ORPHAN COURTS. See if the state you are researching maintains "Orphan Courts," says the Sutter-Yuba Gen Soc bulletin. These court dockets contain much valuable information:

Appointments of guardians for orphans, incompetents and sometimes indigents Adminstrators for estates and frequently trustees

Many property transfers

Inventories of estates

Marriages, births, deaths

"You might even uncover an elusive maiden name, for when a widow asks that an individual be appointed guardian of her son, it is possible that the person she suggests may be her relative."

The legal definition of an orphan is one who has lost his natural father. This term applies to anyone at any age and is not tied to the mother.

MARRIAGE LICENSE RECORDS. These records are more likely to be correct than either birth or death records, according to Myra V. Gormley, writing in the Seattle P-I. Birth certificate information is often given by the doctor or some other person unfamiliar with the true details. Family members are often mistaken about details appearing on death certificates. BUT, on marriage records the information was probably provided by the individual and is most likely correct.

NORWEGIAN ANCESTORS. Write the Norwegian Emigration Center, Domkirkeplassen 3, N--4000 Stavanger, Norway. They have church records, emigrant registers, and a census for all of Norway, according to the Stillagaumish gen soc newsletter.

DAR INDEX. The DAR recently published an index to volumes I and II of the Patriots register listing spouses. Only wives whose surnames have been proven beyond a reasonable doubt are in this index. Check LDS Family History Center.

ANOTHER DOOR CLOSES. A request for Michigan newspapers on interlibrary loan brings this answer: "The Library of Michigan has moved to its new building... we anticipate increased in-state activity of our many collections.... Therefore, a policy change has taken place.... "Specific dates must be provided, plus page numbers of the particular newspaper. In other words, no more browzing in old Michigan newspapers, looking for the names you are interested in.

IRISH RESEARCH. Two new books have recently been published on Irish research. They are "Irish Records; Sources for Family and Local History" by James G. Ryan and "A Guide to Tracing Your Dublin Ancestors" by the same author. Irish research is particularly frustrating as births and marriages were not generally recorded by the state until 1864, in most cases Catholic church records did not begin until 1800, and a fire in 1922 in the Dublin House of Records destroyed a large number of records.

Until Dr. Ryan's "Irish Records," there has been no full scale compilation of county and parish records. Most of the Irish who emigrated in the late 18th and early to mid 19th centuries were small tenant farmers and laborers who left few records.

A reviewer in the Tacoma-Pierce Co. Researcher says, "One of the most impressive segments of this guide is the long listing in each county's chapter of the names and addresses of current clergymen in charge of parish records. This reference is priceless. Also of particular interest are distinctly-drawn county maps that preface each chapter and pinpoint localities of towns and parishes."

The book has a comprehensive index, chapters of counties give a brief history of the county plus a chronology of events pertinent to genealogical study. There is a thorough check of available directories, censuses, newspapers, gravestone inscriptions and much more. Records held in the Family History Library in Salt Lake City are noted with film number cited.

"Irish Records" can be ordered from Ancestry Inc., Dept. RV, PO Box 476, Salt Lake City UT 84110. The price is \$34.95 + \$4.00 handling. The Dublin book can be obtained from Flyleaf Press, 4 Spencer Villas, Glenageary County, Dublin, Ireland. Cost is \$14.20 (US) by airmail or \$11.55 surface mail.

UNUSUAL MARRIAGE RECORDS. California statutes of 1877-78 first authorized that unmarried persons living together could be officially married by a clergyman without a marriage license. The record was then filed in church records. The intent of the law was to protect inheritance rights of children of such unions.

Today, with live-ins being so common, this discreet method of marrying has become a way to save money. No waiting and no blood test required. A public notary may officiate by filling out a blank marriage license.

Records of these marriages are deposited with county governments, which keep them under seal. Last year one-third of all California marriages were of this kind! (Sutter-Yuba CA)

ORPHAN'S COURTS. Many states have a set of records called Orphan's Courts that may be a source of information. A variety of records can be found here. The legal definition of an "orphan" is anyone who has lost his natural father, irregardless of age.

Orphan Court records, called dockets, were used to appoint or change the appointment of guardians for orphans, incompetents and sometimes indigents. They also record administrators for estates and frequently trustees, property transfers, inventories of estates, and sometimes marriages, births and deaths.

"You might even uncover an elusive maiden name, for when a widow asks that an individual be appointed guardian of her son, it is possible that the person she suggests may be her relative," says Contra Costa CA gen soc.

BIRTHS AND DEATHS ON HIGH SEAS. When a birth or death occurs on the high seas, whether in a ship or an aircraft, the determination of where the record is filed is made in terms of the direction the craft was headed at the time of the event. If the craft was outbound or docked at a foreign port, request information from U.S. Department of State, Washington DC 20520. If the craft was inbound and port of entry was in the U.S., write to city where craft landed. If craft was of U.S. registry, contact U.S. Coast Guard at port of entry. (Sutter-Yuba CA gen. soc.)

LDS MICROFICHE. The library in Salt Lake City is making its millions of family records even more available to the general public. The newest edition of the IGI contains records of more than 121 million deceased persons. As of Oct. 1988 if you have a microfiche reader, or access to one, you can purchase the microfiche at 15 cents per sheet. Each sheet contains approximately 27,600 names.

If you are working on several family lines in one state, you can purchase all the microfiche for that state. Or you can ask for sheets containing one particular surname.

POSTAL SERVICE TIP ON SASE'S. The Postal Service advises using a small #9 envelope for SASE's. They do not have to be folded when placed in the #10 envelopes. The folded #10 "might get caught in the sorting machine causing great damage," the warning suggests. (Stillagaumish Valley Gen Soc.)

GENEALOGY POPULAR? There are nearly 2,000 genealogical societies with a collective membership of 700,000 people, according to recent statistics. In addition, there are more than 5 million members of local historical societies and nearly 33.5 million members of lineage societies.

PROBLEMS WITH RESEARCHING WOMEN. (The following is a reprise from an article in the Kalispell MT gen soc publication, plus other sources.)

The Second Boat runs a special section called "Mary Who?" which reflects the problems encountered by genealogists regarding researching females.

Unless a woman were left a widow and property was left to her specifically, names of women are remarkably absent from old records. Sometimes a marriage record will record the bride as "Widow Smith!" (On page 12 of this issue of Family Backtracking a bride is listed as "Mrs. H.N. Hubbard." Fortunately the record gives the names of her parents. But what was her first name? And this was in 1906!)

Sometimes a woman's maiden name can be determined from the location of her grave. Example: a Rachel Berry buried in Augusta County VA in an old unused cemetery gives her birth and death date and the fact she was the wife of Gordon Berry. Gordon himself turns up in a newer cemetery with his second wife and their descendants. The only clue to Rachel's maiden name is that she is buried amongst the Crawfords in the old cemetery. A check of Crawford records shows she was indeed a Crawford.

POLISH RESEARCH. There were four waves of Polish immigration to the United States, according to Myra V. Gormley in the Seattle P-I. The first was from 1608 to 1800. The second 1800-1860; the third from 1860 to 1914 when most of the Poles arrived. The fourth major migration was after World War I.

Those coming between 1880 and 1914 probably sailed on the North German Line out of Bremerhaven or Bremen, or on the Hamburg American Line. The LDS library in Salt Lake City has the Hamburg passenger lists on microfilm. The majority landed in New York, at Castle Garden before 1892 and at Ellis Island


Since most Poles were Roman Catholic, church records are invaluable to genealogists. If you are unsure of the parish, but know the city, consult the telephone directory in that city; or available at every chancery office of Catholic dioceses is "The Catholic Directory" which will give you the name and address of the proper parish.

Start in church records because children of many immigrant Poles were born at home, and there may be no civil records.



A psychologist in Scotland thinks they do. Why? Because, he says, they are eccentric! Eccentric, according to the dictionary is "out of the ordinary, odd," unconventional." Genealogists might well fit this description.

Who, but an eccentric, would stand in the rain or brave poison ivy to copy a tombstone? Spend his/her vacation in a courthouse or a cemetery instead of on a tropical island? An all-consuming preoccupation with a single subject is the most characteristic trait of an eccentric, he says.
