FILMS TO BE LOCKED. At the October meeting members voted to put locks on the file cabinets containing microfilm and microfiche. This action was in response to the loss of three films from the Washington State Vital Records which disappeared in recent months. Rolls 10, 11 and 12 had to be replaced by the club at a cost of \$45. Members wishing to use films can obtain the key from the club librarian, or in event of the librarian's absence, from Marlys Marrs.

SALT LAKE TRIP. Club members plan to travel to Salt Lake City in January by Amtrak and if anyone is interested in joining this group, notify Marlys Marrs (373-6945) of your intention. January 15 is the tentative date set. Plans are to stay for a week at least.

Round trip coach fare on the Amtrak is \$146. The price for round trip plus sleeping compartment is \$210 if two persons share a sleeping compartment. Three meals will be included with the sleeping compartment price. The group will stay at the Howard Johnson motel (next door to the Family History library) whose special club rates are \$42 per night, \$168 a week for room for two, or \$119 a week for room for three. (Howard Johnson also offers a 50% discount on REGULAR room rates for persons over 65 years of age. Check with Howard Johnson for their regular room rates. Reservations must be made well in advance for this offer.)

Amtrak leaves Seattle at 6 a.m. (approximately 7 a.m. from Tacoma) and arrives in Salt Lake at 5:40 a.m. the next morning. In leaving Salt Lake, the train departs at 11:50 p.m. and arrives the next night in Seattle at 9:30 p.m.

PROJECTED MOVE. Four libraries and/or historical societies have been contacted recently by the president, Marlys Marrs, to determine which facility would be best for the 1990 PSGS move of its library. Each letter explained that the club is interested in relocating, and outlined certain terms of agreement to be settled beforehand. One important stipulation is that the club be allowed a meeting space every month, if possible.

The four organizations are Family History Library at 9256 Nels Nelson Rd. in Silverdale, the Family History Library at 2225 Perry in Bremerton, the Kitsap Regional Library at 1301 Sylvan Way in Bremerton, and the Kitsap County Historical Museum at 3343 NW Byron in Silverdale.

Club members will have an opportunity to discuss these options at regular club meetings, when answers to the letters have been received. A vote will then be taken. June 1990 is the time set for final decision.

BYLAWS. An updated set of bylaws for PSGS is in preparation now. The final draft will be ready for inspection and vote in the near future. Most important is the new section outlining disposition of club holdings in case the club would cease to exist. NEBRASKA. Birth certificates are now \$6. Marriage, divorce and death certificates are still \$5. A certified copy of a record can be obtained by writing Dept. of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics, PO Box 95007, Lincoln NE 88509.

CALIFORNIA DEATH INDEX. One of the few states with a state-wide death index covering the period from 1905 to 1983 is California. The staff at the state library will check for free. Write them at Calif. State Library, PO Box 942827, Sacramento CA 94237. From 1940 on the index is in ten-year increments and is on microfiche at the county recorder's office in each county. These later indexes give the maiden names of females. (Minn. Genealogist)

POLISH RESEARCH. The PIAST Genealogical Center in Poland is the one resource in that country. The address is: Osrodek Baden Genealogicnych "PIAST", 06-100 PULTRUSK, ul. Zaulek 22, Poland. The center hopes to establish a computerized "Bank of Polish Families." (Minn. Genealogist)

INST AND ULT? These abbreviations often occur in old records. The word "inst" means the current month. "Ult" means the preceding month.

"GLAD BAGS." These storage bags are made of Mylar and can be used to store genealogical records. Just as safe and much less expensive than archival supplies. (Minn. Genealogist)

BOOK REVIEWS

KENNARD, KING, McCUBBIN, KNIGHT AND THEIR KIN, by Alta Kennard Patterson, 331 pages, published in 1988. Allied Families: Brummett, Haley, Harrison, Patterson, Stone, Williams and Whitfield.

This family book represents over 40 years of research, travel and correspondence by its author. It traces the descendants of Richard Kennard, born in Kent County, Maryland around 1640-1650. He was of Ulster-Scots lineage. Mrs. Patterson gives an interesting and comprehensive report of her searches in Scotland and Ireland. Anyone researching in either or both countries will find her experiences instructive and profitable.

Each person in the book has his own number, from Richard Kennard's No. 1 to No. 4699. The amount of genealogical data in the book is astounding. An excellent index is also included. Good reproductions of family pictures and pertinent documents are scattered through the book.

The descendants of Richard Kennard generally went south and west from his birthplace in Maryland, so anyone researching in the southern states is advised to check the book for surnames.

DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL STURDEVANT, compiled by Robert Hunter Sturdevant of Waco, TX.

First published in July 1986 this is an outstanding piece of work in the area of family books. Mr. Sturdevant traces the family of Samuel Sturdevant, born around 1624, possibly in Rochester, Kent, England. He was a citizen of Plymouth, Massachusetts and died in Plympton, MA around 1697.


Mr. Sturdevant uses a numbering system that is easy to follow. Each person, up to modern times, has his own number dating back to Samuel. The person's generation number comes first, (Samuel being Generation No. 1) and then a personal number is assigned. Anyone with New England ancestry would be wise to look into this book.


CHICAGO BAPTISMAL RECORDS. The names of more than 83,000 children born from 1869 to 1907 in Chicago were recently found in the vault at St. Stanislaus Kostka church. The records also contain the names of 47,000 brides and grooms. The church is the oldest Polish parish in Chicago, dating back to 1865. (Minn. Gen.)

ANCESTOR LIVE ON A GORE? This old term refers to an irregular piece of land left over after surveys have been completed. Usually found in hilly areas or caused by rivers used as boundaries. People were often identified as "living at the Gore." (Minn. Genealogist)

KEEPING THE POST OFFICE HAPPY! To speed mail service the following suggestions are made:

- 1. Typed envelopes will reach addresses in large cities one day earlier than hand-written envelopes.
- 2. The optical scanner used to read envelopes reads the address in the reverse order from bottom to top, starting with the zip code, state, city, street address or box number, and finally name.
- 3. If you use "Attn ----" at the bottom left side of the envelope, it will be kicked out by the scanner and held until a human eye can sort it.
- 4. If the box number is where all mail should be sent, put it after the street address (if using one), and just before the city, state and zip code.
- 5. Use the zip code plus the four digits whenever possible. Mail will reach its destination, possibly a day sooner, when using the nine-digit zip code.
- 6. To find out what your nine-digit zip code is, check the address on your telephone bill. (Minn. Genealogist)

1920 CENSUS RECORDS. Census records in the custody of the National Archives may be released to the public 72 years after they are gathered. The announcement that the 1920 census will be open for public inspection in 1992 has proved to be a little premature, according to the Federation of Genealogical Societies bulletin of Summer 1989. Funding problems may delay the release of the 11,000 roles of microfilm. Funding includes microfilm copies for each Federal Archives center, storage cabinets for the film and additional readers and printers. The FGS suggests genealogists express their concern to the National Archives and their elected representatives in Congress.
