At Kitsap Regional Library:

CENTRAL SERIALS RECORD, 2nd Edition, University of Washington Libraries, Serials Division, 1973. This large book contains approximately 43,000 entries of periodicals and other serial publications which are available at the University of Washington Libraries. If you are not familiar with the holdings of the University, you will probably be amazed at the diversity of genealogical material available there in the form of periodicals, newspapers and city directories. This book (available upon request at the information desk) is an alphabetical index, showing the call number of the periodical, in which of the University's several libraries it is shelved, and the years covered. Although this edition of Central Serials Record is several years old, it can be a valuable tool for you in your research. Because many of us tend to overlook the University in our searching, I want to list just a very few of the periodicals you might find useful: Genealogical Periodical Index (beginning with volume 1); William and Mary Quarterly (beginning with volume 1, 1892, through 1968+. This is one of the periodicals indexed in Swem's index at the Seattle Library); Arkansas Historical Quarterly; Kentucky Historical Quarterly; New York Historical Quarterly; New England Historical and Genealogical Register; Tennessee Historical Quarterly; Daughters of the American Revolution Magazine; and many, many more. Make the University of Washington part of your research calendar!!

From Southern Historical Press, P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640:

AN INDEX TO THE DEEDS OF THE PROVINCE AND STATE OF S.C., 1719-1785 AND CHARLESTON DISTRICT, 1785-1800; \$35.00. This is an index of EVERY deed in the State of South Carolina from 1719 to 1785! This book is rather expensive unless your genealogy budget is bigger than mine, but for South Carolina researchers it is important to be aware of new publications such as this one.

JOHN H. NIBBE -- EARLY PORT ORCHARD PIONEER

The following is the obituary of John H. Nibbe, an early resident of the Port Orchard and Bremerton-Charleston areas of Kitsap County, who died June 15, 1902, and is taken from the June 21, 1902, BREMERTON NEWS.

A Pioneer Passes Away.

On last Sunday at 12 o'clock noon occurred the death of John H. Nibbe, a pioneer of Port Orchard bay and a highly esteemed citizen of our town. His illness was brief and his death occuring so suddenly made it difficult to realize that a friend and comrade had passed to his eternal rest, and that the familiar and jovial face of "Jack" Nibbe would be seen no more. On Tuesday he was about town in his usual robust health. Wednesday morning, feeling somewhat indisposed, he lay down. He became worse, however, and a doctor was called who pronounced his case Brights disease. Everything was done to relieve the sufferings of the patient but he grew gradually weaker. It was soon evident that he could not survive and at noon of the Lord's day he departed the trials of this life. The funeral was conducted Monday afternoon from the Methodist Episcopal church under the auspices of the Woodmen of the World of which order deceased was a member, with G.A.R. guard of honor. Rev. Geo. Arney preached the funeral sermon. Interment took place in the Charleston-Bremerton cemetery, the funeral services of the Woodmen of the World and the G.A.R. being given. A widow and three children mourn the loss of a loving husband and father.

John H. Nibbe was born in Hamburg, Germany, Nov. 25, 1847. When about fourteen years of age he went to sea, landed in the United States and when barely of age enlisted in the U.S. army and later in the navy. As quartermaster of the U.S.S. Petrel, captured in the Yazoo river, April 22, 1864, he displayed great courage. A shot came through the stern of the vessel, raking the gun deck, and exploding the boilers. Quartermaster Nibbe stood his ground on this occasion and aided the wounded, when officers and others around him deserted their posts. For this gallant and meritorious conduct he received from Gideon Welles, then secretary of the navy, a medal of honor on which was engraved:

> Personal Valor JOHN H. NIBBE Quartermaster U.S.S. PETREL

Yazoo River April 22 1864

He received his discharge on January 12, 1865, but continued to follow the sea and a year or two later located in California. About the year 1867 he came to Puget Sound and worked at different places at logging and later at steamboating. A year or two later he took a homestead on Port Orchard bay near what is now known as Crystal Springs, where for several years he conducted a general store and postoffice, the place being called Nibbeville. On June 0, 1885, he was married to Mrs. Georgiana Porter. In 1887 he moved with his family to Mitchell's point just below Sidney and conducted a general store and the Mitchell

postoffice, but a year later moved his stock of goods to Sidney. In 1896 he came to Bremerton and established a general merchandise business in the building now occupied by Glenn R. Fetterman & Co., druggists. This was the first store in Bremerton and there were probably less than a dozen other buildings in the town. He continued in this business until a few months ago. On July 29, 1898, he received his commisssion as postmaster and served until about a year ago. At the time of his death he was out of active business and enjoying a rest earned by years of hard and faithful work.

THE FIRST HISTORY OF KITSAP COUNTY

Hundreds of Kitsap County family histories are included in the forthcoming history of the county which is available between now and June 1 for the pre-publication price of \$22.50. Area editors consider the history a "people" book with the emphasis on the families rather than lengthy narratives on the formation of the county and towns.

The book, at least 600 pages, is 8 1/2 x 11, hard cover and delves into those histories of families arriving between 1880 and 1910. Where possible, births, deaths, marriages are recorded with their places and dates, plus a history of each family before they came to Kitsap and after arrival.

The book (\$23.65 includes tax) can be ordered by sending a check made payable to Kitsap County Historical Society, Book Committee, P.O. Box 572, Bremerton, WA 98310. After June 1, the cost will be \$31.53 including tax. Delivery will be in late summer.

DIFFERENT FROM NOWADAYS By Mark Hester

"For first marriages the average male married at 26 years, the average female at 22 years, and the average family ran 3 generations to a century.

Females seldom married younger than 14 years and males than 16 years.

Females seldom gave birth before 14 years or after 50 years, males before 16 years or after 70 years.

A mother seldom gave birth over a period longer than 35 years. Children in the average family were born 2 years apart and when this time spread varied from the average of 2 years in a family, the spread was usually consistent between each of the children, except the last one or two.

Both males and females seldom lived beyond the age of 90 years."
