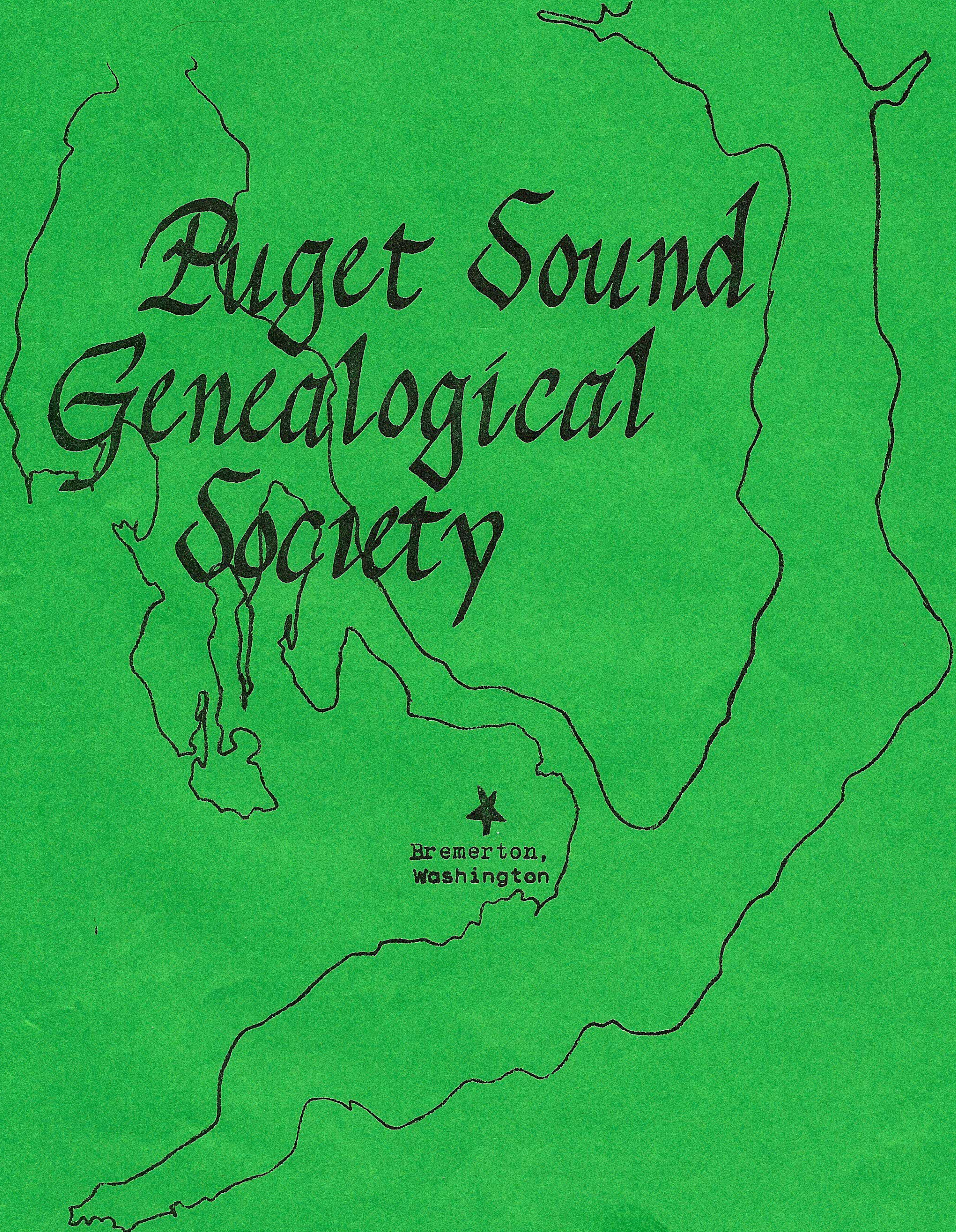

THE BOOK NOOK

by Sharon Raney Streitt

ON THE SHELF AT PUGET SOUND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY LIBRARY:

The U.S. Census Compendium -- John D. Stemmons, 144 pages. This directory includes census records available, both federal and state, generally by county and year. In addition, it lists other records which can be used in place of a census. . . and there are many! Shelf No. CEN 3.

San Francisco Ship Passenger Lists, Volume 1 (1965) reprinted 1978 -- Louis J. Rasmussen. Unfortunately, the official San Francisco port records were destroyed by fire, among them the ship passenger lists; however, Mr. Rasmussen has undertaken the reconstruction of the San Francisco passenger arrivals from newspapers and journals. This book is a reprint of the first volume in a series (four volumes have been printed so far) dealing with passengers arriving between 1850 and 1875. Volume 1 contains a selection of passenger lists to 1864, listing about 13,500 persons. Each passenger list gives the following information: name of ship, type of ship, port of embarkation, date of arrival, name of captain, description of cargo, notes concerning the passage including date of departure, ports of call, length of voyage, and names of passengers who died enroute, with their places of residence and date of death. The passenger lists sometimes identify accompanying family members. Shelf No. SPL 2.

North and South Carolina Marriage Records, From the Earliest Days to the Civil War. Comp. by William M. Clemens. Almost 15,000 marriages are listed alphabetically by surname, including the maiden names of brides. The full date and the place where the marriage took place is also given. Shelf No. NC 2/SC 1

State Census of North Carolina, 1784-1787 -- Mrs. Alvaretta Kenan Register. A forerunner of the Federal censuses of 1790, the North Carolina State Census of 1784-1787 is of more than usual importance, because during this time period there was a considerable shift in population and some individuals identified in this census are identified in the 1790 census of other states. There are 14,000 heads of households listed with an enumeration of individuals in each household by age, sex and race. Shelf No. NC 2.

Kentucky 1810 Federal Census -- Accelerated Indexing Systems. Computerized listing of 54,000 heads of households. Volume also includes maps and background information. Shelf No. KEN 1.

Passengers to America: A Consolidation of Ship Passenger Lists from the New England Historical and Genealogical Register. Ed. Michael Tepper. 554 pages; indexed. Shelf No. SPL 3.

Early Texas Birth Records 1838-1878, Volume II. Compiled by Gracy, Sumner and Gentry. Shelf No. TEX 1.

DIFFERENT FROM NOWADAYS

The Puritans in America

In Puritan New England the church and state long remained linked. The Puritans left England because their opposition to the elaborate rituals and centralized control of the Anglican Church had aroused official wrath. In the Massachusetts Bay Colony they strove to create a Bible commonwealth, a spotless "city set upon a hill" in which only the orthodox might live.

Safely ashore, the once persecuted Puritans became persecutors to others. Anyone willing to tolerate another's faith, wrote pastor Nathaniel Ward, "either doubts his own, or is not sincere in it." The Puritans lived in fear that their colony would be undermined from within, and they established a modified theocracy in which only propertied church members were allowed to vote. By 1640 some 3,000 Puritans controlled the destinies of 15,000 voteless fellow citizens.

Dissenters were harshly dealt with. Quakers were condemned as a "cursed sect of hereticks." Quakers who dared enter Massachusetts were imprisoned, flogged, or otherwise abused and six were hanged. The New England Colonies banned Roman Catholic worship until 1783.

The Church had very strict codes. Church attendance was compulsory for all and no one was permitted to doze during the three hour sermons. The standard of dress was of basic black and white linings. Householders were encouraged to spy on their neighbors and report breaches of discipline to the church elders.

The Puritan blue laws may have reached their zenith in 1656 when a Boston mariner spent two humiliating hours in the stocks for his "lewd and unseemly behavior" in daring "publiquely" to kiss his wife on Sunday when he arrived home after a three year absence at sea.

The witch trials of Salem are another story altogether. I will write about that in the next issue. "Anyone willing to tolerate another's faith either doubts his own, or is not sincere in it."
