SWEDISH RESEARCH. Articles on Swedish research often recommend writing to the individual archives of each province in Sweden. Just send two International Reply Coupons. If you can furnish names, dates and parish one would think this would bring some data. Don't believe it! At least not in Lund. Their answer is a printed list of fees; minimum charge: S20. This may not hold true elsewhere in Sweden.

RESEARCHING TAX RECORDS (conclusion)

(Continuation of an article on tax records in August issue.)
When the name you are researching disappears from the tax list, check the list of delinquents as well as land sales and powers of attorney, which indicate the possibility of a move out of the area. Check probate records for death, and the possibility that a relative is picking up the taxes. Sometimes a search of the entire county is needed to find the name of an executor or administrator.

Poll tax lists should be researched even though they are of limited help. These lists give the taxpayer's name and often just the number of polls paid. This would be so many white males and so many blacks. The distinction between black and white was not always noted, however. Only black females were taxed, not white.

Age limits for paying poll taxes shifted through the years. During the colonial period North Carolinans paid poll taxes starting at age 16, changed to 21 after the Revolution, and exempted men over 50 from 1801 on. Taxable ages for slaves and free blacks were not the same as for whites. After the Civil War, all males between 21 and 50 paid poll taxes.

Real Property Taxes are extremely valuable. They give the acreage, description of the land and amounts due. The land was often described with respect to neighbors and water courses. Sometimes the description gives the name of the person to whom the land was originally granted.

Real property descriptions enable one to pinpoint the property in a definite location which can later be used for locating cemeteries. Also real property lists can lead to location of deeds.

In conclusion, tax records are often difficult to locate. The oldest records can sometimes be found in the state archives. The Pennsylvania Archives carry some early tax records. The Family History Center in Salt Lake City has microfilmed early tax records for many states which may be rented at local LDS libraries. The Virginia State Library and the Maryland Hall of Records also participate in interlibrary loan programs.

NORWEGIAN MICROFILM. The Olympia gen soc bulletin says you can borrow microfilm of Norwegian records for one month for S5 plus postage from the Vesterheim Gen. Center, Norwegian American Museum, Decorah IA 52101. When you write say hello to Fran Jeffers who has moved to Decorah and may just be working at the Museum.



MISS THE AUGUST MEETING? Kathleen Johnson, president of the Washington State Gen. Society presented an interesting talk at the August meeting of PSGS. According to Mrs. Johnson four of the saddest statements in genealogy are:

- (1) If I had just asked. OR Why didn't I listen?
- (2) We don't spell our name that way.
- (3) I don't want to get involved with history and geography -- just genealogy. and
- (4) I don't want to bother with collateral lines (brothers and sisters of your direct line).

(Allied lines, incidentally, are the people who married your collateral lines.)

Other tips: Don't send for the will; send for the probate package. Seattle Public Library has a dandy surname file.

MISS THE OCTOBER MEETING? Persis Shook, editor of the Tacoma-Pierce gen soc's bulletin, The Researcher, spoke on Migration Trails at the meeting held in Belfair. She recommended Dollarhide and Thorndale's map book which contains every state map from 1790 to 1910. Among other interesting items:

The Suzzallo library at the University of Washington in Seattle is one of two libraries on the West Coast that has the entire Pennsylvania Archives. The key to solving Suzzallo's curious indexing system is arrangement by "historical eras." Go to Suzzallo during the months when the university is in session; and go on Sunday! Philadelphia was the largest port of immigration until the Revolution.

IRISH HISTORY SOCIETY. A new address for the Irish Family History Society is PO Box 36, NAAS, County Kildare, Ireland.

AMERICAN-FRENCH GENEALOGY. Persons with French ancestry may be interested in the American-French Genealogical Society, PO Box 2113, Pawtucket RI 02861. The group, which publishes a twice-a-year journal, Je Me Souviens, was chartered in 1978 and specializes in French-Canadian research.

ACCIDENT REPORT. A study of old newspapers would indicate that as many people were injured and killed by runaway and spooked horses as are killed and injured in automobile accidents today. The Weekly Kansas Chief from Doniphan County KS (1872-1875) carries these items:

"Yesterday evening at Winthrop, across the Missouri River from Atchison, Mr. Charles McNary was in Winthrop with his team and wagon for a load of wood. The day was stormy and McNary stopped at Winthrop to get warm, and when he got back on the wagon his team began to run and struck a telephone pole, throwing McNary to the ground, some pieces of the wagon striking him at the same time, killing him instantly."

"Col. F.M. Keith ... returning from White Cloud, with a wagon and team, he got down to open a gate; as he was shutting the gate, the horses ran, he siezed the reins and was thrown down, the wheels of the wagon passed over his shoulders, chest and side, breaking several ribs and bruising him badly."

"Friday, a son of Mr. Adler ... was working with a team when the horses started at full speed. The boy clung to the tongue of the wagon, finally let go and the horses passed over him. A severe gash in his head, and badly bruised but no broken bones."

"The other day, Dr. De Luce's horses ran away and demolished the buggy."

"Mr. Charles Matheny ... was returning from Atchison when his team became scared and ran at top speed, throwing Charles from the wagon, sustaining severe injuries."

"John Vorhes met with a severe accident Monday, by which his leg was broken and ankle badly sprained. He was mounting one of the store horses at his residence when the animal started and in attempting to free his foot from the stirrup the accident happened."

"Mr. D. Rippey met an accident last Friday in which he came near losing his life. He had been to Atchison and bought an extra wagon and team, was almost home, when passing thru the gate at his farm, the team started; he made an attempt to get the lines, and that is about all that is known until his team was found tangled up and no one about. Mr. Rippey was found entirely insensible."

"Mr. Albert Pawls was struck by a horse's forefoot, then stomped on, inflicting injuries causing his death the next day."

"A dispatch from Atchison: James Bell, son of F.M. Bell, of this vicinity was killed at Atchison when his horse fell. Bell's neck was broken and his horse badly crippled."

"George Camp of East Norway was severely injured on Monday last, by his team running away. Dr. Raines attending him."

"Mr. James Haft met with an accident. He was thrown from his horse, and his wrist was dislocated."

"The team of Cornelius Culp, about 4 miles S. E. of Troy, ran away, throwing Mr. Culp and his wife out of the wagon, breaking his leg and his wife's arm."

"L.C. Preston met with a sad accident Saturday while returning from a picnic at Severance. He was in a carriage with three others when the horses become frightened, turned a corner suddenly, Mr. Preston was thrown to the ground, his right leg broken, both bones below the knee."



WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU ARE AT A DEAD END IN YOUR RESEARCH!

Researching your family history can be interesting, fun, time consuming and once in a while very aggravating when you come to what seems a dead end. At this point it may be necessary for you to stand back and go back over the research you have done to get to the standstill point.

Have you sent for every civil record that is available to you? Sometimes the information on a death record could be wrong, try to locate an obituary or cemetery record. Birth or marriage will often confirm place of residency and how the surname was spelled at that

particular time period.

Have you checked all the various indexes: The A.I.S. (Accelerated Index System); I.G.I.

(International Genealogical Index); Census; Soundex; etc.?

Have you tried to locate a county history, a same surname family history book which may give you a clue, or the F.H.L.C. (Family History Library Catalog) at an L.D.S. Family History Center?

Have you checked the Family Registry surname files at the L.D.S. Family History Center? Have you written to the State Archives, local genealogical society or the historical society to find what new sources have been published lately or others searching your same surname?

Have you placed an inquiry in a national magazine such as the Genealogical Helper or

through a family name newsletter?

If you have done all of the above and are still at a standstill, then you may wish to

consider hiring a professional genealogist.

There are a number of organizations which qualify and recommend researchers. They publish lists annually, giving the special interests of each of their researchers. You will have to write to the researcher to find the cost and what suggestions they may have in solving your problem.

Board of Certification of Genealogists, PO Box 19165, Washington, DC 20036. They classify researchers into Certified Genealogist who will conduct all areas of research on your family history. A Certified Genealogical Record Searcher will research various records for you, but is not certified to construct a pedigree or prepare a family history. A Certified American Lineage Specialist will prepare a single line of descent. A Certified American Lineage Specialist will research specific records such as tribal records, etc. More information on these researchers can be obtained from the above address.

The Association of Professional Genealogists offers a booklet on How to Hire a Professional Genealogist. They also publish listings of their qualified researchers.

The L.D.S. Family History Library, 35 North West Temple, Salt Lake City will send you

a list of their accredited researchers.

International Genealogical Consumer Organization, 4529 South Stafford Way, West Valley

City, UT 84119 also has lists of their registered genealogists.

Any of the above genealogists will be able to help you. If you have problems with your

researcher for any reason, the organization will investigate the problem.

As with any group, there are some "rip-off" artists at work in genealogy. Beware of questionable family history books which are advertised by postcard with the come-on "Your name is here." Yes, but often it is only because you are listed in the phone directories that your name is in that book. Beatrice Bayley and Sharon L. Taylor are two publishers which consumers should be very wary of purchasing their family history books.

CIVIL WAR SOLDIERS INDEX. A plan to create a computerized index of all persons who participated in the Civil War was announced in September by the Federation of Genealogical Societies. The National Archives will provide copies of the records, which will include name, state from which served, regiment, company, rank in and out, and other identifying information, plus microfilm reference numbers for retrieving or ordering additional data.

The National Park Service will provide overall direction, plus data entry computers in the National Archives Regional Branches, and operating supplies. The Genealogical Society of Utah will provide indexing computer software, and will process the completed index. The Federation will ensure that the data entry function is completed. FGS will also recruit and oversee the volunteers who will enter the data.

CIVIL WAR ANCESTOR? The National Park Service is now compiling a directory of the 3.5 million Civil War participants, as noted above, but will also have the computerized list accessible at visitor centers at Civil War battlefields. A total of 28 sites are expected to provide this data, starting this fall at Shiloh National Military Park in Tennessee and Antietam National Battlefield in Sharpsburg MD.
