DIFFERENT FROM NOWADAYS

The ERA is a driving force in the United States today for the equality of all Americans. In the years past, it was the civil rights movement and, before that, the amendment which gave the vote to women. What about before this time? In looking up laws of the 1907 era, I have found the following on the divorce, property rights of women, and exemption laws of Washington State.

Property Rights of Women, 1907 - Washington State: "The property owned before marriage by husband or wife, and all acquired afterwards by gift, devise, or descent to either, is separate property. All otherwise acquired is common property, subject to control of the husband. He also controls the separate property of the wife, but cannot sell or convey it without her joining in the deed. To save the separate property of the wife from attachment for husband's debts, there must be an inventory of it on record."

Exemption Laws, 1907 - Washington State: "Homestead to the value of \$1,000; clothing, books, bedding and household goods, to value of \$1,500; one small boat to value of \$50; two cows, five hogs, bees, poultry, fuel, and provisions. To a farmer, two horses or two yoke of oxen, and farming implements to value of \$200. To professional man, library worth \$500, office furniture, and fuel. To lighterman, his boats, to value to \$250. To drayman, his team."

Divorce laws, 1907 - Washington State: "Divorce may be granted for violation of the marriage vow, physical incapacity, willful desertion one year, conviction for felony, cruelty, fraud and fraudulent contract, indignities as render life burdensome, insanity lasting ten years."

FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES -- SPECIAL BOOK REVIEW

THE FAMILY HERITAGE BOOK published by Beatrice Bayley, Box 55, Springfield Road, Sterling, PA 18463. Approximately 100 pages, including an introduction by Beatrice Bayley.

This book was purchased as being on a specific family name. The first 80 pages contain no reference to the name ordered. Of these 80 pages, there are three blank pages and seventeen pages of blank charts to be filled in by the purchaser. Of the remaining about 20 pages, there is included a Family Heritage Certificate which states that the purchaser is the owner of this XYZ Family Heritage Book. The remaining pages are names of persons with the same XYZ surname and their addresses. There is no indication of who these names are, or from where they have been assembled. Nor is there any indication that these names bear any relationship to the purchaser. It may be assumed that the purchaser will have to write to each of these 181 names to determine whether there is any family connection. Unless some of these 181 persons have taken an interest in genealogy, it is unlikely that they will be able to assist the purchaser. The book retails for \$19.95, and this Special Book Review will not be considered as a recommendation for purchase.

THE PIONEER CEMETERY OF SILVERDALE

by Dorothy F. Martell

The Silverdale Cemetery is located on Anderson Hill Road about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile past the intersection with Apex Road. This cemetery is still semi-active. Lots can be bought at a nominal cost. A board, consisting of several older residents of Silverdale, maintains control. A trust fund at a local bank earns interest which is drawn twice a year and paid to the local scout troop for doing clean-up chores.

All blocks marked with the letters of the alphabet--A, B, C--are part of the very oldest section of this cemetery. All blocks marked with numbers are in the newer section. What is called a lot in this cemetery is called a plot (family) in most other cemeteries. Thus, many of these internments have identical block and lot numbers. Except where headstones are intact, there is no way to tell which body is where, exactly, by the records. "B"-indicates block, "L"-indicates lot. An index of the Pioneer Cemetery follows.

FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES -- VITAL RECORDS UPDATE

VITAL RECORDS -- STATE OF INDIANA

The Fort Wayne Public Library has a series of books showing the vital records for the State of Indiana. It includes, by counties, an Index to Birth Records 1882-1920: an alphabetical list of names of child, name of father, maiden name of mother, sex, color, date of birth, and volume and page reference at Board of Health; Marriage Records by counties 1882-1920, showing date of marriage, names of bride and groom, dates of birth and name of minister; Index of Death Records 1882-1920, alphabetically by name, showing sex, color, date of death, city of death, and volume and page reference at Board of Health.

VITAL RECORDS -- NEW JERSEY ARCHIVES & HISTORY

Records of births, deaths and marriages from May 1, 1848 to May 31, 1878, are filed at the Bureau of Archives and History, 185 West State Street, Trenton, NJ 08625. These records are open to the public.

VITAL RECORDS -- MISSOURI STATE ARCHIVES

The Missouri State Archives has county records on micro-film for 110 of Missouri's 114 counties. (Atchison, Clark, Gentry and Linn Counties' records are available only in the respective courthouses.) A few birth and death records prior to 1910 were recorded with the County Clerk in the respective counties. These records generally cover the years 1883-1893; however, many counties did not keep them for the entire 10-year period. The staff at the Missouri State Archives will do limited research in indexed records if the request is specific. Each mail request must include the following information: 1. full name of individual to be searched; 2. the name of the county of residence or where the document was recorded; 3. the specific document desired and the approximate date of recording. Only 4 specific records will be searched per request. Do not send money when writing for information. Upon receipt of a request with a specific reference, a staff member will cite relevant documents and advise of copy costs by return mail. The Archives is located at 1001 Industrial Drive, Jefferson City, MO 65101.

VITAL RECORDS -- STATE OF MICHIGAN

Indexes to vital records for the State of Michigan for the following years are available at the State Library: Births 1867-1915; Deaths 1867-1914; and Marriages 1867-1921.

VITAL RECORDS -- STATE OF OHIO

The following vital records previously in the custody of the Marion County Probate Court have been transferred to the Ohio Historical Society, Columbus, OH 43211:

VITAL RECORDS -- PUBLIC ARCHIVES OF NOVA SCOTIA, CANADA

Marriage licenses from 1884 to 1908 have been transferred from the Registrar General's Office to the Public Archives of Nova Scotia. These are the original records and have not yet been microfilmed. There is an index for each one of the 18 counties. The Public Archives will search these records by mail for a \$3.00 charge; you must supply county of residence and an approximate date of marriage.

VITAL RECORDS -- PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK, CANADA

Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths began in 1888. A search of these records will be made if you can provide the name of the person, date and place of event, and in the case of a birth record, the name of the father and full maiden name of the mother. The fee for the search is \$10.00 and this covers a three-year search period. During certain time periods a delay of approximately 2 months can be expected.

If you wish information on records prior to 1888, contact the Provincial Archives, University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, N.B. They have many church records and family records prior to 1888.

STATE ARCHIVES -- STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA

The Federation advises that the West Virginia State Legislature recently passed a so-called "Sunset Bill" which includes provisions to terminate the services of the State Archives, based on approval of the Legislative Committee on July 1, 1980. Those opposed to this potential loss of archival services would do well to make their feelings known by writing to The Honorable John D. Rockefeller IV, Governor, State Capital, Charleston, WV 25305; or to Norman L. Fagan, State Archivist, 400 E. Capital Station, Charleston, WV 25305. The Federation suggests that you write to both of these men. The State Archives is the best place for the permanent keeping of old vital records.

WRITE YOUR CONGRESSMEN!!!!

With the opening of the new Madison Building of the Library of Congress, it has been suggested that the most desirable location for the Genealogical & Local History Division of the Library would be the present Law Library space.

It has also been suggested that genealogists can help achieve this more desirable location for genealogical research in the Library of Congress by writing to their Senators and Congressmen to urge this choice of space.

VITAL RECORDS -- CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

Five volumes of birth records from 1833 through 1846 for the City of Chicago have been published by the Chicago Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 1160, Chicago, IL 60690. These have been extracted from early Chicago newspapers and help recreate the records destroyed in the Chicago Fire of 1871.
