

NEW AT THE KITSAP REGIONAL LIBRARY:

The Scandinavian Presence in North America -- edited by Erik J. Friis, Harpers Magazine Press, New York 1976. For you Scandinavian researchers, here is a good background book for information on Swedish, Norwegian, Danish and Finnish churches in America, brotherhoods and fraternal organizations such as the Sons of Norway, Danish Brotherhood, Finlandia Foundation and the Swedish Vasa Order, etc.; plus, a section on special interest societies. Kings Mountain Men -- Hank Messick, Little, Brown & Co., Boston, 1976. Here is a very readable, but, unfortunately, unindexed, background book for the Revolutionary War in the South. It is basically a vivid and colorful account of one of the most crucial battles of the American Revolution, October 7, 1780. This interesting anthology deals with the five major groups of frontiersmen in Central Washington prior to 1880: Fur Traders, Missionaries, Soldiers, Miners, and Open-Range Cattlemen. TITLES IN EARLY AMERICA

- Mr. and Mrs. - in 17th century these were used for persons of social position. Others were "good man" and the wife "goode, goody or good woman".
- Servant - didn't imply lower class, refers to any type of service.
- Brother or Sister - could refer to a blood brother or sister; or the spouse of same.
- in the early puritan period it was hard to determine if a brother was blood or in the church.
- In-Law - implies a kinship through marriage rather than through blood connections; although mother-in-law may mean step mother and the same for father-in-law, son-in-law and daughter-in-law.
- Cousin - applies loosely to almost any type of relationship besides the immediate family circle. Used most to denote nephew or niece. Also, to a first cousin or more distant one. Or to the spouse of a blood relative. Sometimes to no connection of the family at all.
- Nephew - prior to 1750, latin for grandson; could be both sexes.

FAMILY GROUP NAMES IN EARLY AMERICA

When you are researching and discover your ancestor is one of the following examples, keep a lookout for its "pair", for in early America they often used these groups; the same as are in the Bible.

**Benjamin or Benoni were often given to a son whose mother died at his childbirth. Benoni means "son of my sorrow".

SCHOOL DAYS, SCHOOL DAYS, GOOD OLD GOLDEN RULE DAYS

When you consider that in 1974 the literacy rate of the U.S. was 99%,¹ and that, with a fairly decent attendance record, a student spends about 2,160 days of his life attending school (exclusive of kindergarten or college!), you might² find the following newspaper report from around the turn of the century² interesting:

The United States began the nineteenth century with an average of 82 days of schooling for each person. They begin the twentieth century with an average of 998 days of schooling for each person. The rate of increase is shown by the following figures taken from the report of the United States Commissioner of education: Beginning with 82 days in 1800, the rate had increased to 238 days in 1840; 420 days in 1850; 430 days in 1860; 672 days in 1870; 792 days in 1880; 892 days in 1890; 998 days in 1900; The estimate includes instruction in the common schools and colleges. The average for the eleven Southern states in 1900 was 433, or about the same as that for the whole country in 1860.

Guess this explains why we sometimes mutter under our breathe as we try to make out the "vital clue" hidden in some nearly undecipherable scrawl on a census, will or deed. Reading and writing is hard enough to learn, but when you have only a few days of formal education it's a whole lot harder!
