CLUB NEWS

PSGS FALL SEMINAR

If you missed the Fall Seminar, held October 6th, you can obtain a copy of the syllabus distributed at that time. Prepared by the seminar speaker, it gives information on the following subjects: naturalization and passenger ship list records, Iowa and Kansas genealogies, and German genealogy. The syllabus contains facts useful in reading land descriptions, as well as useful information for those doing German genealogy, such as a German word list and form letters in the German language to be used when writing for information. A small contribution of \$2 is asked for the booklets. Call 876-1932 if you would like to order a copy.

OHIO ADOPTION LAWS

Effective March 19, 1985 birth records were opened for everyone adopted before 1964. Those born after 1964 can file a legal process, and if the natural parents have not indicated the information is not to be revealed, judges can release the information.

NEW KANSAS REGULATIONS

Access to vital records is now restricted to people needing to determine personal or property rights (and NOT genealogists), according to an article in the Okaloosa County (Florida) Genealogical Society bulletin. Charge for birth and death certificates in Kansas is now \$6.

NEW YORK RECORDS

If you are seeking information about cemetery records in New York State write Robert Wilson, 169 Melody Lane, Tonawanda, NY 14150 who has a growing list of cemetery records in the following counties: Allegheny, Broome, Cattaraugus, Cayuga, Chautauqua, Chemung, Chenango, Columbia, Erie, Herkimer, Livingston, Monroe, Montgomery, Nassau, Niagara, Oneida, Ontario, Orange, Oswego, Otsego, Rensselaer, Schuyler, Seneca, Steuben, Suffolk, Tompkins, Ulster, Westchester and Wyoming.

"A Guide to Records in the New York Archives" is obtainable from Office of Cultural Education, State Archives, Albany NY 12230.

CATHOLIC ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO RECORDS

Microfilm copies of 444 parishes in the Chicago Archdiocese, many of which predate the 1871 Chicago Fire, will soon be available, according to the Council of Northeastern Genealogical Societies. Since many Cook County records went up in the famous fire, this data is of vital importance. Copies of baptismal, confirmation and marriage lists will be available. If the name of the parish is unknown, certain finding aids have been created to help locate a given church which would have served a particular neighborhood or ethnic group. A warning: the information is often either in Latin or the language of particular ethnic groups.

EPISCOPAL CHURCH RECORDS IN WASHINGTON

The Episcopal Diocese, located in Seattle, has recently appointed an archivist who is in possession of church records going back to early days in Washington state. These records contain lists of persons confirmed in the diocese, as well as information about various parishes. Peggy Ann Hansen, Archivist, P.O. Box 12126, Seattle WA 98102 will answer any queries accompanied by a SASE. "There are no charges," she says, "but a modest contribution is appreciated."

ARKANSAS VITAL RECORDS

The Arkansas State Health Department has issued the following guidelines: Birth certificates are \$5 each and you must give full name, town, county, date of event, and both parents' names. Death certificates are \$4 each for the first copy, and \$1 for each additional. The address is Arkansas State Health Dept., Bureau of Vital Records, 4815 W. Markham, Little Rock AR 72205.

GERMAN GENEALOGICAL INDEX

Researchers interested in German genealogy are invited to submit data for publication in the Index. Published annually, it is cross-referenced to enable the genealogist to locate others interested in a particular German surname and/or localities in Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Hungary, Poland and Russia. 

The following information, supplied by Bev Morgen, was taken from "Victoria's Bride Ships" by William Silvester in the November 1985 issue of True West Magazine.

In 1858 gold was discovered in the central Fraser River and Cariboo Mountains area of British Columbia. Many of the arriving miners came north from San Francisco, California. From March to June of 1858 steamers brought 20,000 people from California.

Many of the miners found life without women to be very lonely. The Rev. R.C. LUNDIN BROWN, the Anglican rector of the town of Lillooet, informed the miners of the London Female Emigration Society which sent marriageable young ladies to various colonies of the British Empire. The miners asked him to write to the Society on their behalf.

Early in 1862 the British Columbia Emigration Society was formed to send marriageable women to the colony. Most of the ladies were young, often 12-18 years of age.

The first "bride ship" actually came from Australia. Since Australia was low on women it was thought that these ladies may have been "unwanted" in Australia! When the American ship "Seaman's Bride," under Capt. A.B. WYMAN, arrived in San Francisco harbor, the 23 women bound for British Columbia were allowed to go ashore. But they never returned to the ship; they were never seen or heard of again. California was in just as much need for good marriageable women as was British Columbia!

Twenty marriageable girls, all from orphanages, left London 17 April 1862. These were the first offerings of the British Columbia Emigration Society. Two months later the "Tynemouth", consigned to DICKSON, CAMPBELL & Co., left England. The ship was a 1,500 ton vessel carrying 200 tons of freight and 242 passengers, 62 of whom were unmarried women and girls. They were escorted by a clergyman and Mrs. JAMES ROBB, who traveled with her husband and three children.

The ship crossed the Atlantic to the Falkland Islands, around the Horn and on to San Francisco. On 12 Sept. 1862, it departed from San Francisco, having disembarked 39 male passengers. On 17 Sept. 1862 she dropped anchor at Esquimault Harbor near Fort Victoria.

H.M.S. "Forward," a gunboat commanded by Lieut. HORACE DOUGLAS LASCELLES, was ordered to transfer the women from the "Tynemouth" to Victoria. The ladies then walked down the gangway to the wharf and made their way to the Parliament buildings on the opposite shore of James Bay. Here they did their laundry under the watchful eyes of the clergyman and Mrs. Robb. The men of the area looked on.

Thirty of the women, who had arrived under contract as servants to families in the area, were separated from the others. The rest formed two lines and went to temporary quarters set up at the Marine Barracks in James Bay.

A third ship sent by the Society, the "Robert Lowe" (belonging to LINDSAY & Co. and commanded by Captain CONGALTON), carried 180 passengers and 36 young women. It arrived in Esquimault Harbor 12 January 1863. The steamer "Emily Harris" was supposed to transport the women to Victoria, but the captain, named PIKE, knowing they were not on board and wanting to make sport of the waiting male population, created the impression of docking at the wharf of JANSEN, GREEN & RHODES. As the men ran toward the ship, it headed back to BRODERICK'S wharf. "Having found the women were not on board, the attention of the men was diverted by a spontaneous dogfight," the old accounts say.

The women actually arrived at 3:30 on the H.M.S. "Grappler." Although considered a success, this was the last ship to arrive with women designated for the "female colonization" of Victoria.

Barnes's Complete Geography, published in 1885, has this description of Washington Territory.

Note that Walla Walla is the largest city.

R. Washington has some of the finest harbors and roadsteads in the world, and its forests are the best in the United States. Bituminous coal is mined at several points. Large crops of wheat, vegetables, and fruits are raised. Most of the eastern part is well adapted to grazing. The rapid streams afford much water-power. Salmon and other food fishes are abundant.

Puget Sound, with its bays and inlets, covers some 2,000 square miles, and furnishes the safest and best harbors on the Pacific coast. Lumber, wheat, coal, fish, and fruit are exported from its wharves.

Walla Walla, the largest town, is in the midst of a fine agricultural country.



In 1888, in Niles's Advanced Geography, Seattle has forged ahead of Walla Walla.

- 63. Puget (pū'jet) Sound affords excellent harbors.
