1989 WASHINGTON STATE CENTENNIAL. The Kitsap County chairman of the upcoming Washington State Centennial, Bill Huntington, has asked the club to share its cemetery, marriage and death records with the state committee. Marlys Marrs and Rose Mary O'Brien are working with the commission to provide the information needed. The data will be placed in a computer bank which will be available for researchers in the years to come.

FEDERATION CONVENTION IN 1989. The Seattle Genealogical Society will host the 1989 FGS convention. Dates are August 16, 17, 18, 19 and the location is the Sea-Tac Red Lion. Transportation to research facilities can be arranged on a rotating basis by chartered shuttle, according to preliminary plans. Harbor tours and a dinner at Tillicum Village are being planned.

SGS LIBRARY HOURS. The Seattle Gen. Soc. library is open on Tuesdays now from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. The library is located in the Jones Bldg. at 3rd and Union in downtown Seattle. Those coming into the building in the evening should enter by 7 p.m. or call the library office for entrance as the doors are locked after 7. The library is open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday.

CORRECTION!!! Contrary to a report in the August issue of this publication, New York State does not have a publication listing New York State land records on microfilm. In fact, very few of the land records have been microfilmed and none are currently available on interlibrary loan. (We thought that was too good to be true, given the difficulties usually experienced in New York State.) (Eastern Wash. Gen. Soc.)

ARCHIVES MICROFILM RENTAL PROGRAM. Individuals can now rent microfilms from the National Archives. Costs are \$3 per roll for orders of four rolls; \$2.50 for five to nine rolls and \$2 per roll for 10 or more rolls. This new direct-order program does not replace the present service which operates through libraries. Write for brochure to National Archives Microfilm Rental Program, PO Box 2940, Hyattsville MD 20784.

IOWA NEWSPAPERS. Microfilming of bound volumes of Iowa newspapers in the state historical society's Des Moines library is now in process. For this reason the library was closed August 1. Microfilming is expected to take about one year.

MYRA GORMLEY IN P-I. The Seattle P-I has recently joined the Tacoma NT in carrying Myra Vanderpool Gormley's weekly column on genealogy. The column appears on Thursday of each week.

COST INCREASE IN WASHINGTON. Copies of birth, death, marriage and dissolution records in the state of Washington now are \$11 each. The 1987 Legislature ordered the Vital Records Unit of the Department of Social and Health Services to make this change.

OHIO RECORDS CLOSED. The Ohio State Archivist has served notice that microfilmed case files of Franklin Co. OH Probate Court have been closed to researchers until further notice. The action was taken because the records contain lunacy and adoption information which is closed by law. The South Charleston WV gen. soc. bulletin says if other Ohio centers contain similar lunacy and adoption information, they too will be closed "until access is cleared."

NATIONAL ARCHIVES. The following new sources of information are now available at the NA:

M1274. Case Files of Disapproved Pension Applications of Widows and Other Dependents of Civil War and Later Navy Veterans, 1861-1910. (Approximately 7000 applications are in this file.)

M1391. Lists of Navy Veterans for Whom There Are Navy Widows and Other Dependents' Disapproved Pension Files. This file contains an alphabetical list of "aliases" (other first, middle or last names and variations of spelling) of those widows listed in M1274.

TIME LINE AND ANCESTOR CHART. Have you considered this? List on the left side of the paper the years (say 1810, 1811) and beside the year write the main historical events of that year. On the right, list the names of your relatives who were born, married or died in that year. (South Charleston WV Gen. Soc.

International Reply Coupons are substituted for SASEs when writing overseas. These can be purchased at the post office.

WAGONMASTER IN YOUR FAMILY? The Society of California Pioneers, 456 McAllister St., San Francisco CA 94102, or, the State Historical Society of Missouri, 1020 Lowry St., Columbia MO 65201, or, National Museum of Transport, 3015 Barrett Station Rd., St. Louis MO 63122: all these organizations have information on wagon train histories. The California group has some biographical material in their Overland Records collection. (Myra Gormley in Seattle P-I)

PENITENTIARY RECORDS. Most modern prison records (the last 72 years) fall under the privacy act and cannot be released. Family members can sometimes get the records of deceased convicts. Write to the penitentiary pertaining. Criminal court records are available, especially federal records. Check local newspapers. Jail books contain names, dates, addresses etc. Myra Gormley warns these records are usually kept by date rather than prisoner's name. (Seattle P-I)

CEMETERY VANDALISM. Toppled markers, empty beer cans, deeply rutted tire marks!
Sound familiar? The Sioux Valley SD Pioneer Pathfinder of July 87 notes that
disrespect for the past lies beneath cemetery vandalism. The growing problem seems
to be nationwide. We are such a mobile society, a disposable society, says a
member of the county Abandoned Cemetery Committee. He adds that today's
generation looks at cemeteries as little more than garbage dumps.

CORONER'S INQEST RECORDS. This source is seldom used by genealogists. It contains information if a person died of any violent, unknown or unnatural cause. Data will include some of the following information: A "Statistical History of the Deceased" including full name, age, marital status, birthplace, how long in U.S., how long in locality, name and birthplace of father, maiden name and birthplace of mother, date of death, physical condition including height and weight, religion, education, occupation, life insurance, value of personal and real estate, military service, number and ages of dependents etc. (Sioux Valley SD bulletin, July 1987)

LITHUANIAN? The Bolzekas Museum of Lithuanian Culture is searching for names of Lithuanians who arrived in the U.S. before World War I. The address is BMLC, Genealogy Dept. 6500 S. Pulaski Rd., Chicago IL 60629.

OLAND, SWEDEN. Researchers with ancestors from Oland should write to Stefan Gottfridsson, Stallvagen 17: 111, S-352 52, Vaxjo, Sweden. His specialty is Olanders and people from Torslunda parish and he will help with research. (Don't forget International Reply Coupon!)

BORNHOLMERS. Some 8000 people emigrated from this small Danish island from 1850 to 1925. Lill-May Didriksen, Ostergarde 20, 3700 Ronne, Bornholm, DK-Denmark would like to hear from their descendants for exchange of information. (International Reply Coupon needed.)

FAMINE YEARS. Interested in the Irish who sailed from Liverpool during the famine years? Write Merseyside Maritime Museum, Pier Head, Liverpool, England L31DW for information. (Remember International Reply Coupon when writing.)

MASSACHUSETTS, 1855, 1865. These are the only two census years which contain genealogical data in the Massachusetts state census. Seventeen towns in Plymouth, Middlesex, Essex Counties have been transcribed to date. Write Ann Lainhart, 13 Sachem St., Boston MA 02120.

RESEARCHING NUNS. If you look for a Catholic nun in the Soundex, use the word "Sister" as if it were her surname. Use S236 and then her religious name. (Maryland Gen. Soc. bulletin.)

SURNAMES. (From the Vancouver WA bulletin, Vol XIV, #1) Information on Surnames is contained in two books published recently: "The Mountain of Names" by Alex Shoumatoff and "What's in a Surname?" by Rifka Rosenwein.

The first Europeans to use family names were Crusaders. They were adopted for convenience and prestige, usually taken from the lands they owned. Clerks keeping records on manors often added descriptive terms to Christian names, such as an occupation or physical characteristic. These names were not usually passed on from one generation to another.

Shoumatoff makes the startling statement that for a surname to be transmitted exclusively through males to have a run of more than a hundred years is notable! He says demographers have calculated that in the US in 1960 there was only a 20% chance that a man would have descendants with his name 13 generations later. He added that as many as 40% of the families existing in 1700 have been exterminated by war, famine etc. or have died out from failure to reproduce. He further astounds the reader by saying that we may be slowly progressing to a day when everybody will have the same surname!

New ones are being created however, the article adds. Black Americans are adopting Muslim surnames. "Other social movements, such as the hippie culture and the most recent phase of feminism, led to the creation of such new surnames as Chicago, Freedom, Love, Peace and Sunshine."

Rosenwein states many states allow parents to give a child any surname they choose. Some women are refusing to carry their husband's surname. Another bizarre trend is to fuse two surnames into a new one: Ledbetter and Skylar into Skybetter, or Greenberg and McBride into Greenbride. The genealogical problems are too horrible to contemplate!

Written requests, accompanied by an SASE and proper search fee, can be sent to the holder of the newspaper or closest public library, historical society library or university library. Microfilms can be obtained on interlibrary loan.

NEW INDEX PREPARED. More than 25,000 surnames and 800,000 individual names have been included in a collection recently finished by the South Brevard Gen. Soc. of Melbourne, Florida. The names were obtained from a genealogical Questions and Answer column published in the Hartford, Conn. Times from 1940 to 1956. The collection, called the Marion Donoghue Combination, consists of 111 microfiches of the index and newspaper pages containing the column. The project took the club four years to complete.

The index provides full names of people nationwide, event years, and references for determining specific newspaper pages on the microfiche. For information write Genealogical Society of South Brevard, PO Box 786, Melbourne FL 32902. The cost for this collection, which includes the index and the microfiche, is \$95 per set. This is an introductory price.

GERMAN RESEARCH

GERMAN LOCATIONS. If you are trying to locate a town in Germany mentioned in your research, contact John Bentz, 13139 Old West Ave., San Diego CA 92129. For a large SASE and a \$1.35 check, he will send you a map showing the village (or your money back). Send all the information you have, including a photo copy of the name if taken from a document.

GERMAN GENEALOGICAL INDEX. A cross reference index to help researchers find others who are researching the same surnames and localities is being prepared. Persons interested are invited to submit information to the German Genealogical Index, Dept. LMHS, PO Box 10155, Minneapolis MN 35440. The index will also cover the countries of Austria, Switzerland, Luxembourg, Poland, Hungary and Czechoslovakia. (Olympia Gen. Soc. July 1987)

KANSAS GERMAN ALIEN RECORDS. The Kansas City KS archives has registration of German aliens who lived in the state of Kansas during World War I. These records are reported to contain much valuable genealogical data.

FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES NEWSLETTER

NEW ARCHIVIST. Donald W. Wilson, director of the Gerald R. Ford Presidential library, has been named Archivist of the United States. The nomination was greeted with approval by genealogists and historians all-over the country. Dr. Wilson has been on the faculty of the University of Michigan's history department, was associate director of the Wisconsin State Historical Society, deputy director of the Eisenhower Library in Abilene KS, and archivist of the Kansas City Historical Society.

Dr. Wilson has said that a nationwide collection policy is one of his greatest concerns. He feels there is a need for investigation of the national collecting policy and hopes to make that one of his overall themes.

NAME CHANGE. The genealogical department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints will henceforth be known as the Family History Department, according to a recent announcement.

MONTANA NEWSPAPERS. The Montana Historical Society has just completed a union listing of more than 1,121 Montana newspapers held in various repositories. Montana concluded both cataloging and microfilming, largely because the state's publishing history is relatively brief, dating from 27 Aug 1864.

NEW ENGLAND GENEALOGIES. A circulating collection of 1,600 volumes on New England genealogy and local history, including rare books to which researchers often find it difficult to access, has been compiled in a catalog by the Connecticut Historical Society. The cost is \$5 plus \$1.50 for postage and handling. Members of the society may borrow the books by mail. A per volume charge of \$3 is asked. Memberships in the CT historical society are \$18 for out-of-state residents or \$15 for senior citizens, per year. Write the CT Historical Society, 1 Elizabeth St., Hartford CT 06105.

NEBRASKA RECORDS. Searches and copies of records from the Nebraska Department of Health are now \$6.

Columbiana County OH has laid off the lone employee who was in OHIO RECORDS CLOSED. charge of the microfilm department where there are records from at least four county offices: Probate Court, Common Pleas, Recorder and Auditor. All of the county's early records from 1803 are on microfilm only. This action effectively closes off these records to the public. A suit is contemplated against the county commissioners by a professional genealogist because it impairs her ability to make a living in the field. In addition, Ohio law requires that records be made available to the public at reasonable hours.
