






The above is a corrected version of the map which appeared in the August issue of Family Backtracking.

BACK IN BREMERTON. A Charter Member and one of the founders of Puget Sound Genealogical Society, Graecia Britten, is now a resident at the Bremerton Convalescent Center after spending an extended period across the Sound. A visit would be appreciated, so drop in and see her!

DOUG LINCE WRITES: Lost a relative in California during the gold rush? It did not pan out for many men, and they went north to strikes in Canada. I found one on microfilm in THE BRITISH COLONIST, a three-times weekly in Victoria, Vancouver Island, February 1859:

"Capt. Brock of the boat Gold Hunter, found on Feb. 8th, three miles above Harrison River, the body of a man supposed to be CHARLES SHELDON of San Francisco. He was buried on the point at the first riffle above Harrison River. The deceased was 50 years or over, old; heavy set, 5 ft. 5 inches in height; slightly bald on front part of head; whiskers mixed with grey; and wore a double truss. On his body was found—a gold watch, open face; 15 dollar gold piece; 1 dollar do; 25 cts. silver; a small amount in dust; a heavy gold pencil; and a certificate dated San Francisco, May 22, 1858. His effects were left at Fort Hope. He is supposed to have a brother in San Francisco."

EARLY FINNS. You may have Finnish blood and not know it, writes Myra V. Gormley in the Tacoma News Tribune. As early as 1638 at least one-third of the 300 settlers of New Sweden on the Delaware River were Finns. By 1700 these Finns had been absorbed into the neighboring English and German-speaking communities.

Between 1864 and 1920 more than 300,000 Finns left Finland, and most genealogists will find their Finnish ancestors in this group. Almost half settled in Michigan and Minnesota. Finns can usually be found in church registers. Finnish Lutheran church registers often date back to 1648. The records are either at the churches or in microfilm copies at various archives in Finland.

FREDI PERRY'S LIBRARY. At a recent meeting Fredi Perry, prominent Kitsap County historian and long-time PSGS member, discussed her research techniques and related interesting bits of information on county history. She distributed lists of her library collection which is probably one of the most comprehensive on the subject of county history to be found. FROM A VIRGINIA CITY, MONTANA NEWSPAPER: July 1866. "The new 5 cent coin is being issued and will be the same size as the \$3.00 gold piece." (!!)

After typing this list of birth attended by Dr. Jewell, I became interested in the man himself. A telephone call to the Veteran's Administration in Seattle produced enough information to satisfy my curiosity. JESSE DALE JEWELL was born 24 July 1891 and died 11 July 1975. His VA file #12686366 is located at the Archives in Sand Point, WA. I was impressed with this phone conversation because I didn't realize the information could be so readily available as it was computerized.



The article contains so much good material, it is too good not to share. (Editor)

WAYS TO FIND A MAIDEN NAME

Anne Charlotte Winters

- 1. Social Security applications give name, birthdate, place and parents! You'll need the person's social security number, which can be found on more recent death certificates, employment records, tax records. You will need to prove your relationship to the deceased. Write SSA, 6401 Security Blvd., Baltimore, 1:D 21235.
- 2. Marriage records: Consent affidavits, banns, intentions, bonds, contracts, applications for marriage licenses, marriage certificates (roughly 30% have been lost). What kinds of records were kept and where were they kept in that time and place? Records usually begin when a town or county was organized. Look where the first child was born. Where was the nearest marriage mecca?
- 3. Divorce records. Where was the nearest divorce mecca? For example, a few hundred divorces were granted in Chicago in 1868.
- 4. Death certificate.
- 5. Funeral parlor records (sometimes the name of the funeral parlor has changed, yet the records are still there). These were very helpful to me in finding the maiden name of a woman for whom there was no obituary in the local paper. She'd died in the no longer extant county hospital at a very advanced age. The funeral parlor records revealed that she'd come across the plains with her parents and siblings (named) from Illinois to California in 1868. Her place of birth and her parents' place of births were also supplied by one of her out-of-town children, as well as the names of her grandparents! Look at the American Blue Book of Funeral Directors, published by Kates-Boylston Publications, 1501 Broadway, New York, NY 10036, to track down a funeral home.
- 6. Relatives. A relative may remember that Aunt Nell has a box in the attic of: old letters, photographs, family bibles, wedding invitations or announcements, scrapbooks, diaries, even favorite old family books with inscriptions from one member to another. We have one from a grandfather to his prospective bride, given before they were married as a Christmas present her maiden name and the year is written in his handwriting. Any of the above mentioned items may give you a clue as to where to start looking and/or in which time frame.
- 7. IGI (The International Genealogical Index, available at branch libraries of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints recently renamed as Family History Centers).
- 8. Names and naming patterns. Is the name you are searching a nickname? For example, the Mary Winters I was looking for turned out to be the maiden Polly Clark. (Patsie = Martha. and Nabby = Abigail). In families from Scotland, the first boy was often named after the paternal grandfather, the second boy after the maternal grandfather and the third son after his father. Sometimes a child's first or middle name is a family surname.

- 9. Did she have a brother? Who were the witnesses on land records or wills, other legal records? Who were the children's godparents or sponsors at baptisms or christenings? A fellow living with a family with a different last name could be a brother note other surnames in the household or the neighbors in census records. Check biographical records of the area.
- 10. County histories and portrait and biographical records, especially in the Midwest. These can be particularly helpful if you think you have located a brother. Sometimes these historical and biographical records will mention, for example, that "Mr. Dow's sister, Emmeline, married John McKenzie," and it may go on to say when the family arrived in the area and from where they had come, to which church the family belonged and what political affiliation was held.
- 11. Family histories. Most genealogical libraries have a section of family histories. If a child had a surname as a first or middle name, you can check that name in your family history section. Or, write to a genealogical library or historical society in the area of your search to see if they have information on that family in their files or a family history in their collections.
- 12. In New York State, try the Town Historian (usually a volunteer, I include a few dollars) some are extremely helpful. Be careful here because in New York State, villages are usually parts of towns. There can be a village clerk or a town clerk and a county clerk. For instance, the Village of Hudson Falls (formerly Sandy Hill) is in the Town of Kingsbury. Hudson Falls will be on the map, Kingsbury often is not. Hudson Falls has a village clerk, a town (of Kingsbury) clerk, and a county clerk, as it is the Washington County seat. It is the town clerk who keeps the vital records. Some villages will be partly in one town and partly in another: the village of Sag Harbor is partly in the town of Easthampton and partly in the town of Southampton. Division Street is the dividing line.
- 13. Court records: delayed birth certificates, petitions for child support, guardianships, and sometimes common law marriages. In the case of a New York State Certificate of Birth by Adoption, it might be filed in the year of adoption, rather than the year of birth.
- 14. If the court has burned (especially in the South), try the local chapter of the DAR. I have asked the reference librarian of a town library if she could recommend someone in the local chapter of the DAR who might, for a fee, be willing to check their records. Many of the early DAR women copied records from what the families had after a court burned and have reconstructed, to some degree, the area records. And the DAR maintains their National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution Library at 1776 D Street N.W., Washington, DC 20006.
- 15. Cemetery clues: Children are often buried next to grandparents. What is the chronological order in the family burial plot? Who owned the plot and buried the earliest family member? Can you deduce anything from the arrangement of the graves? Are there other surnames found in the family plot? Who are they? Are they of an age to be the parents of your female ancestor? Check sexton's records.

- 16. Some areas have a reverse index to wills. If you know where the first child was born and that area has a reverse index to wills, you may get lucky and find who the parents of your great grandmother were.
- 17. Check the probate packets of the names other than your family in the family plot. Some probate packets contain, for example, "I Nancy Overton, wife of Jesse Overton and daughter of Aaron Clark, deceased, late of Southampton,..."
- 18. DAR records. The DAR was formed in the 1890's and there are biographical sketches of these women. If a grandmother or other female relative belonged, you may find a bonanza many generations in her biographical sketch.
- 19. Books such as: Victorian Lady Travellers, Seafaring Women, Ladies on the Loose, Selling a Wife in England, Faithful Servants, American Samplers by the Colonial Dames of Mass., Boston, 1921. There is a book entitled Women's History Sources, A Guide to Archives and Manuscript Collections in the US, published in Ann Arbor, MI (especially letters and diaries of women). Check your local library's card catalogue women.
- 20. Newspapers. The personal columns were used extensively, especially in the 1800's. A married woman might put an ad in saying she's here from County Cork, she thought her brother (named) was coming, and if he is here to please contact her at ... (or vice-versa). In the 1700's there were notices of "elopements" a husband would publish the fact that his wife had left (eloped) his bed and board and he would no longer be responsible for her debts. Look for stories of wedding anniversaries. These generally mention where the couple was married, when, which friends and relatives came to the anniversary celebration and here you may find her family surname. Obituaries might mention that a (woman's brother) Mr. Herbert Kane of Wichita, Kansas attended the funeral in Illinois. Some libraries have the entire New York Times on microfilm since its inception in 1851, and there is an every-name index to this paper in book form!
- 21. Military pension records can be rich in genealogical info, especially if a widow applied for the benefits. Try to get the "packet" from the State Adjutant General, as well as the National Archives, because some seem not to duplicate so much as to complement each other. The widow or beneficiary had to show proof of marriage or relationship. In this way I came across a reference to a will which had been at a courthouse which has since burned. The widow supplied proof of marriage; a daughter (married or single) could use a will to snow proof of relationship.
- 22. Following WWI there was a PILGRIMAGE FOR THE MOTHERS AND WIDOWS OF THE SOLDIERS OF WWI WHO WERE BURIED IN EUROPE DURING THE WAR. Some libraries have a section for government documents: ask for 71st Congress, 2nd Session, House Document 140. All of the mothers and widows who were eligible for this pilgrimage are given name, address, relationship to deceased, rank, organization, cemetery where solider is buried, and whether the woman went or not.
- 23. Things to watch for: a) The Genealogical Society of Utah is indexing everyname in their sources, b) As a follow through to the book, AMERICAN SAMPLES, two women are tracing the ancestry of each sampler maker. The book should be out shortly.

- 24. Land records. These may take you back a few generations. Property could be transferred by deed or will. Homestead applications may have genealogical information!
- 25. School records. In earlier days, these may be board minutes which may refer to a school census which you may be able to track down. Records from ladies' finishing schools, especially in the South; alumni association compiled biographies. The Federal Government maintains records of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- 26. Census records, especially 1880 and 1900, who are the neighbors? Does it say or can you calculate how long they've been married? When would they be likely then to have an anniversary celebration? Check anniversaries which may be in local newspapers.
- 27. Orphanage records, especially state or local government run orphanages. If the orphanage is no longer in operation, the state's Department of Social or Welfare Services or the state archivist may be able to help.
- 28. Check libraries for telephone directories of the entire US on microfiche yellow pages and all! Maybe your surname can still be found in the area. Try writing someone of the surname you are searching who lives in that area!
- 29. Check the Family Register at Family History Centers. It lists names of ancestors for whom people are searching and gives the name and address of the searcher. You can write directly to the searcher. Or, enter your ancestor and respond to the inquiries you may receive. It's a great way to share information and to find someone else working on the same lines.
- 30. Passport applications here (1791-1925 at National Archives) and abroad. If the records are less than 75 years old, they are restricted.
- 31. Hospital records. Hospitals generally keep records of the parents of babies born there. I wrote one New York City hospital (try the Public Relations Dept. or Admissions & Records) for this information from a 1939 birth. Four months later they responded with the requested information, which had been found in records which were boxed in the cellar!
- 32. Queries in genealogical magazines in the geographic area of your search will often elicit a response which can unlock a logjam.

Just a note: A genealogist of my acquaintance has been searching for a grandmother for some time. About all she's had is that this grandmother was in the Oklahoma Territory. No one in the family seems to know much about this particular grandmother. Well, the genealogist's brother had plastic surgery for drooping eyelids. After surgery, the doctor told his patient that he'd found something he'd never expected to find. The patient has a layer of fat in his eyelids the color of which is found only in American Indians and Orientals! Now, my genealogist friend has a clue for finding this elusive grandmother!





TERMS USED IN GENEALOGY. The following words are often seen in old records:

Abstract: A summary of the important parts, or points, of a document.

Ahnentafel: Pedigree, or table of ancestors.

Consanguinity: State of being related by blood, or descended from a common ancestor.

Consort: Spouse (husband or wife).

Decedent: Deceased person.

Emigrant: One who leaves one place or country to settle in another.

Immigrant: One who enters a new country and settles there.

et. al.: "and others" et. ux.: "and wife"

Freeman: One who was given civil or political liberty after taking an oath.

Freemen: In tax or other records, unmarried men age 21 or over, free of family obligations were taxed as single men. They were transferred to regular tax lists after marriage; thus a search of tax records year by year will show year of marriage.

Indenture: Agreement in writing between two or more parties, which was then cut or torn in a jagged line, each party receiving one section that could be matched. Frequently used when an apprentice was bound to service, an immigrant to service in a colony, or when money loans were involved.

Pace: Measure of distance; approximately 2-1/2 feet.

Progenitor: Ancestor in the direct line; forefather.

Redemptioner: Person who sold his services for a period of years to pay his ships passage.

Relict: Widow or widower. (Sequoia CA Gen Soc Newsletter)
