The program is designed to offer document preservation experience to any one interested. Volunteers will be exposed to a variety of conservation methods currently in use at the National Archives, and will assist staff members in such projects.

Preservation projects for the summer of 1986 have included U.S. District Courts for Washington, Idaho, Oregon and Montana, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Alaska Railroad records, Bureau of Land Management, and Bureau of Customs-Puget Sound District.

INDIANA-IOWA CONFUSION. Researchers have found that while doing research in Indiana prior to 1880, the abbreviation IA does not mean Iowa, but does mean Indiana. (Seattle Gene. Society Bulletin)

WORLD WAR I SELECTIVE SERVICE RECORDS. Male residents of the U.S. born between 1873 and 1900 were required to register for the draft. Some 24 million registration cards have been microfilmed and are stored at the Federal Records Center, Archives Branch, 1557 St. Joseph Ave., East Point, GA 30044. A fee of \$5 is charged, and complete name and address must be submitted. (Clark Co. Gen. Soc. Bulletin)

CONNECTICUT VITAL RECORDS. The State Library at Hartford will furnish microfilm reels of the Barbour Collection of Connecticut vital records prior to 1850. They are alphabetically arranged by town. Contact the State Library at Hartford, CT 06115. Cost of the microfilms is \$11. The library also has the Hale Collection of newspaper, cemetery inscriptions and death notices.

MINNESOTA BIRTH CERTIFICATES. Effective 1 July 1986 an extra \$2 was attached to the \$5 fee for obtaining Minnesota birth certificates. The extra \$2 goes to the Childrens Trust Fund. (Minn. Gene. Soc. Newsletter)

NEW YORK STATE. There are now county historians of each of the counties of New York state.

INTERNATIONAL REPLY COUPONS. The cost of IRCs, issued by the U.S. Post Office, has been raised from 65 cents to 80 cents, effective January 1, 1986. (Minn. GS Newsletter)

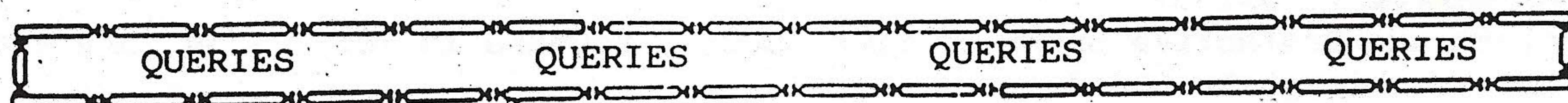
FAMILY HERITAGE BOOKS? Although Beatrice Bayley was found guilty of using the mails to send promotional material which makes false representations to the public, the conviction is now on appeal. However, the National Genealogical Society Newsletter warns that the same scheme is being tried under different names (Elizabeth Ross, for instance). The newsletter advises that anyone receiving such a solicitation through the mail for a family heritage book or similar product should send the materials to the NGS Newsletter Editor, 4527 17th St. North, Arlington VA 22207 so it can be brought to the attention of the U.S. Postal Service.

at \$12 for 6 bi-monthly issues and an end-of-year index to names and places.

Queries are free in both publications--whether or not you are a subscriber.

Each issue will contain genealogies, documents, abstracts and/or extracts of records, and queries on the RICE and MERCER surnames respectively. It is planned to also publish photos once or twice a year.

In general, surname periodicals can be excellent sources of material, depending upon the willingness of researchers to support the publication with contributions of material.

Rice Remembers and Mercer Memories are just beginning and will really need some support to succeed, but they are nicely done, attractively and clearly printed, and are worth your looking into if you are seeking information on RICE or MERCER.

NAVAL HOSPITAL RECORDS

Thanks to Bev Morgen, PSGS was able to obtain access to a book containing records of patients at the Naval Hospital in Bremerton during the period from about 1900 to the first World War. The records begin with this issue and will continue in subsequent issues. Ages listed are for the exact date each man was admitted to the hospital. If anyone is interested in obtaining birth dates, contact the club, as records on file show date of admittance, and approximate birth can be figured from this information. (Note: PSNS indicates Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton WA.)

INFORMATION THAT CAN BE GLEANED FROM OLD ABSTRACTS

Fredi Perry, PSGS member who makes a hobby of reading old newspapers, is also fascinated with old legal documents. Among these are documents called "abstracts" which carried the history of a particular piece of real estate. Not only is it the history of the piece of ground described, it often contains interesting and valuable family history too.

The names of children, details of wills, and often the sad fact that someone has been declared insane or incompetent--all these items can appear in an abstract.

Abstracts were replaced by the establishment of title companies who guarantee that the title to any particular piece of real estate is clear and it can be sold without fear of prior claims.

The title companies gathered up as many of the abstracts as possible in order to establish the history of pieces of real estate. There are, however, a few left in old trunks of families. When real estate was paid off, the abstract was given to the legal owner. Fredi says she would be delighted to obtain any old abstracts that anyone has in their possession. One interesting abstract Fredi has in her possession contains the provisions of William Bremer's will. Bremer was the moving spirit in the founding of the city of Bremerton, Washington. The last remaining son, Edward Bremer, died recently leaving the bulk of his estate to Olympic College in Bremerton.

William Bremer's will leaves his entire estate to his wife, Sophia Bremer, and to his sons and daughter he leaves \$1 each! People who know the history of the city of Bremerton will not be surprised to hear of this.
