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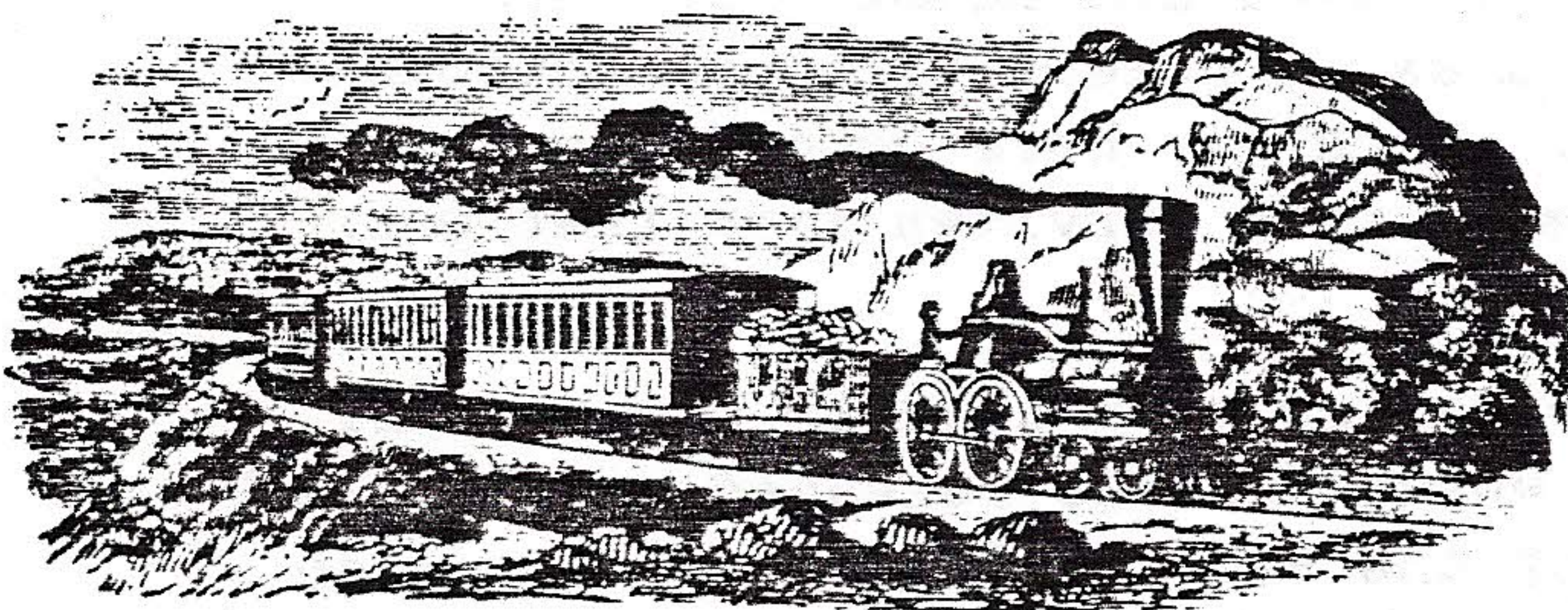
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MEETINGS AND COMING EVENTS

Egbert George Werner, 89, of Bremerton died Tuesday at Harrison Memorial Hospital.

He was born Nov. 1, 1901, in Beattie, Kan. He was raised in Axtel, Kan., and spent three years farming and cattle ranching after high school on the family land in Nebraska. Mr. Werner attended Washington State University at Pullman.

Following college, he worked for the Great Northern Railroad for nine years. He moved to Bremerton in 1933 and worked at the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard as an electrician for 30 years, retiring in 1963.

Mr. Werner was a Cub Scout leader in Gilberton, and a charter member of the Gilberton Community Club, and the Crystal Grange in Brownsville. He also was a member of the Kitsap County Jayhawkers Club, Old Time Fiddlers, Olympic Genealogical Society, Steadfast Lodge 216 F&AM, Nile Temple of the Shrine, Kitsap County Shrine Club, Reliance

Chapter 70 Order of Eastern Star, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers and past master of Kodosh Scottish Rite. Mr. Werner attended Sylvan Way Baptist Church.

He is survived by his wife, Lily of Bremerton; son Frederick of Bremerton; one brother, Julius of Fairfield, Calif.; two sisters, Irma Cordon of Wetmore, Kan., and Ella Moos of Lodi, Calif.; three grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren.

Services will be at 1 p.m. Monday at Lewis Funeral Chapel, with interment following at Forest Lawn Cemetery.

DOWNSIDE OF COMPUTER USE. An article appearing in the Richland WA gen soc bulletin says that recent news reports claim that certain records at the National Archives are in danger of being lost forever!

The reason is that much of the information from the last 30 years is on computer systems that are now obsolete. Since older computer systems have been impossible to maintain or operate, new systems are being installed. "Last year, 200 reels of only 17-year old Public Health Service computer tapes were destroyed because no one could find out what the names and numbers on them meant. Census data from the 1960s--plus NASA's early scientific observations--are on thousands of reels of old tape, some of which may have decomposed, or may fall apart if run through the balky equipment that survives from that era.

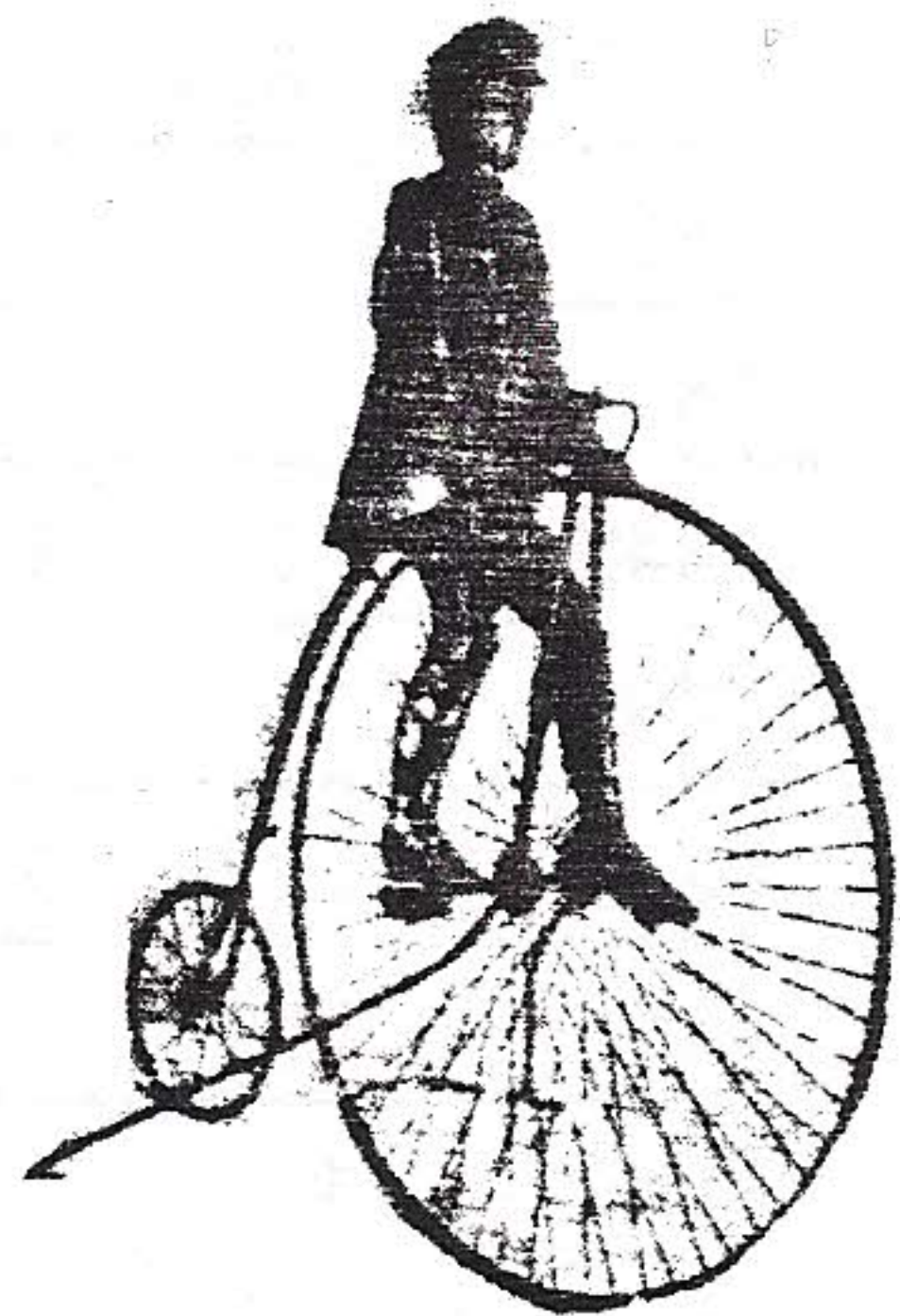
NEWS FROM ARCHIVES AT SAND POINT. Make a reservation some time in December if you are interested in the 1920 Federal Census which will be released March 2, 1992, advises Sue Karren, assistant director of the Seattle Archives. She also states that despite rumors that records of World War II servicemen are on old computer systems, these records are still at the St. Louis Archives, and are being preserved on paper. In other words, they haven't been automated yet, and there are no plans to do so soon.

If you are in Washington DC personally and cannot read a certain microfilm in the Archives, you will be allowed to see the originals. For further Archives information, see page 5 of this bulletin.

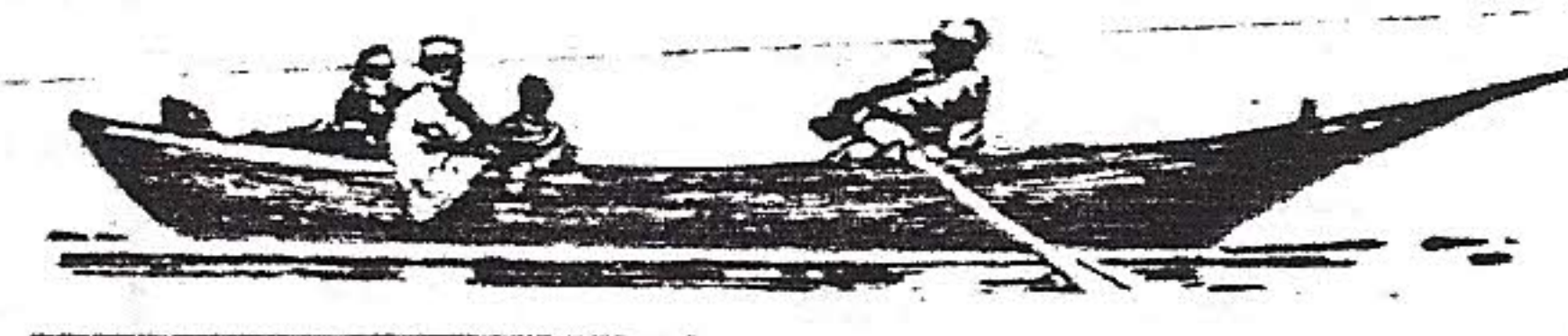
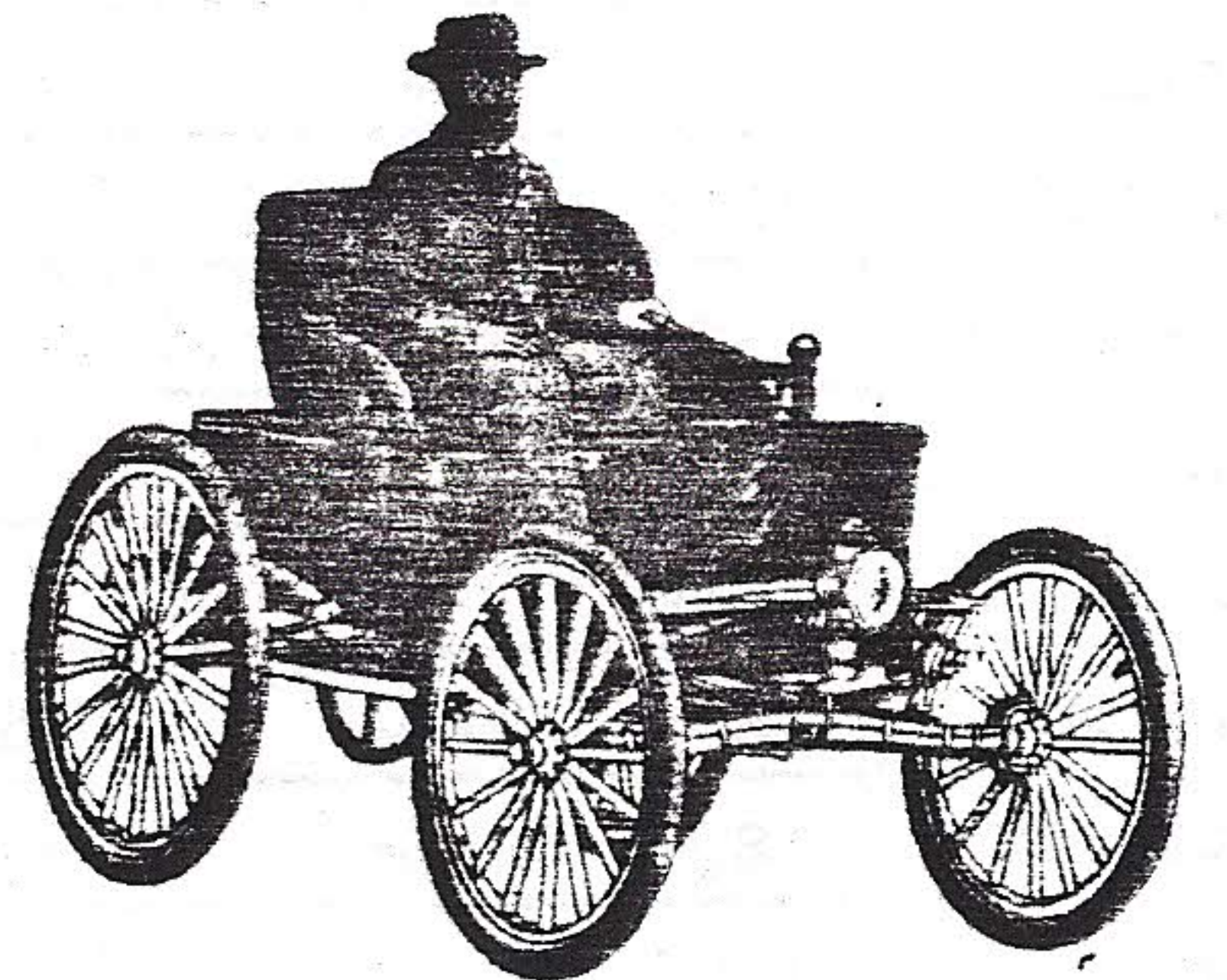

NO EAST OR WEST GERMANY NOW. Letters formerly addressed to West Germany should be addressed W--- and the zip code. Example: W--5920 Badenburg. All localities in what was East Germany should be addressed O--- plus the zip code. In all cases, the name of the country is Germany, no east or west designation. (Ephrata WA gen soc)

INDIANA RESEARCH. Send Indiana queries to Indiana Ancestors, c/o Indianapolis Star, PO Box 145, Indianapolis IN 46206-0145. Limit to 50 words, plus dates and sender's name and address. Query number and approximate date of publication will be sent if SASE is enclosed.

HANDBAST. The term handfast in marriage and birth records indicates an "uncanonical, private or even probationary form of marriage." In handfasting a couple announced their wish to live together before receiving the blessing of the church.

The couple would stand before a group of their peers, hold clasped hands above their heads and state their intentions. The agreement was good for a year and a day, or until a clergyman was available to perform rites of marriage. If at the end of the year and a day, each wished to go his/her own way, they could do so with no ties. No matter what happened, any child born of a Handfast was considered legitimate and would inherit. (Ephrata gen soc)

From the 30 October 1891 Bellingham WA Reveille: "Undertaker Brackett has some fine burial robes. They, however, are false fronts, and a person who goes to Heaven in one of them will have to stand with his back to the wall to make a decent appearance."

C/P	Certificate of Purchase	Notice that unpaid real estate taxes have been sold by the County Clerk to a bidder at a tax sale.
C/R fro	Certificate of Redemption	Notice by the County Clerk that the property has been redeemed from tax sale, generally by the current title holder.
C/S	Certificate of Sale	Transfer of property, pending redemption from the sheriff to a bidder (not the current Title holder) as a result of a court action. Case number goes below the abbreviation in the "Instrument" column.
DI	Chattel Mortgage	A mortgage on articles of personal property. Transfer of legal right in personal property as security for payment of money.

RESEARCHING TAX RECORDS

(This was gathered from a number of sources, including Myra L. Kujawa of San Angelo TX and Elizabeth Shown Mills, when speaking at a seminar here several years ago.)

Taxes! The bane of everyone's existence. Long before Mary and Joseph went up to Bethlehem to be taxed, the human race has been contending with them. To the genealogist, however, old tax records can be invaluable.

Indirect taxes in early America were imposed on taverns, mills, merchants, craftsmen, physicians and lawyers. These can prove an occupation.

Direct taxes were poll taxes (literally a tax on a living human head), personal property and real property taxes.

Poll taxes were due when a young man reached a certain age. They prove residence and give clues to the movement of certain persons. After a man reached old age, his poll was no longer taxed; so don't assume he has died if he disappears from the poll tax records. Poll taxes absolutely establish residence.

Personal property taxes give clues as to the economic wealth of certain individuals. In studying tax records for several years, you can see how the categories grew as more tax revenues were needed. In 1788 Madison County KY a man was taxed on horses, mares, colts and mules besides his land. By 1792 cattle and stud horses were added in a separate column. A coach and chariot with four wheels was one category, another was "other carriages with four wheels," while a third was carriages with two wheels.

Real property taxes don't necessarily prove residence. A man could hold land in many counties or states. In colonial New York and Virginia (and some other southern colonies) quit rent taxes were not abolished until after the revolution. They had developed in feudal times when persons owed labor to the lord of the manor. Money eventually became a satisfactory substitute; hence the term Quit Rent.

Special taxes were levied for wars, usually on real property and slaves. Records survive of a 1798 tax, levied during a war scare with the French, in Pennsylvania (records in National Archives) and Maryland (at the MD Historical Society).

The tax generated to fight the War of 1812 lasted until 1815, but very few of these lists survive. During the Revolution North Carolina taxed Quakers, Moravians, Mennonites and Dunkards who would not participate in the fighting.

Many states have "Land Sold for Taxes" books. These are excellent sources, especially in the southern states where landowners often couldn't pay their taxes, especially those imposed after the war. The National Archives is now filming records of southern land sold for this particular war tax.

Virginia is the only state that has state tax lists. These began in 1782. Tax lists of any kind from South Carolina are very rare.

If the assessor went from house to house, this is a break. Often relationships can be established when this happened. Sometimes people had to go to a central point to pay taxes. This never proved very satisfactory, as western North Carolinians objected strongly to travelling the distance from their homes to the provincial capital at New Bern. As a result a lot of taxes went unpaid. A disputed territory between Virginia and Pennsylvania provided taxpayers a chance to choose the colony with the lowest taxes.

Look for a separate list of delinquents and insolvents. These lists often indicate when someone has died. Some tax lists include an Alterations section, which include changes in title of land involved.

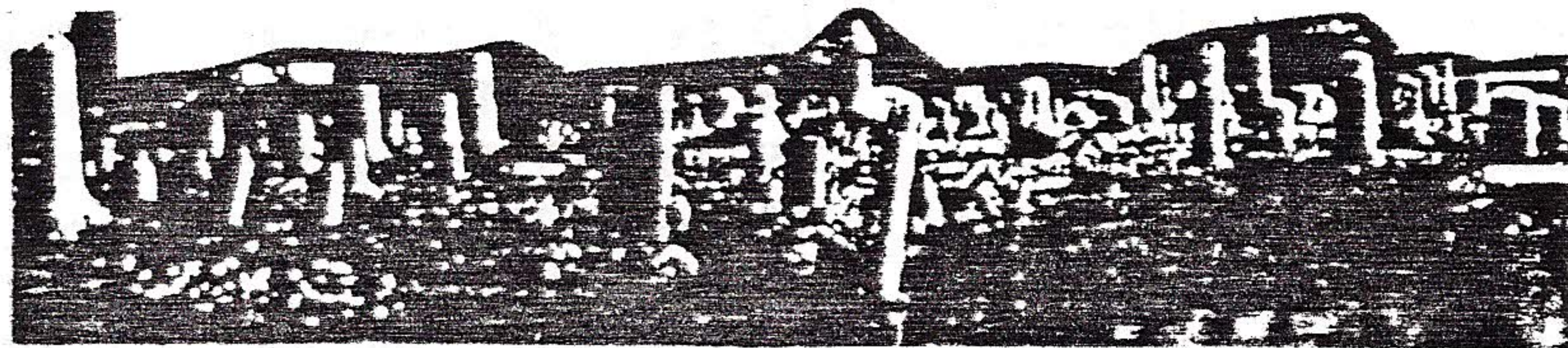
Exemptions to taxes were granted and these lists are valuable. Those who got exemptions included widows with small incomes, ministers, teachers, the aged and infirm, some public officials and military veterans.

Since the 1790-1840 censuses listed only heads of households, tax lists may include people not named in the census.

The State of Georgia tax lists of 1851 also give the number of people subject to military duty. The 1854 lists give the number of children between 8 and 16 years of age.

Remember to study tax records for several years before and after your person of interest. Don't assume when a name disappears the person has moved. Make note of every person in the district of your surname.

SAN FRANCISCO CEMETERIES. The Yuba City CA genealogical bulletin gives a history of the cemeteries in San Francisco. "Up to 1850 vacant lots were used to bury bodies or they were left on the beach or under a bush. As the city grew, however, cemeteries that had been established were eventually vacated, one by one.

Golden Gate Park had been a cemetery, but by 1909 the city decided to make the land a park. "Mausoleums and tombstones were removed and dumped down a convenient ravine at Land's End. Those bodies not removed were carpeted with the Lincoln Park Golf Course."

By 1914, city supervisors ordered ALL bodies out of the city. The University of San Francisco was built over the Masonic Cemetery, and Calvary and Laurel Hill which had been located three miles west of the city originally reverted to sand and scrub, as neither had an income. (The Editor remembers tromping over the sand dunes of Laurel Hill in the late 1930's.)

By 1937 supervisors again demanded bodies be evacuated and the voters upheld the decision. Exhumation stopped because of World War II. By 1948 the task was completed and Charles Harvey, a contractor who later built Candlestick Park, was paid 80 cents a ton to dump walls, crypts, and markers into the Bay. "Other smashed tombstones made fine retaining walls in Buena Vista park. Calvary Cemetery was covered by the Sears Building, a Kaiser hospital, and housing. Laurel Hill Cemetery was covered by more housing, a shopping center, and the Fireman's Fund Building". (Maybe this desecration explains why San Francisco has "gone to hell in a handbasket" since World War II.)

Only two small cemeteries remain--at Mission Dolores and the Presidio.
