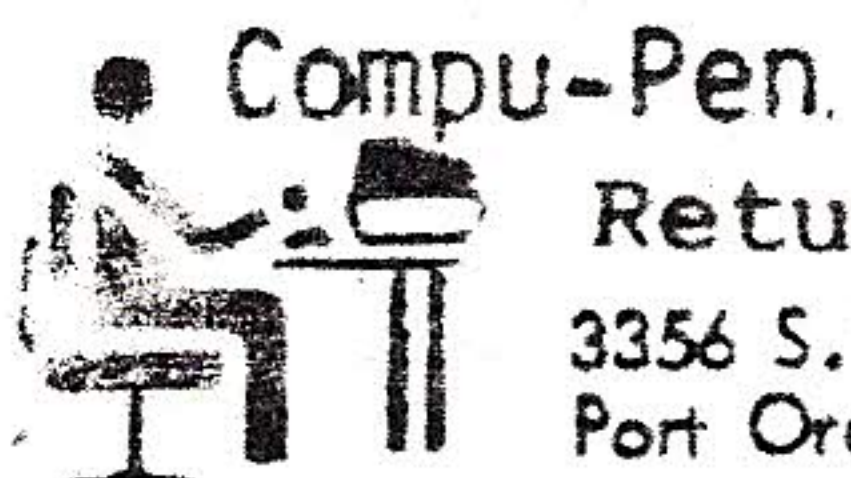

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SCOTS COLONISTS. A new book by David Dobson has been published: "The Original Scots Colonists of Early America 1612-1783." From the early 1600's until the American Revolution around 150,000 Scots found their way to the New World. They settled with English, Dutch and French colonies, and also tried to establish independent Scots colonies in Nova Scotia, New Jersey, and South Carolina. Data in the book has been extracted from family and estate papers, testamentary and probate records, burgh muniments, registers of sasines, registers of deeds, sheriff's court records, port book, customs registers, diaries, newspapers, Privy Council and colonial records, church records and the 1774-1775 Register of Emigrants.

Over 7,000 persons are listed. Many entries contain date of birth or baptism, place of birth, occupation, cause of banishment (where applicable), residence, names of parents, date of emigration and whether voluntarily or involuntarily transported, port of embarkation, destination, name of ship, name of settlement, spouses, children, dates of death and where buried. Book is 370 pages, and can be obtained from Genealogical Publishing Co., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore MD 21202. Price is \$28.50.

COLONIAL TOWN OFFICERS. Old records list some interesting titles for public servants. Such as: Brander (each town had its own brand and Brander kept track of all horse records); Chimney Viewer (his duty was to see that chimneys were not in danger of causing fires); Cow Keeper or Sheep Master (watched town herds); Key Keeper (maintained an animal pound, usually on his own land); Sealer of Leather (checked quality of leather tanning in town); Hayward (kept track of stray animals); Gauger (checked size of casks of liquids, usually distilled liquor); Packer (supervised packing of beef, fish etc. in casks for export); Sizer of Pipe Staves (inspected pipe staves, or boards forming sides of casks; work often performed by Gaugers and Packers).
