MORMON MATERIALS ACQUIRED BY NEW ENGLAND HISTORIC GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY -- The New England Historic Genealogical Society has obtained the colonial American portion of the Mormon Pioneer Genealogical Library, which covers those Mormon pioneers who were born in the United States or Canada. It has been recognized that although NEHGS and the Mormon Church have conducted their genealogical research independently, much Mormon research has dealt with New England families. Most of the largest pioneer families who founded Utah back in the 1840s have New England ancestral roots. Both organizations hope that in bringing this great body of material to Boston, duplications of effort may in the future be minimized to the advantage of everyone sharing these background ties.

MISSOURI STATE ARCHIVES ASKS FOR CORRECTION -- Billie H. Smith, Assistant State Archivist, Missouri State Archives, writes "The Missouri Archives DOES NOT have a 'NEWSPAPER SURNAME INDEX'. The Missouri Archives DOES NOT have a collection of newspapers. The State Historical Society of Missouri in Columbia does have a collection of Missouri newspapers but the entire collection is NOT INDEXED. Please contact the Society for further information. We regret any inconvenience the erroneous information may have caused you in your research."

QUESTION CONCERNING NATURALIZATION -- (The following is an answer to Mr. Ronald A. Bremer, Editor, Roots Digest, P.O. Box 16422, Salt Lake City, UT 84116-0422. Mr. Bremer wishes us (FGS) to share this with our readers:

"I refer to your letter of December 12, 1984, to the Consumer Affairs, Anti-trust Division of the Department of Justice, concerning the reproduction of naturalization records. Your

Letter was subsequently forwarded to the Service for a response. The Commission has requested that I respond to you.

"Title 8, United States Code, Section 1454(3) is just as it was enacted in 1952. Although clerks of court are prohibited by law from making and issuing certifications of a naturalization record or any part thereof, except upon order of the court, the prohibition against the issuance of certifications by clerks of court does not extend to the furnishing of uncertified information. Form M-154 was prepared to advise clerks and court employees of this fact.

There continues to exist a statutory bar against photocopying a Certificate of Naturalization or Citizenship under Title 18, U.S.C., Section 1426(h).

The Immigration and Naturalization Service is not in a position to direct the courts to release information. I suggest persons requiring such information from Service records use an Application for Verification of Information From Immigration and Naturalization Service Records, Form G-641.

#### GENEALOGICAL AND LOCAL HISTORY MATERIAL TO BE MADE AVAILABLE THROUGHOUT THE USA AND CANADA

The Alexander Mitchell Public Library, together with the American Family Records Association (AFRA), announces the establishment of a program whereby genealogical and local history material will be placed in the circulating collection of the library. The materials will consist of books, bound periodicals, videotapes, audio tapes, microfilm copies of out-of-print books, etc. Historically these materials have been in non-circulating reference collections; making these materials available to circulate through the established interlibrary loan system will allow people in all of North America to have access to the materials. The materials being placed in the collection will be the genealogical and local history periodicals obtained from the American Family Records Association through exchanges and donations. These materials will be cataloged on the Online Computer Library Center (OCLC) which will allow access to them through the more than 3,000 OCLC member libraries.\*

The collection will be known as the "AFRA Collection". A list of the materials may be obtained from the library or from AFRA. (Contact Kermit Karns, AFRA, 311 E. 12th St., Kansas City, MO 64106; phone 816-453-1294.) The lists will be updated as new materials are added. New additions to the listing will be published in the AFRA's quarterly journal. Please use a #10 SASE when requesting information.

## NEW PASSENGER LISTS AT NATIONAL ARCHIVES

Some 14,000 microfilm rolls of passenger arrival records, which the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) had in storage at the Washington National Records Center for a number of years, have now been turned over to and accessioned by the National Archives. As these records are processed, inspected for preservation purposes, and duplicated, they will be made available to the public.

These immigration passenger lists span the period 1891 to 1957 and are for ports of entry on the West, East, and Gulf coasts and the Mexican and Canadian borders. The original records were destroyed by the INS following microfilming.

Records for three new ports and additional records for the port of New York are now available to the public.

Galveston, Texas. The records are reproduced on *Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at Galveston, Texas, 1896-1948* (M1359, 36 rolls). Two indexes to these records are *Index to Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at Galveston, Texas, 1886-1906* (M1357, 3 rolls) and *Index to Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at Galveston, Texas, 1906-1952* (M1358, 7 rolls).

These microfilm publications are now available at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. and at the archives branch in Fort Worth. For a more detailed description of the Galveston records, see the "Federal Sources" article in this issue of the Newsletter.

San Francisco. The records are reproduced on *Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at San Francisco, 1893-1953* (M1410, 429 rolls). *Indexes to Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at San Francisco, California, 1893-1934* (M1389, 28 rolls) reproduces three alphabetical card indexes to the records. The first 21 rolls reproduce a general index to passengers. The second index on rolls 22-27 relates to individuals arriving from the Philippines, from Honolulu (1902-1907), and from Insular Possessions (1907-1911). Roll 28 contains an index to arrivals from the East Indies.

Copies of these microfilm publications are now available at the National Archives and at the archives branches in San Bruno and Laguna Niguel, California.

Seattle. The records are reproduced on *Passenger and Crew Lists of Vessels Arriving at Seattle, Washington, 1890-1957* (M1383, 357 rolls). The majority of these records are lists of alien passengers and crew members on vessels

arriving at Seattle, Port Townsend, and Tacoma. There are also some records of arrivals at smaller ports, including Anacortes, Blaine, Port Angeles, Aberdeen, Gray's Harbor, Everett, Friday Harbor, Bellingham, South Bend, Raymond, Port Wells, Port Bernard, and Princeton.

Beginning in July 1917, monthly lists of individuals applying for admission to the United States from Canada are interfiled chronologically with the vessel arrival records. The lists of admission document Canadian entries through Marcus, Oroville, and Sumas, Washington, and Gateway and Sweet Grass, Montana, all of which were included in the Seattle INS district.

Rolls 1-26 are almost entirely passenger lists; rolls 27-295 reproduce interfiled passenger and crew lists. For the period 1947-1954 the microfilm includes only crew lists. After 1 December 1954 the passenger and crew lists are again interfiled.

There is no name index to these records. Microfilm publication M1383 is available at the National Archives and at the Seattle archives branch.

New York. Five hundred rolls have been added to microfilm publication T715, immigration passenger lists for the port of New York, bringing these records up through 1948. A soundex index to passengers arriving at New York during the period 1944-1948 is in preparation.

The following records are scheduled for release in 1986:

Baltimore. One hundred and four additional rolls to microfilm publication T844, *Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at Baltimore, Maryland*, are scheduled to be available at the National Archives about the first of March. These rolls add passenger lists for the period 1909-1957.

St. Alban's, Vermont. The next new major port being processed is St. Alban's, Vermont. Arrival records for the St. Alban's INS district cover the period 1895-1954 and include soundex indexes, alphabetical indexes, and passenger manifests. The St. Alban's microfilm publications, totalling 1,138 rolls, are expected to be available later this year.
