CLUB NEWS

A MILESTONE. This month marks the end of the Lewis Funeral Chapel burial records. The records first started appearing in Family Backtracking in 1976. The laborious work of copying was done by Carol Neumann, Myrna Bryant and Marlys Marrs. Starting with the August issue, Kitsap County marriages dating from 1866 will be published.

FALL SEMINAR. The Seminar committee has met and reports the following details. Scharlott Blevins, well-known lecturer in genealogy, will conduct the seminar. The date is Saturday, October 5. The place is St. Paul's Episcopal Church, 700 Callahan Drive, Bremerton. Time is 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.. Cost is \$12 pre-registration and \$14 at the door.

Topics will include naturalization and passenger ship records, land records, Iowa or Kansas research, and German genealogy.

Participants will be asked to bring a brown bag lunch, or lunch may be obtained at nearby restaurants (the Sea Galley comes to mind). However, beverages, snacks and bakery goodies will be available. A free will donation will be asked for these items. Door prizes will be awarded in the afternoon.

TACOMA SEMINAR. Two weeks later (October 19) we can all attend the Tacoma Seminar. The fifth annual conference of the National Genealogical Society will be held in Salt Lake City August 6-9, 1985. The Federation conference will be in Kansas City some time in September, and if the dates fall right you can also attend the British Federation conference in Chelmsford, England September 13-15.

SALT LAKE GENEALOGY LIBRARY. October 14 to 24 is the tentative date set for removal of the LDS genealogical library to a brand new building now being built on West Temple, across the street from the Tabernacle.

FREDI PERRY. Fredi Perry, who will be our speaker in June, reports she is now working on a genealogy for Howard Duff, movie actor who was born in Bremerton. This issue of the Backtracker features 1904 newspaper accounts of deaths in Kitsap County, as gleaned by Fredi in her study of newspaper records. She also recently was able to answer a query that appeared in a 1979 Backtracker. Patience is indeed the main personality trait for a genealogist!

WASHINGTON STATE RECORDS. The cost of birth, death and marriage records is now \$6 apiece.

KITSAP CO. HISTORICAL SOCIETY. At the March meeting the club voted to finance the purchase of two volumes of the Bremerton Sun for the use of the Kitsap County Historical Society.

Computer Genealogy. A Guide to Research through High Technology. By Paul A. Andereck & Richard Pence. 1985. \$12.95 (Donated to PSGS by Ancestry, P. O. Box 476, Salt Lake City, UT)

If you have ever wondered whether a computer could help you with your genealogy, this book is for you! The authors have provided an excellent introduction to how to combine computers and genealogy. They tell you how to choose a computer and a program that will work with your computer. They demystify such "computerese" as: RAM, ROM, peripherals, software, floppy disks, etc. They provide representative print-outs of many of the genealogy programs currently available and provide a directory of genealogy software publishers.

To quote from the book: "The fun part of genealogy is the detective work. The un-fun part is the paperwork. (Diane Dieterle)" Who can argue with that!! This book will show you how to use a computer to manage your genealogy files, update your ancestor charts and family group sheets, keep up a record of correspondence and research and write form letters to record offices. Computer Genealogy also explains how to use your computer as a word processor to simplify the preparation of your material for publishing.

If you are considering putting a computer to work for you in your genealogy, this book can be a valuable reference for you. It is non-technical and easy to read.

Les Anciennes Familles du Québec. La Brasserie Labatt Limitée, 50 rue Labatt LaSalle, Quebec H8R 3E7. (Donated to PSGS by the publisher.)

This 70 page booklet, compiled by the Brasserie Labatt Limitée, contains brief biographical notes on the ancestry of 142 early Québec families. The booklet is entirely in French; however, with a French-English dictionary at your side, you should be able to decipher much of the information. If you have French-Canadian heritage, you will find this booklet interesting. It is shelved at CAN 19 in the PSGS Library and makes a nice addition to our growing collection of French-Canadian material.

Ancestry's Guide to Research. Case Studies in American Genealogy. By Johni Cerny & Arlene Eakle. 1985. \$10.95 (Donated to PSGS by Ancestry, P. O. Box 476, Salt Lake City, UT)

Ancestry's Guide to Research offers a step-by-step instruction guide and research plan for beginning and intermediate researchers. It shows you how to get started--"the basics"--how to examine family and home sources; how to determine what research may have already been done; and how to plan your research. The authors have organized the Guide to Research, using actual case studies, in such a way as to lead you methodically through all the steps of research. They follow this up with several excellent chapters on such problem areas as burned records, immigrant ancestors, tracing your female lines, and tracing ancestors with common surnames.

Ancestry's Guide to Research is an excellent companion to the authors' more advanced work "The Source: A Guidebook of American Genealogy", and the two together should stand you in good stead in all your genealogical research.

FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES NEWS (Nov.-Dec. 1984)

ENGLISH COUNTY SOCIETIES. There is now at least one society covering every English and Welsh county, according to George Pelling, chairman of the Federation of Family History Societies of England, speaking at the FGS conference last fall. Scotland is also broadly covered, he added.

MATTHEWS QUARTERLY. Persons interested in the genealogy of Matthews, Mathews, Mathis or Mathes families can obtain The Matthews Quarterly from P.O. Box 11315, Salt Lake City, UT 84147. Annual U.S. membership is \$12.

NEW COLUMN. The FGS Newsletter plans to run a column describing projects of member societies such as transcribing cemetery inscriptions, abstracting probate records, gathering family Bibles etc. A detailed summary of projects should be sent to the Federation at PO Box 220, Davenport, IA 52805. Attention of Molly Molyneux.

NARS RECORDS. In addition to Revolutionary War pension files contained at all branches of the National Archives, Confederate compiled military records will be available at Fort Worth and Atlanta, where other branches can borrow them on request. Immigration and naturalization records are available for borrowing at Bayonne, Chicago, and San Bruno, CA. Civil War pension files were to be available by May 1985. Naval widows' files are being microfilmed for the branches as well as an index to naturalizations. World War II draft registration cards, now in Atlanta, are being microfilmed and will be available in each branch. A gift from the Federation financed reproduction of Microfiche of Street Indexes for 39 cities in 1910; these are available at all branches.

RUSSIAN CONSULAR RECORDS. Approximately 250,000 case files from Czarist consular offices in port cities, dating from 1860-1924, will be filmed as soon as private funding is available. The project is being spearheaded by the Jewish Genealogical Society of Greater Washington.

POLISH SOCIETY. Researchers of Polish-American families in the Connecticut River Valley can contact Jonathan D. Shea, 8 Lyle Road, New Britain, CT 06053. Two newsletters will be published a year. Cost is \$7.50 per year.

JUDICIAL RECORDS. Supreme Court judicial records of the State of Massachusetts will be available at the state archives. These records contain cases appealed from the lower courts, and offer information about the Salem witch trials as well as more mundane cases, such as disagreements over the ownership of a cow. "A priceless source for the genealogist!"

FRENCH-CANADIAN? New England's newest research organization for the benefit of persons of French-Canadian extraction was recently organized. Annual dues of \$5 will bring the annual bulletin containing genealogical queries, use of the club's research library, and a "starter pack" for novices.
