

Randy Fantz

Randy A. Fantz, 35, a Bremerton native who played a vital role in the rescue of loggers during the 1980 eruption of Mount St. Helens, died Wednesday at Tacoma General Hospital of an apparent heart attack.

Mr. Fantz, a Gig Harbor resident, was born Jan. 2,

1955, and was raised and educated in the South Kitsap area. He attended East Port Orchard Elementary School and Marcus Whitman Junior High before graduating as an honor student from South Kitsap High School in 1973.

He was president of the Honor Society at Marcus Whitman and served as the The club also extends sympathy to Mary Kuhlman, whose husband, Henry, passed away recently.

color guard on the High School Marching Machine. He was a Boy Scout and played in the Little League and on the South Kitsap High School youth football team.

Mr. Fantz worked for Lyle Moving and Storage in Bremerton until 1977, then served with the City of Bremerton as an engineering aide in the Water Department.

He and his wife, the former Joanne Paulson, were married May 13, 1978, in Tacoma. In 1979, Mr. Stevens attended Clover Park Vocational School, Tacoma, to receive his airframe and power mechanic's license, and began a career as an airplane mechanic for the Weyerhaeuser Co., working at SeaTac Airport.

During the May, 1980 eruption of Mount St. Helens, he served aboard the helicopter unit that airlifted loggers from the blast zone. For that work, he was awarded the highest peacetime honor given to a civilian by the government—the Soldier's Medal. He was also presented the Valley Forge medal for his work.

Mr. Fantz was a member of the Tacoma Trail Cruisers and of the First Baptist Church of Gig Harbor.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by daughter Jennifer and son Christopher, both at home; his father, Alan, of Port Orchard; his mother, Cindy Spore of Port Orchard; brother Brian Fantz of Port Orchard; stepbrother Michael Waara of Bellevue; stepsister Stacey Cookson of Indianola; and half-sister Brooke Fantz of Port Orchard. A brother, Bruce Fantz, died in 1957.

An Alabama Civil War Buff who heads to battle re-enactments on weekends spends his weekday lunch hours in the Birmingham Public Library's Tutwiler Collection of Southern History and Literature.

Not only does he find statistical information on his adopted regiment, but he can also mine the library's rich genealogical materials for tidbits on the soldier he wants to portray.

The clues to what a long-ago soldier wore, sang, and read hide in the pages of books and the celluloid of microfilm in this specialized reference collection. Finding them is a matter of know-how, acquired with the aid of the particularly skilled staff.

In all, the Southern Collection, endowed in 1926, contains more than 70,000 resources on subjects ranging from college football to the works of Faulkner, from census records to Robert E. Lee and Elvis Presley. There's a long wall of shelves filled with state publications, county records, and city histories, and another area devoted to Southern religion. Genealogists come here in great numbers, poring through computerized card catalogs, searching for the faint footprints of their families.

"We're not just concerned with history," says Mary Bess Paluzzi, who coordinates the library's special collections. "We look at Southern life." If you're interested in quilts on the beds, or the home remedies practiced by mountain people, or what food was eaten in Savannah or New Orleans during a certain period, that's what our collection can tell you.

Housed in a library built in 1927 (a new post-modern building now serves general library needs), the Tutwiler Collection goes beyond materials on Alabama. "Our strength is the Old Confederacy-Virginia to Louisiana, including Tennessee," says Paluzzi.

For example, there's the INDEX TO MARRIAGE BONDS FILED IN THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE ARCHIVES, 1741-1868 and the SOUTH CAROLINA LAND GRANTS, 1735-1752 Index. And among the extensive materials on Indian heritage are CHEROKEE ROOTS AND BIBLIOGRAPHY OF THE CHICKASAW.

The atmosphere here is soft and elegant. Rich woods and salmon-covered walls ring study tables with work lamps. Wrapping around the room are 16 recently restored murals depicting outstanding characters from world literature. They were painted by New York artist Ezra Winter in the 1920's.

The Tutwiler Collections of Southern History and Literature is housed in the Linn-Henley building, adjacent to the Birmingham Public Library. The collection is available Monday and Tuesday, 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.; Wednesday thru Saturday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Sunday 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. For more information, write the library at 2100 Park Place, Birmingham, Alabama 35203 or call (205) 226-3665.

USING THE HAMBURG SHIPS LISTS


Between 1850 and 1934, approximately 5½ milion Europeans sailed from Hamburg, Germany. They came from all over Europe -- Germany, Russia, Poland, Austria -- and their motives for leaving their homeland were as varied as their nationalities. LeHavre, Antwerp, Rotterdam, and Bremen were also overflowing with travelers bound for America, but Hamburg distinguished itself by making an effort to protect the emigrants.

In 1850 the city of Hamburg established the Hamburg Association for the Protection of Emigrants. They provided counseling, medical care and housing. Each ship's agent was to give the Hamburg authorities a list of all passengers with names, sex, age, occupation and home city. This list has survived both world wars, unlike Bremen's which was lost during the second World War. It is the only complete historical record of Northern European emigration.


In 1984 Hamburg's Historic Emigration Office opened its doors to the public. The Office is located in the Museum of Hamburg History which has displays showing the city's history as a harbor town and exhibits dedicated to the emigrants. Visitors to the

museum can get information about their ancestors within one or two hours, but written requests take about six months to answer hecause there is a large backlog of requests. To successfully find your ancest or, the staff needs the year of emigration. Cost of the search is \$30.00 for each year, whether or not the search is successful. Payment can be made by personal check, cashier's check, or German marks. The LDS church has filmed the lists and has an index that can be used in any of their libraries.

CHANGES IN ATTITUDES MAY UPROOT GENEALOGY

(The following was copied from the Orange Co. CA gen soc bulletin. It was originally written by Jim McGavran of the Columbus Ohio Dispatch.)

Right now, I lie awake worrying about the future of genealogy. The way we are carrying on, no one will be able to find his or her roots a hundred years from now..... Genealogy is a hobby that anyone can enjoy. It is fun, and it doesn't cost a lot of money or require special equipment, such as golf or skiing do. It beats collecting things, such as salt and pepper shakers, which have to be kept dusted.

Up until now, it has been fairly simple. All you had to do was check old census records or hunt for wills, deeds, marriages and births. Or you could spend a pleasant vacation tramping through old graveyards.

All this is changing. Old cemeteries won't help if people choose cremation over burial. Where will you look for information about an ancestor whose ashes were scattered over the Pacific Ocean? Census records are becoming worthless. People don't stay in one place for more than a year or two, let alone from one census to the next. Forget the courthouse, too. Why look for an ancestor's will if he or she bought a book on how to avoid probate and succeeded in doing so?

Current lifestyles render courthouse records obsolete. What will be the point of looking for birth and marriage records if one's great grandmother insisted on having all her children out of wedlock? What if she did get married and kept her maiden name? Or suppose she had children by three legal husbands so that all her offspring have different last names!

I can envision someone searching for roots in the year 2086. I see this individual entering the Bureau of Vital Statistics, approaching the computer and pushing the 'on' button. "May I help you?" the screen will respond. "I am looking for my grandfather's birth certificate," the latter-day genealogist asks, one letter at a time. "Name Please." "Harley Solo, mother, Mary Solo. He was born 4 Apr 1992."

Lights flash, clicking and humming noises are heard as the computer conducts its search. A green list appears on the screen.

"Mary Solo gave birth to Harley Solo on 4 Apr 1992. The rest is classified. Please consult Headquarters."

The future genealogist goes to Headquarters and weeks later returns with the access code. He punches it in. More lights flash. Bells ring. This time the computer has the decency to blush.

"Mary Solo, spinster, was impregnated with material from a sperm bank. Donor's name unknown. Hair and eyes brown. Medium height and build. Tendency to early baldness. No congenital deformities. Said to be musical."

And there goes someone's search for roots. I know it's silly of me to worry about it, but it's things such as that which keep me awake nights.

What are we doing to our future genealogists, our own descendants?

FFV? Okay, now you belong to the DAR (or SAR). How about joining the FFV (First Families of Virginia)? To be included in this group you have to prove that you descended from one (or more) of the 120 settlers in Virginia who arrived between 1607 and the first census, or Muster, of 1625 and who left children. 



BLM RECORDS PROJECT. Nine million General Land Office records from the eastern states will be collected in a data bank by the Bureau of Land Management, the National Genealogical Society newsletter reports. The project started in 1989 and is expected to be finished about 1993. "If you wish to find the original patent for your great-great-grandfather, knowing at least his name and the state in which the patent was granted," you will be able to access the records fairly easily. No more searching through several tract books to locate the records.

The states included are Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Ohio and Wisconsin. The land records include survey field notes, township plats, and patents (deeds) issued in these public-land states.

Other records are statements of title such as railroad grants, swamp grants, school grants, Indian allotments, and private land claims.

Many of these records are over 200 years old and are constantly being used by surveyors, lawyers, and government officials. Over 20,000 requests are received per year for copies of patents and other land records.

Also, to preserve the old records, the books are being taken apart, the pages laminated, and then they are rebound. The automation involves using optical scanners which scan the original records onto computer disks, making the entire document accessible on a computer monitor or printer.

It is hoped that the western states offices will do the same for their records. Tract books for western public-land states are currently available at BLM offices.
