

HANDOUTS FROM MAY 1989 SEATTLE SEMINAR. Those persons who attended the May 1989 Seattle Seminar are asked to turn in any handouts they received at that time. A file is going to be developed to go with the tapes. Leave the handouts at the library.

1920 CENSUS. On Monday, March 2, 1992 the National Archives will unlock the microfilm cabinets holding the 1920 census, the FGS Forum reports. The census exists only on microfilm and is composed of 2,076 rolls of population schedules and 8,590 rolls of the Soundex index. Archivist Don W. Wilson reports that a frame-by-frame review of each roll has been undertaken to identify any problems. It is to be hoped that the quality of reproduction on the 1920 census will be better than most of the 1910 census.

COOKING BOOKS! The Library of Congress actually "cooks" any books they suspect contain silverfish, lice or cockroaches, according to the Orange CA quarterly. Books are placed in a microwave oven and "cooked" for 60 seconds on a warm or low setting. The heat kills the insects and the eggs. Persons picking up books at flea markets or from old attics or basements may wish to use this method. Be sure to remove paperclips, staples or any metal before placing books in microwave.

GENEALOGICAL CORRESPONDENCE. (Excerpts from Marsha Hoffman Rising, C.G.) Research is a personal thing. Don't even imagine that any archival agency will do your work for you. One alternative to personal research is, of course, professional researchers, but even the best professional can miss clues that only you yourself would notice. Become familiar with the holdings of a particular institution to whom you are writing. Familiarize yourself with the locale to which you are writing. Make a single request per letter. If you must make two requests, divide them by paragraph, number the requests, and underline the record requested. The paragraph requesting information should not contain more than 20 words. Enclose a check for the search and ask for any additional charges. Offer to pay for copies.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED. Help is needed at the Kitsap County Courthouse. The County is microfilming land records. Call the County Clerk's office at 876-7164. The Kitsap County Historical Museum also needs help with the newspaper project. Call Suzanne at 692-1949.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSIONS. Researchers unable to find persons who served in the Revolution on Federal pension records might check the Virginia State pension records. The VA state pension was higher than the Federal pension, so 465 former Revolutionary War soldiers and/or their widows chose the VA pension. (Kanawha WV GS)

HERE'S A SWITCH. A German historical society is looking for descendants of a group of 67 persons who emigrated from the Port of Bremen in May and June of 1847. The names involved are Breidenbach, Forell, Hahn, Hellmuth, Herbert, Heun, Hessburger, Koenig, Madfeld, Pipper, Schaefer, Wagner and Weckmann. The names were found in the National Archives. Most landed at Baltimore. Anyone having knowledge of these families is asked to contact H.G. Stuebing, 46 Hamilton Dr., Warminster PA 18974. (FGS Forum, Spring 1990)

KENTUCKY RESEARCH. If a county office in KY has reported that records are "missing" or "not there," write to the KY Dept. of Library and Archives, 300 Coffee Tree Rd., PO Box 537, Frankfort KY 40602. Many records have been removed from local courthouses and sent to the state archives. (Grant Co. WA GS)

SWISS CELEBRATION. Descendants of emigrants from the Swiss canton of Valais in southeastern Switzerland are being sought by the government of the canton to participate in the 700th anniversary of the Swiss constitution in 1991. These Swiss settled in California and Wisconsin for the most part. Contact Robert Klimko, 915 N. Clark St., Appleton WI 54911 if interested.

RHODE ISLAND ARCHIVES. These archives contain tax lists, probates, notaries and land evidences, colonial records, censuses, and registry of vessels for certain years. Write State of RI and Providence Plantations, Office of Secy of State, RI State Archives, State House, Providence RI 02903. (Kanawha WV GS)

HOMESTEAD APPLICATIONS

Do not search for homestead papers for a Confederate veteran on land held by the federal government from 1861 through 1 Jan. 1867. The South had opposed the homestead principle, preferring cash sales and preemptions, but after the secession of the southern states, land in the federal domain was largely gained by homesteading. At this time public land sold for \$1.25 an acre, but those meeting the requirements (including a five year residency, during which they cultivated or improved the land) could homestead a quarter section (160 acres) with no monetary payment except a small filing fee.

Anyone who had served in the Union Army or Navy for as little as 14 days was considered a veteran and could apply his service time against the residency requirement. However, anyone who had served the Confederacy, borne arms against the federal government or had given aid to its emenies was not allowed to homestead public lands unitl 1 Jan. 1867.

Changes continued in the homestead acts until an act in 1872 allowed all Civil War veterans with at least 90 days service to apply their service time (up to four years) to the residency requirement.

Later bills provided more changes regarding homesteads. In the lands of the West a homesteader could claim 320 acres. Then the Homestead Act of 1916 allowed homesteads of 640 acres specifically for stock raising, usually grazing.

Applications for homesteads from 1863 to 1908 are filed in the National Archives under the names of the individual land offices. A homestead entry application and proof of homestead contain genealogical information. Besides the name of the applicant and a description of the property, the application will tell his place of residence at the time he applied for the land and signatures of two witnesses. The proof of homestead gives the above information, and his age, his post office address, the number and date of the land patent. In addition, if the claimant was an alien or naturalized citizen, the file contains naturalization papers, the date and place of his birth and the date and place of his arrival in the U.S..

Precision Indexing, a subsidiary of American Genealogical Lending Library, is indexing the lists of millions of persons who entered the U.S. via ships arriving in New York City for the years 1820-1897. FEE INCREASES. Social Security: When requester provides SS number, \$5. When SS number is not provided, \$16.50. A search for a claim file, \$14; certification is \$10; photocopies are 10 cents per page.

1900 to 1980 Census Records: \$25 each. Additional copies \$2 each. Fee schedules for genealogists are \$6 each. A new application form (BC-600) has been developed. Write to U.S. Dept. of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, Personal Census Service Branch, Pittsburg KS 66762. (So King Co. bulletin)

PIONEER CEMETERY BILL PASSES. It is now a Class C Felony to willfully damage any marker, monument etc. in a Washington cemetery. House Bill 2335 also authorizes the state's Archaeological and Historical Division to grant non-transferable certificates of authority to maintain and protect abandoned cemeteries. HAVING PROBLEMS? If you are having a problem with your research, a new service is being instituted by the club. Hand your written problems to Jackie Horton, librarian, and she will route them to someone who may be able to help.

BUYER BEWARE - AGAIN

If you've heard it before, it's because we keep repeating it: Check carefully, very carefully, before you invest in family/genealogical-related products, particularly if the offer arrives in your mailbox unsolicited. While there are lots of legitimate businesspeople out there, some offers or products may not satisfy you.

One member last November invested \$26.88 in a publication purporting to contain information on individual members of her family "who immigrated to the New World between the l6th and early 20th centuries." The solicitation letter calls the publication an "International Registry" of the surname, noting 150 million records were searched by computer.

What arrived in the mail last December 30, says the chagrined member, was a fancy cover surrounding 86 pages on how to do family research, a questionable coat of arms, a chart on how many of the surname there are in various countries and some 60 pages listing various people with the surname, admittedly including herself and some living (not 16th to early 20th century) relatives, some with outdated addresses and other errors. The "Registry" section was by state, but not in alpha-

betical order and, she suspects, from telephone books. Needless to say, the member did not use the handy reorder form included with the book.

Two other members report receiving a solicitation for a "(family name) Grand Reunion in Ireland"—identical except for two different family names used. It indicates the \$2,195 cost will include feasting at "medieval banquets" and making merry in country pubs, along withe meeting the Chief Herald of Ireland and touring. Various Irish officials are listed on an "Advisory Board" to lend authenticity to the "Reunion."

The reunion is "organized strictly by invitation only" and the reply card indicates it is an "exclusive invitation". Unfortunately, says one member, this marvelous opportunity was addressed to the member's father—who died 25 years ago. The name obviously came from the telephone book, where the listing purposely has not been changed.

And what's most interesting of all, all three of these offers, involving three very different surnames, came from the same address in Ohio.

PERSI AT FAMILY HISTORY CENTERS. Local Family History Centers (Mormon libraries) can now provide copies of the Periodical Source Index (PERSI) published by the Allen County Public Library Foundation. This information is in microfiche form.

PERSI is a subject index to 1,700 English and French articles in United States and Canadian genealogical periodicals totalling around 500,000 articles, all told. The Index includes separate indexes to articles on families, localities and research methods.

There are two sections in the Index: (1) a retrospective section (on FHL microfiche 601683) covering articles dating from 1847 through 1985; (2) annual indexes (FHL microfiche 6016864) which includes articles dated 1986 and later. Instructions for using PERSI are at the beginning of each section.

The retrospective index is not yet complete, but it indexes about 200 of the most popular genealogical periodicals.

After locating the article you want, contact the Allen County Public Library, PO Box 2270, Fort Wayne IN 46801. Photocopies may be ordered at a cost of \$3 for each letter plus 20 cents per page for copying. Request letter should include not more than five to eight articles. Telephone and fax machine requests will not be honored.

TACOMA SEMINAR. On Saturday October 13, the Tacoma-Pierce genealogical society will present John Colletta, author of "They Came in Ships" at a seminar at the Lakewood Mall Community Room in Tacoma. The all-day session costs \$18 single for early registration, or \$20 per couple. Mail registration to Mary Gorham, 2409 N. Washington St., Tacoma WA 98406.

Or if a seminar is not your style, Dr. Colletta's book is \$4.95 plus \$2.50 shipping at Ancestry Inc. Dept. SRV, PO Box 538, Salt Lake City UT 84110. The book deals exclusively with ship passenger lists. In 1893 Congress began to legislate what information would be included in passenger lists. The book tells how to get the most out of the lists and where to find them.

HAVE YOU THOUGHT ABOUT WHEN YOU DIE??

What happens to your genealogy? Do you want it published?

Have you made arrangements to give it to someone?

Have you left instructions in your will?

Have you left money in your will for preservation and publication?

Does your will say who the material is to go to?

As a first step, separate your material into Surnames and label each folder with that surname. Include an ancestor chart in each surname file.

Your local genealogy society or the society in the area of the Surname is an excellent depository. Just make sure your family knows what you want done and that it is in your will. (Kalispell MT bulletin)

Editor's Note: The Family History Center at Salt Lake City is another excellent place, particularly for those who feel there is no one in the family interested enough to value the material.

CONFEDERATE FORCES. It is estimated that 75% of all eligible men served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. In the north only 25% served. Although Confederate Gray was the official color for southern uniforms, uniforms of enlisted men soon became the familiar "butternut" (a kind of brown) color. Since the South had to rely on home weavers, due to the fact that most mills were located in England or New England, much of the material was woven in homes or at the Huntsville prison in Alabama. Pants and footwear were sometimes stripped from dead enemy soldiers to replace the worn-out Confederate uniforms. Hand-made wooden canteens kept water cooler than tin ones. A shortage of weapons also forced the South to confiscate enemy weapons. (SW LA bulletin)



NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS. Two ways to keep newsprint from getting brown and brittle:

- (1) Dissolve a Milk of Magnesia tablet in a quart of water; let it stand overnight. Pour mixture into a container large enough for the clipping. Place over the container a piece of nylon netting large enough to cover with some left over on each side. Put newsprint on top of netting, completely covering it with the liquid. Let this soak for an hour. Carefully remove by raising the netting to prevent tearing. Place netting and newsprint on absorbent paper on a flat surface and pat dry. (This works because of magnesium carbonate.)
- (2) Dissolve one Milk of Magnesia tablet in quart of water or two tablespoons of liquid Magnesia in quart of Club Soda. Mix well until tablet dissolves. Chill solution eight hours in refrigerator. Place in shallow pan and continue as for Step 1. Store in moisture-proof place. (SW LA GS)

GENEALOGICAL INFORMATION FROM STRANGE PLACES. A small piece of paper tucked in an old family medical book ("Dr. Chase's Receipt Book," published in Detroit in 1887) gave the entire history of one family including birth and death dates, birthplaces and other important information. The book was found along a roadside in Marysville WA in 1989!

A small Blue Bird School Series pocket note book, purchased at a garage sale, listed 98 babies delivered by a Navy doctor in Bremerton WA and Newport CA from 1923 to 1938. The information contains date and time of birth, child's name and birth weight, parents' names and ages, including the mother's maiden name.
