DID YOU MISS THE MARCH MEETING? Bill Richardson presented an interesting account of his cross-country genealogical research tour. Among his tips: Virginia courthouses are now featuring "enhanced" copies of their records, much easier to read than ever before. There are eight cities in VA that are completely independent of the county they are located in. Will packets for VA are located in Richmond now. He found VA court entry books to be very helpful. When reading tombstones, Bill suggests using de-scented shaving cream and a squeegee.

SIDNEY HOTEL. The Bremerton Sun and the Port Orchard Independent have so far chosen to ignore the new Sidney "Hotel" in Port Orchard, so Family Backtracking is drawing your attention to this delightful new building. It is on the same site as the old Sidney Hotel which was burned by vandals several years ago. The building is devoted to offices now, but has a tower and in many ways resembles the old building.

REVOLUTIONARY PENSION FILES. National Archives film M-804 features pages from old Bibles, birth, marriage and death dates torn from old account books and notations of family events scribbled on scraps of paper, the Tacoma-Pierce GS bulletin says. They are worth reading just for pleasure, if not for profit. These records are located at Sand Point in Seattle.

Glossary of old terms etc. from
Delaware County's "War Papers"
by Houck, Garti and Riddell

appoplexy--sudden loss of the power to move, feel, or think, caused by an injury to the brain when a blood vessel breaks or is blocked (as by a clot); often called a stroke

auger--a tool for boring holes in wood

axe eye--actually the hole in the head of an axe where the handle fits; probably means the whole head in this case

beetle--a heavy wooden mallet for driving iron wedges into wood when splitting it

bil(l)ious complaint--suffering from some trouble with the bile or liver

brace and bit(t)s--tool for boring holes, consisting of a drill (bit) fitted into a revolving handle (brace)

breach--a broken, ruptured or torn condition in an area

broad axe--an ax with a short bent handle and with a large, squarish head used for hewing round logs into square beams

chattels--movable possessions

staple and ring--the ring would be attached to a wall by being fastened with the staple; used for tying animals to a wall or manger

steel yards--a scale for weighing. It has unequal arms, the longer one having a movable weight and the shorter one a hook for holding the object being weighed.

clevis and bolt--a U-shaped piece of metal with a bolt or pin through the ends

consumption--a wasting disease of the lungs or some other part of the body, tuberculosis of the lungs

Continental Establishment--the regular military force of the colonies in the Revolutionary War

conversion of pounds (l) to dollars (\$)--1l was worth about \$4.866. 1l = 20 shillings = 240 pence.

cooper--barrel or cask maker

cooper's adz--a tool with a handle 5 to 11 inches long and a blade at right angles to it for hewing on barrel staves

corn-riddles--coarse sieves made of corn husks

sheaf--a bound bundle of grain

shuttle--instrument that carries the thread from one side of the web to the other in weaving

skimmer--a long-handled shallow ladle, full of holes, used in skimming liquids

snath--curved handle for a scythe blade, had two small handles (nibs) for the hands; usually made of willow (also called a snid or sneath)

spider--a frying pan with a handle

aa--an abbreviation used in that part of a record, pleading, or affidavit, called the "statement of venue." Commonly translated at "to wit."

cradle--frame attached to a scythe for laying grain evenly as it is cut; a cradle scythe

crane--a swinging metal arm in a fireplace, used to hold a kettle over the fire

crossboards--props used for cutting logs

croup--inflammation or diseased condition of the throat and windpipe characterized by a hoarse cough and difficult breathing

cutter--a small, light sleigh; usually pulled by one horse

deponent--one who testifies under oath in writing; one who makes a deposition (sworn written statement)

die (dye) tub--tub for dyeing cloth

do.--ditto, also

tinker--a man who mends pots, pans, etc.

to wit)towit)--that is to say; namely

trace--chains by which an animal pulls a wagon, carriage, etc.

drawing knife--used to taper the sides of shingles, rough size edges of floor boards, rough-trim paneling before planing; used to fashion rake, axe, and other tool handles; to make stool legs, ox yokes, pump handles, wheel spokes. It was a knife with two handles so it could be drawn toward the worker, usually about 6 inches wide.

dray--a low, strong cart for hauling heavy loads

dropsy--fluid retention

fanning mill--used for winnowing (separating) chaff from grain

fie (fee)--right to keep and use land by performing certain services; from medieval fief system

flax hatchet--a hatchet used to break up the flax fibers so they could be made into thread

froe--a knife-like wedge used to split shingles, laths, staves, and clapboards, struck with a short maul called a froe-club. A curved froe split barrel staves.

gaol--jail

gimlet--a small tool with a screw point, for boring small holes

gravel--small, hard substances formed in the bladder and kidneys; granular, sandlike

griddile--griddle

grid iron--a cooking utensil consisting of a framework of parallel iron bars or wires, usually with a handle. It is used to hold meat, fish, etc. for broiling over an open fire in a fireplace.

harrow--a heavy frame with iron teeth or vertical disks used to break up sods in a plowed field or to cover seeds

hay knife--a heavy, wide-bladed knife used for cutting sections of hay from a haystack

hetchel--probably means hatchet

hh or hogshead--a large barrel containing 100-140 gallons

instant--of the present month; "The 6th instant" meaning the 6th of the present month

trammel--hook on a fireplace to hold pots, kettles, etc. over the fire

turner--person who forms or shapes things of wood on a lathe

vendue--public sale or auction

joiner--a skilled workman who makes woodwork and furniture

jointure--probably meaning a cooper's long jointer, which was a plane about 5 to 6 feet long. It was placed upside down on a pair of legs. The cooper planed the sides of the staves before joining them.

kealer--(dialectic) meaning a cooler, from the verb meaning to cool

mill (w)right--a builder of mills

milt--concerning to spleen

noncomposmentus--mentally unable to manage one's affairs

parol--oral, by word of mouth

pereshed (paresis)--an incomplete paralysis that affects the ability to move, but not the ability to feel

phthisic--having tuberculosis of the lungs; being consumptive, tubercular

pleurisy--inflammation of the thin membrane covering the lungs and lining the chest

portmanteau--a stiff, oblong traveling bag with two compartments opening like a book

reed--device on a loom resembling a comb and used to space warps yarns evenly

reel--frame turning on its axis; windlass; spool or bobbin for sewing thread (chiefly British)

rod--measure of length, $5\frac{1}{2}$ yards or $16\frac{1}{2}$ feet; a square rod is $30\frac{1}{4}$ sq. yards or $272\frac{1}{4}$ sq. feet

rood--40 square rods; one fourth of an acre

salt rheum--watery discharge, such as mucous, tears, saliva; usually from the eyes or nose (archaic--tears)

scythe--a long, slightly curved blade on a handle used for cutting grass for hay

shaving knife--(Beamer or head knife)--a flat, soft steel blade with its fine edge recurved in a minute scraper form. Used by a currier to scrape and soften tanned hides.
