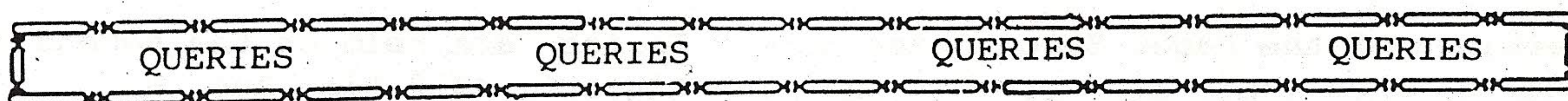

GALVANIZED YANKEES! This term was applied to former Confederate soldiers who served in six regiments of the U.S. Volunteer Infantry which was used in the West to protect settlers from Indians, restore stage and mail service, guard Union Pacific railroad survey parties, and rebuild telegraph lines. They were Confederate prisoners-of-war who gained their release from prison by enlisting in the Union Army. Eventually there was a total of 11 regiments raised this way. They were mustered out in November 1866. (Orlando FL "Buried Treasures" quoting Cloud Family Journal.)

CIVIL WAR PHOTOGRAPHS. The U.S. Army Military History Institute of Carlisle Barracks, PA, has a collection of identified soldiers' portraits from the 1861-1865 period that is reported unmatched anywhere. Persons seeking to locate a photo of a Civil War soldier should write Curator at the institute. The zip code is 17013. A check will be made of their card files for names and/or regiments, and photo copies will be sent for a fee. (Tacoma-Pierce "Researcher")

DID YOU KNOW THAT--In genealogy, the term "lineal" means ascending or descending in a direct line; "collateral" means descended from the same ancestor but not in a direct line of descent; "allied families" are families related usually through marriage. (Clark Co. WA)

OLD PHOTOGRAPHS. The following is a list of tips from the Paradise CA club newsletter regarding priceless old photographs:

DON'T use Scotch tape or rubber cement.

DON'T store them in wooden cabinets.

DON'T put newspaper clippings and photographs together in the same cabinet (newsprint is very acidic).

DON'T use any paper or cardboard that contains sulfur.

DON'T use paper clips or rubber bands to hold photographs together.

Protect photographs when handling by wearing white gloves (!); use only pencils for note-taking; touch only the edges of prints and negatives; do not smoke, drink or eat in the room while handling prints.

1790-1980

(Includes supplemental schedules open to the public; excludes questions asked on a sample basis only).

1790

Name of family head; free white males of 16 years and up, free white males under 16; free white females; slaves; other persons.

1800

Name of family head; if white, age and sex; race; slaves.

1810

Name of family head; if white, age and sex; race; slaves.

1820

Name of family head; age; sex; race; foreigners not naturalized; slaves; industry (agriculture, commerce, and manufactures).

1830

Name of family head; age; sex; race; slaves; deaf and dumb; blind; foreigners not naturalized.

1840

Name of family head; age; sex; race; slaves; number of deaf and dumb; number of blind; number of insane and idiotic and whether in public or private charge; number of persons in each family employed in each of six classes of industry and one of occupation; literacy; pensioners for Revolutionary or military service.

Name; age; race; occupation; value of real estate; value of personal estate; birthplace; whether parents were foreign born; month of birth if born within the year; month of marriage if married within the year; school attendance; literacy; whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, or idiotic; male citizens 21 and over, and number of such persons denied the right to vote for other than rebellion.

Supplemental schedules for persons who died during the year; paupers; prisoners.

1880

1910

Address; name; relationship to family head; sex; race; age; marital status; number of years of present marriage; for women, number of children born and number now living; birthplace and mother tongue of person and parents; if foreign born, year of immigration, whether naturalized, and whether able to speak English, or if not, language spoken; occupation, industry, and class of worker; if an employee, whether out of work during year; literacy; school attendance; home owned or rented; if owned, whether mortgaged; whether farm or house; whether a survivor of Union or Confederate Army or Navy; whether blind or deaf and dumb.

FGS DONATION TO NATIONAL ARCHIVES. A check for \$14,000 was sent in February to the Archivist of the United States to cover the cost of duplicating:

M1462 - Alphabetical Index to Canadian Border Entries through Small Ports in Vermont, 1895-1924

M1463 - Soundex Index to Entries into the St. Albans VT District through Canadian Pacific and Atlantic Ports 1924-1952

M1465 - Manifests of Passengers Arriving in the St. Albans VT District through Canadian Pacific Ports 1929-1949.

These records will be available soon in the Seattle Archives branch.

HUNTINGTON, NEW YORK. Persons interested in Suffolk County NY information can obtain books from the Huntington Historical Society on subjects such as Huntington Chattel Mortgages 1784-1908 (\$6); Huntington Tavern Licenses 1783-1898 (\$3); Huntington Highway Book B 1851-1867 (a series of 89 highway maps showing locations of houses and names of residents) (\$15); Huntington Historic Cemeteries (\$1); and Huntington Historic Markers (75 cents). NEW YORK STATE ARCHIVES. The state archives recently received a \$200,000 federal grant to microfilm more than 600 cubic feet of settlement and development records covering New York state from 1760 to 1860. The records include survey maps of the Erie Canal and other canals, petitions and appeals to the State canal board from thousands of individuals and firms along the canal routes.

Early court records to be filmed will include records from the Supreme Court, Court of Chancery and Court of Errors. Also records of land sales and settlement from the early colonial period to the middle of the 19th century. Included are field books, maps and deeds that document State sale of lands, activities of land speculators and the westward migration.

CARL WEATHERBEE. Individual research charts are very important. Keep an Individual Search Chart for each individual on the pedigree chart. The charts list all records searched, even those from whom no information was obtained. These charts are an index which allow one to quickly determine what has been done and eliminate duplication of work.

Care should be taken in using ages recorded in censuses for calculating the year of birth. The person giving the information may have been in error. Even mothers may give erroneous ages.

In the 1841 census of England, Scotland and Wales, the ages were listed in the lower age of each five year grouping, starting at age 15. A person age 18 was listed as 15, one at age 24 was listed as 20, age 29 as 25, 31 as 30 etc.

DEAD-ENDED IN VIRGINIA? A new book has been published by the Genealogical Publishing Co. "Genealogical Abstracts from 18th Century Virginia Newspapers" containing approximately 10,000 items of a genealogical nature found in old newspapers. Marriage notices, death notices, estates sales and settlements and advertisements for runaways (valuable if your ancestor was a bond servant) and court cases are included. It is arranged alphabetically by surnames with an index to the 10,000 people mentioned in the notices. The compiler is Robert K. Headley Jr. The cost is \$30.50 making it a club more than an individual purchase.

LANCASTER COUNTY, PA. Check "Runaways, Rascals and Rogues" a new genealogical book compiled by Gary T. Hawbaker if you are having trouble in this county. The book covers the years 1794 to 1810 and includes the names of more than 1,200 husbands, wives, children, servants, slaves, prisoners, deserters "and horse thieves". The cost is \$11.50 postpaid. Address Hawbaker at PO Box 207, Hershey PA 17033.

ON FAMILY HISTORY BOOKS. "One sad fact about genealogy is that many of us do not know what others have done," writes Mrs. Gormley. To avoid this fact of life, consult family history books in the following ways: Check the "Family Histories" microfiche at an LDS library to see what books are available on microfilm. Once you determine there is a family history, obtain catalogs to see if it is available on print or microfilm.

University Microfilms International, 300 N. Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor MI 48106 has a catalog entitled "Family Histories on Microfiche" for \$8.

The local library should have a copy of "Genealogical and Local History Books in Print, Vol 2" by Netti Schreiner-Yantis. Check its section on family genealogies for books and monographs available at bargain prices.

Other publishers of genealogies are Goodspeed's Book Shop, 7 Beacon St., Boston MA 02108 (\$5 for catalog); Higginson Books, 14 Derby Square, Salem MA 01970; Southern Historical Press, PO Box 738, Easley SC 29641-0738; and The Reprint Co., PO Box 5401, Spartanburg SC 29304.

ALTERNATIVE RECORDS IN CASE OF NATURAL DISASTER. Fires, floods and tornadoes have done much damage to genealogical records, but all is not lost, says Mrs. Gormley. Usually after a disaster, county officials attempted to reconstruct records. County residents were urged to submit documents of previous transactions and events.

In most states, title and abstract companies have records, which are usually in condensed form, but can fill a gap.

Private papers of attorneys who practiced law at the time can be used.

Search courthouses in adjoining counties as many people have lived in neighboring counties.

Check federal court records at Federal Archives.

Law libraries contain the "Decennial Digest" volumes 21 to 25, covering the years 1658 to 1906 which contain appellate court cases.

Don't forget the "parent county" which will have records made before the county you are researching was formed.

Sometimes state libraries and archives contain miscellaneous county records. Never accept as the final word: "All records were destroyed."

1787 CENSUS OF VIRGINIA. The 1790 census of Virginia was destroyed when the British burned Washington DC during the War of 1812. The federal government in 1907 tried to remedy the situation by collecting state population counts taken between 1782 and 1785, but only half of Virginia's counties were included. In 1940 two genealogists published a sequel made up of tax lists of the missing counties.



Almost all of the 1787 tax records survive, but have never been published until two women, Netti Schreiner-Yentis and Florene Speakman, recently entered the data in a computer bank. The information is by the date it was collected, so people who were neighbors are listed together. "This is important because your great-great-grandfather probably married a girl from a nearby farm," Mrs. Gormley says.

Another column lists names of white males over 21, and other males in each household including apprentices, grandsons, hired workers etc. These tax lists sometimes identify two persons with the same name, giving a person's trade or the locality in which he lived.

If an ancestor was not liable for the poll tax (he may have been old and infirm) or was clergyman, certain professional or holder of a political job--these persons were exempt. White males from 16 to 21 were not subject to the poll tax but had to pay a county parish tithe. Indians were exempt. All these different people were noted in the 1787 tax records as exemptions. The source is an invaluable aid if your roots go back to Virginia, West Virginia or Kentucky, Mrs. Gormley notes. 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PASSENGER LIST INDEXES. Restrictions have been lifted on access to name indexes to passenger arrivals and passenger and crew lists in the custody of the National Archives. This opens 6055 rolls of microfilm covering the years 1883 to 1954. For a copy of the catalog write Publications Sales Branch, National Archives and Records Service, Washington DC 20408. (Tacoma-Pierce "Researcher")

ANOTHER TIP. If a person listed on the 1850 census indicated he/she owned real estate, look for the land records.

NEW ADDRESS. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is now located in the Landon State Office Building, 900 S. Jackson, Topeka KS 66612.

OKLAHOMA RECORDS. Federal tract books for Oklahoma Territory are now in the possession of the Southwest Oklahoma Genealogical Society. These books (72 volumes on 22 rolls of microfilm) list, by land description, land entries made by those applying for homesteads or Indian allotments (does not include Five Civilized Tribes or Osage, nor does it include land entries in Indian territory). A surname index has been compiled. The society will search for one full name and send a photocopy of the page in which the entry appears for \$5 plus SASE. Write them at PO Box 148, Lawton OK 73502. (Nat. Gen. Soc. newsletter)

ANYBODY IN THE YUKON? For those who reached the gold fields of the Yukon, the Dawson City Museum and Historical Society has a variety of records. These include personal files, diaries, journals, birth and death records, post office records, mining recorders' records etc. When writing give as much information as possible, and ask for specific data. There is no set fee, but a donation is requested. Write Dawson City Museum and Historical Society, Box 303, Dawson City, Yukon, Canada Y0B 1G0. (Nat. Gen. Soc. newsletter)

TROUBLE IN OKLAHOMA? A recent item in the Seattle PI's Action Column states: "Happy we could shake loose your birth certificate from vital records in Oklahoma, which had been ignoring your requests since May of last year." But listen to this, "We called in the GOVERNOR"!
