoint the following committees unless they

are otherwise provided for in these By-Laws, within thirty (30) days following his/her election. These committees shall serve as standing committees for the Club year: (a) Nominating, (b) Educational, (c) Membership and Publicity, (d) Ways and Means, (e) Budget, (f) Hostess and Refreshments, (g) Librarian and Books, (h) Bulletin, (i) Auditing, (j) Special Projects, (k) Research and Surname. Special committees may be appointed from time to time as they are deemed necessary and approved by the Executive Board.

Section 2. All Committees will make written monthly reports to the President. At the December meeting each year, all committees will make a written report of their operating expenses for the year to the President Elect.

ARTICLE X DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. NOMINATING. This committee shall consist of the immediate Past President and two (2) members to be elected by the membership. The duties of this committee shall be to nominate candidates for each office and present their nominations at the September meeting. Election will be by voice vote at the October meeting. If more than one nominee for any office, that election shall be by ballot.

Section 2. EDUCATIONAL. This committee shall be chaired by the 1st Vice President and shall plan the year's program, shall arrange for the presentation of any lessons, and shall provide speakers or entertainment for other meetings as required by the Executive Board.

Section 3. MEMBERSHIP AND PUBLICITY.

(a) Membership. This committee shall be chaired by the 2nd Vice President and shall be responsible to: 1. collect all dues and submit same to the Treasurer; 2. issue membership cards for all chapters; 3. prepare name tags and maintain nametag boards; 4. maintain the membership file; 5. provide monthly new member list to all officers and the Bulletin Editor.

(b) Publicity. This committee shall be chaired by the 2nd Vice President and shall be responsible for all publicity pertaining to the club: 1. monthly promotional posters at all local libraries; 2. shall provide notice of club's monthly meetings to all County Newspapers and other appropriate periodicals; 3. to organize and develop any special publicity needed for seminars and/or fund raising projects. The Club Historian, appointed by the President, shall also be a member of the Publicity Committee. The Historian's responsibility shall be to maintain the club scrapbook.

Section 4. WAYS AND MEANS. This committee shall devise ways and means for increasing the revenue of the club.

Section 5. BUDGET. This committee shall be composed of the outgoing Treasurer as the chairperson, the incoming Treasurer, Vice Presidents, President and the immediate Past President. Within sixty (60) days after their election, they shall prepare and submit to the membership an estimated budget for the year, to be approved by the membership. This committee shall review the budget quarterly or at the request of the Executive Board for possible adjustments.

Section 6. HOSTESS AND REFRESHMENTS. This committee shall (a) act as hostess at all meetings and social functions, and (b) shall be responsible for arranging for the providing of refreshments at each meeting, and (c) shall be responsible for cleaning the refreshment area.

Section 7. LIBRARIAN AND BOOKS. This committee shall be responsible for all duties as pertaining to the Library: (a) Cataloging and shelving all acquisitions monthly, (b) Be in charge of the inter-library loan system, (c) Keeping up to date the Vertical File, (d) Submit a list of suggested books for purchase to the membership, (e) Submit monthly written reports to the President with copies to the Corresponding Secretary and the Book Review columnist (club Bulletin), (f) Be in charge of re-ordering of supplies, and (g) Be in charge of care of our microfilm/microfiche readers.

Section 8. BULLETIN. This committee shall be chaired by the Bulletin Editor and shall be responsible for the publishing and distributing of our club quarterly bulletin "FAMILY BACKTRACKING", and shall be in charge of all bulletin exchange requests.

Section 9. AUDITING. This committee shall be composed of the Past Treasurer, the Past President and one (1) member appointed by the President and shall be responsible for the auditing of the Treasurer's books quarterly or at the request of the President and/or Executive Board.

Section 10. SPECIAL PROJECTS. This committee shall be responsible for any on-going statistical extraction programs, such as courthouse extracting and cemetery indexing, or as established during the year.

Section 11. RESEARCH AND SURNAME. This committee shall answer any genealogical correspondence received by the Club.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by two-thirds vote of those members present, provided written notice of such amendments was submitted to all members sixty (60) days prior to the meeting.

ARTICLE XII CODE OF ETHICS

In order to protect the integrity of public records and library books, I am ethically bound and hereby agree:

(1) That I will treat with the greatest care and respect all public records and library books which may be made available for my use.

(2) That I will speak with courtesy to all employees of a vital records office, or of a public library, when requesting to see any vital record or library book, and that when finished with such record or book, I shall express my thanks to the person attending to my request.

(3) That I will not tear, erase, mark or remove any public record or library book, and will refrain from mutilating, defacing or otherwise destroying any part of such public record or library book.

(4) That when I have finished viewing any public record or library book, I will return it to the proper or designated place.

(5) That I will not repeat or publish any item which will reveal the illegitimacy of any person born within the past 75 years.

ARTICLE XIII CHAPTERS OF THE SOCIETY

Section 1. The Executive Board may approve establishment of a chapter outside of Bremerton School District 100C upon written petition of at least 10 persons.

Section 2. All Chapter members must be dues-paying members of Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

Section 3. A chapter may collect chapter dues as agreed upon by its members in addition to the dues submitted to Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

Section 4. Each chapter will elect at organization and thence annually in October a Chairperson, a Treasurer and such officers as the chapter decides. After the organizing year, the Chairperson must have been a member of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society for at least one (1) year. No officer may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms of one year each. Following completion of one term out of that office, a member may again be elected to that Chapter chair. The Chairperson and the Treasurer are members of the Executive Board of Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

Section 5. Each chapter will elect at organization and thence annually in October a representative to the Puget Sound Genealogical Society Executive Board. The representative will be a member of the Board. After the organizing year, the representative must have been a member of Puget Sound Genealogical Society for at least one (1) year. No representative may serve more than two (2) terms of one year each. Following the completion of one term out of that office, a member may be again elected to the chapter representative position.

Section 6. Each chapter will make a quarterly report of its activities and programs to the Executive Board.

Section 7. Each chapter will be budgeted annually from the general account of Puget Sound Genealogical Society. The Chapter Treasurer must make a quarterly report to the Treasurer of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

THE FOLLOWING item is from the Marion, Ohio Daily Star of May 22, 1882:

DASTARDLY ATTEMPT TO BURN THE COURT HOUSE

Some miscreant poured about a gallon of oil on the main stairway of the Court House on Saturday night, with the evident purpose of firing the building, but was probably frightened away by the night watchman before he could set fire to the oil. We think the Commissioners should investigate this matter and if possible bring the guilty fiend to justice. If our Court House should be destroyed the loss to the people of Marion Co. would be irreparable, to say nothing of the almost endless expense which would occur in litigation. We hope no effort will be spared in running down the dastard who has attempted to do so much damage.

New England Marriages Prior to 1700, by Clarence Almon Torrey

The above manuscript, which is in the possession of the New England Historical and Genealogical Society in Boston, was reviewed in The Newsletter of the Institute of Family History of July 1981, which article was reprinted in 1981 Federation of Genealogical Societies newsletters.

The manuscript contains a list of about 37,000 marriages performed prior to 1700 either in New England or the mother country. The data is compiled into five columns as follows:

1. Husband's names listed alphabetically, but surprisingly the data usually gives the wife's maiden name.
2. Marriage dates are in column 2. If this date is unknown, the information contains the year of birth of the oldest child.
3. Place of marriage is in column 3. If the marriage took place in England, this is given too.
4. Column 4 contains the year of birth of both spouses.
5. Column 5 contains Sources of Information. The reviewer states that this information often spills over into the first two columns and provides a vast index to all references to married New Englanders up to 1700. Torrey indexed about 2000 sources and listed about 100,000 references.

Reviewers estimate he found about 95 to 99% of all marriages at that time, and identified about 70% of the wives' maiden names.

Torrey was a librarian at the University of Chicago for many years. He was born in 1870 and died in 1962. He evidently retired from his librarian post and moved to Dorchester, Massachusetts where he worked for almost 35 years (working daily in the Society library) compiling the information. The New England society acquired his manuscript in 1962 and issued a photocopy, consisting of 12 volumes, in 1972.
