FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES

GLASNOST IN GENEALOGY. A recent meeting between officers of the Federation and a representative from the Soviet Union, Ludmilla Selivanova, may pave the way for Americans to explore their genealogical roots in Russia. Ms Selivanova is head of the Department of Foreign Relations of the Main Archival Administration in Moscow. She told the group that the Soviet archival system is composed of some 3,500 distinct archives administered from Moscow, divided into republics, provinces and localities, plus 11 central state archives devoted to different subjects. These archives are not yet equipped to handle genealogical queries, although they have received some and requested this meeting with the Americans to pave the way for future exchanges.

NAME CHANGE. The archives at Sand Point will henceforth be known as National Archives-Pacific Northwest Region (formerly known as National Archives-Seattle Branch).

SAVED FROM THE FIRE! Milwaukee WI court officials were stopped by genealogists and the Milwaukee Historical Society from burning a ton of record books containing jury lists, tax documents and other court records. Wisconsin state law grants Milwaukee county, because of its size, an exemption from requirements governing the retention of records. Members of a local genealogical society were able to carry away records on a Saturday before further disposal. As it is, some records will be missing as they were all ready burned. An official of the court has announced a procedure will be worked out to notify interested persons whenever records are going to be destroyed.

RAILROAD RECORDS. During the early part of the century some 2-1/4 million people worked for the railroads. In the 1930's the Railroad Retirement Board was created. Write to them at 884 Rush St., Chicago IL 60611. Some of the information they have on file includes: applications for employment, applications for employment annuity, employee registration, certifications for termination of service. These records will include full name and date of birth, place of birth, parents' names, mother's maiden name, social security number, occupational title etc. It is helpful if you know the social security number and/or railroad retirement number.

PENNSYLVANIA. Each county or township in Pennsylvania is supposed to have a local historian. Write to County Historian, C/o Courthouse (of appropriate county), County Seat. Include SASE. The same applies to New York State.

CHARGES FOR VITAL RECORDS INFORMATION IN VARIOUS STATES

Bice Family History, 1800-1987, by Marlys Marrs (Review by Madelyn Cataldo)

This book is a 361-page labor of love, starting with George Washington Bice, born in 1820 in the State of Pennsylvania. He married Leah Isabella Cornman in 1842 and from this marriage evolves the Bice Family Tree, including all known members in 1987 from the East Coast to the West Coast.

Along with pertinent genealogical information, many family pictures are included, as well as newspaper items and obituaries. Each chapter is devoted to one of the nine children reared by George and Leah Bice.

Included are some delightful memories written by grandchildren of their grandparents. Several letters are in the book. One chapter is devoted to Bice family members that served as law officers. Another chapter gives credit to all the Bices who have served in the armed forces.

The book is clearly indexed with each person assigned a number showing his or her place in the family tree. The outside cover of the book shows the old family The book is a three-ring binder which allows insertion of added homestead. information.
