DIFFERENT FROM NOWADAYS by Mark Hester

SURNAMES

The period following the Norman Conquest of England in 1066 was marked by another innovation, the adoption of the use of surnames. The development of surnames was a practical necessity. With the widening of interests, from interests involving only a local community to interests involving a whole country, and in our own day, to a considerable extent, the whole world, new means of distinguishing names have become more and more indispensable.

The first source of surnames are suffixes. Among the Scandinavian peoples the suffix is - son, Olson (Olaf & son), Anderson (Andrew's son). Among the Scotch and Irish it is - mac, MacDonald. Among the English it is - fitz, like in Fitzgerald, or Fitzsimmons, meaning the son's of.

The second source of surnames is from the country or locality with which a man is associated. Scott is said to be an English name applied to a Scotchman. Champneys is a name applied to a native of Champagne. Other names of this kind are Brett-Britton (native of Brittany), Picard-Power (Picardy), Loring (Lorraine), Bullen (Boulogne), Blass (Blois), Loving (Lou Vain), Sessions (Soissons), Turney (Tournay).

A third principle source of modern surnames is to be found in names of occupation. The number of names from this source is even greater than appears at first sight. There are Smith, Butcher, Carpenter, Miller, Taylor and their like, now applied utterly without relation to occupation, but forming the most widely used type of surname.

A fourth general source of surnames is to be found in nicknames. The word nickname itself, from earlier "an eke name" originally being the equivalent of surname. Features of dress are expressed by Capron (hood), Burden (staff), Motley (fool's costume).

Many of the names of Celtic origin are interesting because the original meaning is so completely lost sight of, as in the Welsh Gough and Roe, both meaning "red", Bain, Wynne and Gwyne all meaning "white", Glass, Lloyd and Floyd meaning "gray", Sayee is "Saxon", and the Irish Kennedy is "Ugly Head". In many cases the foreign name is traslated Schumacher-Shoemaker; Neuman-Newman, Schuartz-Black. Surely the ends of the earth are brought together in the words that form the American surnames. NAVY YARD POST #110 G.A.R.

The Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.) was an American patriotic organization, consisting of United States armed forces veterans of the Civil War. The G.A.R. admitted any member of the United States Army, Navy, or Marine Corps who had served between April 12, 1861, and April 9, 1865, and had been honorably discharged, and also members of State regiments who had been called into service. The organization was founded for the commemoration of dead comrades and the practice of fraternity and mutual assistance. The organization was responsible for passage of the Disability Act of 1890, which doubled the pension roll; it also established old soldiers' homes, and provided care and education for soldiers' orphans.

On March 23, 1902, a meeting was held in Bremerton for the purpose of organizing a local chapter of the G.A.R. The following Civil War veterans were present: W. J. Galbraith, A. D. Hartman, J. R. Bell, J. H. Nibbe, Warren Smith, F. E. Dennel, B. F. Whitaker, M. R. Brewster, G. W. Sutton, A. W. Peterson, Thomas Buckley, T. F. Mahan, Phil. A. Wood, Charles Anderson, M. Coltenbaugh, Chas. Draper, Cyrus Thomas, C. D. Benson, M. McFarland, and M. V. Hartwell.

On March 30, 1902, a second organizational meeting was held and the following veterans were added to the roll: A. W. Stiles, H. R. Gale, H. Brintnell, A. F. Haynes and M. E. Johnson.

The first officers of Navy Yard Post #110, G.A.R. were:

The organization of the post was completed on April 3, 1902, with the installation of the officers.

PORT MADISON CEMETERY INSCRIPTIONS

transcribed by Brian Roberts, February 1977

Kane Cemetery at Port Madison is the oldest cemetery on Bainbridge Island. The oldest stone is dated 1867, and there are a number of unmarked graves that could be even older. Although the property is owned by the Free and Accepted Masons, it is a resting place for people of many different associations, religions, and races. The manager is Robert B. Ross of 9638 N.E. Lafayette, Port Madison, a member of the Kitsap County Historical Society who knows a great deal about island history. Several generations of Mr. Ross's own ancestors are buried in the cemetery.

On the next page is a diagram of the cemetery, excluding the part that has

not yet been used. The rows and columns are labeled to help in finding the approximate physical location of the stones listed alphabetically below. U3, for instance, means that a grave is in column U, row 3, in the northeast part of the map area.
