NATIVE AMERICAN GENEALOGY. The National Archives has published a new catalog for those researching Native Americans. Write to Publication Branch, National Archives, Washington DC 20408. The cost is \$2.

The Five Civilized Tribes Museum has the only reference library in the world devoted to the following tribes: Creeks, Choctaws, Cherokees, Chickasaws, and Seminoles. Address of the museum is Agency Hill Drive, Muscogee OK 74401. According to the Fresno CA Gen. Soc. the collection is available for research and free consultations are offered.

The Hunter Memorial Library, Western Carolina University, Cullowhee NC 28723 has microfilmed copies of 10,000 Cherokee documents from the archives of Mexico, Spain, France and Canada, plus Scotland and England. Available on interlibrary loan.

MIDDLE NAMES. Middle names were first used as a status symbol by the German nobility in the 15th century. They were not commonly used in the U.S. until after the Revolution when it was fashionable to use the mother's maiden name.

HOMESTEAD PAPERS. Legal descriptions of homestead land may be obtained from the recorder of the county in which the land is located. There is usually a fee for this service. Send the legal description to the Bureau of Land Management for copies of the patent. Another small charge is involved here. When a copy of the patent is received, write to National Archives, Reference Branch, General Archives Division, Washington DC 20408 to obtain the homestead papers. Include name of person filing patent, legal description of the land, patent number, date of patent, and land office of issuance.

FRANCE. To locate someone who served in the French army, contact Archives d L'Armee, Servide Historique del Armes, Vieux Fort, Chateau de Vincennes, 24300 Vincennes, France. Most information is on officers and few documents before 1716 are available.

RUSSIA. A two-member volunteer team is now indexing and translating records in the National Archives of Russian, Polish and Jewish people who came to this country in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Records include photos, birth, marriage and death certificates, passports and letters. "Government funds are unavailable (for the project) because of the unusual legal status that the records are in," says the Fresno CA Gen. Soc. bulletin. Contact the Consul Records Project, Jewish Gen. Soc. of Greater Washington, PO Box 412, Vienna VA 22180.

SCOTLAND. Maps of crofting townships, farm districts and villages in Scotland as they existed in the 19th century are available from a cartographer in Scotland. Write P.J. Adams, 8 Rutherford Folds, Inverurie, Aberdeenshire, Scotland AB5 9JH. (Eastern WA Gen. Soc.)

ADOPTIONS. Information on adoptions varies from state to state, as follows:
Will release original birth certificates on demand of adoptees:
Alabama, Alaska, Kansas and Pennsylvania.

Permit access to court adoptions on demand: Idaho and South Dakota. Will provide contact with birth families through an intermediary: Connecticut, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, Tennessee and Wisconsin.

Will try to match birth families with adult adoptees who ask for contact: California, Colorado, Florida, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Michigan, Nevada, New York, Oregon and Texas.

LUTHERAN CHURCH RECORDS. Four Lutheran church bodies have microfilmed their church records and will rent them for \$4 a roll. They are the American Lutheran Church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church, United Evangelical Lutheran Congregations and the Lutheran Free Church. Write for catalog to Archives of the American Lutheran Church, Wartburg Theological Seminary, 333 Wartburg Pl., Dubuque IA 52001.

### FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES NEWSLETTER

CHILDREN IN GENEALOGY. A book, "Who Do You Think You Are?: Digging for Your Family Roots," by Suzanne Hilton (Westminster Press, Philadelphia 1976) is a good guide for children interested in genealogy. Also "The Brown Paper School Presents My Backyard History Book" by David L. Weitzman (Little, Brown, Boston 1975). Boy Scouts may earn a merit badge in genealogy.

PUBLISHED FAMILY HISTORIES. Genealogies in the Library of Congress, the microfilm catalog at LDS libraries, or the Dictionary Catalog of the Local History and Genealogy Division of the New York Public Library may be consulted to find out if your family has a history in book form.

BLIND AND DEAF GENEALOGISTS. There is a genealogical library to serve blind, deaf or persons with motor difficulties such as cerebral palsy and arthritis. Address is: Genealogy Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped, 4176 English Oak Drive, Doraville GA 30340. Telephone number is (404) 449-1533.

EUROPEAN CENSUSES. Microfilm copies of census schedules for many western European countries is available for use in LDS branch libraries and the Salt Lake City library. A book covering 30 countries on the European continent, "In Search of Your European Roots: A Complete Guide to Tracing Your Ancestors in Every Country in Europe," by Angus Baxter (Genealogical Publishing Co., 1001 N. Calvert, Baltimore MD 21202) is available. The book describes the availability of various kinds of genealogical records, whether you are searching by mail or in person.

SCHWEITZER ON SOUTH CAROLINA. Dr. George Schweitzer has recently published a book dealing with all kinds of records, county information, bibliographies, societies etc. of the State of South Carolina. His address is 7914 Gleason, C-1136, Knoxville TN 37919.

FRAGMENTS OF 1890 CENSUS. Although most of this census was destroyed by fire, there are fragments containing 6,160 names from the following states: Alabama, Georgia, Illinois, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, South Dakota, Texas and the District of Columbia.

COUNTY MAP CHECKLIST. The Library of Congress; can furnish a Checklist of 19th Century U.S. County Maps. These maps for the period 1850-1900 show landowner's names.

NORWEGIAN IMMIGRANTS. Write to St. Olaf Library, Northfield MN 55057 for information regarding the Rowberg File, a collection of obituaries from various Norwegian language papers from 1914 the 1960's.

GERMAN IMMIGRANTS. Two books are now available: "German Immigrants: Lists of Passengers Bound from Bremen to New York 1847-1854, with Places of Origin," by Gary J. Zimmerman and Marion Wolfert (Baltimore MD Genealogical Publishing Co., 1985). The second is "The Salzburger Saga: Religious Exiles and Other Germans Along the Savannah," by George Fenwick Jones (Athens, University of Georgia Press, 1984). This book tells of the expulsion of 20,000 Protestants from Salzburg and the Ebenezer settlement, their subsequent home in Georgia.

The annual May/June issue of the Genealogical Helper includes a directory in two parts: (a) List of family associations, including names and addresses of one or two officers, data on reunions; and (b) a list of family periodicals, giving addresses of editors, subscription rates, and frequency of publication.
