#### MICROFILM RENTAL FROM NATIONAL ARCHIVES

Interlibrary loan service of selected National Archives microfilm publications to libraries and research institutions has been provided by the ll regional archives branches, one of which is in Seattle. However, as of August 1, the Archives has decided that, to operate this program more efficiently and provide better service, centralization of loans will be accomplished. As of August 1, our library will have to send requests for interlibrary loan of microfilm to the Federal Archives and Records Center in Fort Worth, Texas. Therfore, individuals ordering microfilm should be prepared to have it take slightly longer for the film to arrive.

### BY-LAWS AMENDMENTS

The Board of Directors of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society met on June 24, 1980, and propose the following amendments to the club By-Laws. Please read and consider these and be prepared at the October meeting to vote on them.

### ARTICLE II - PURPOSES

- (c) to encourage and promote the organization of chapters
- (d) to support the Federation of Genealogical Societies

#### ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

(c) <u>Honorary membership</u>: Any chapter membership by their vote may recognize exceptional service, distinction and loyalty to our club by recommendation to the Executive Board a member or non-ember as an Honorary Member for one (1) year. Recommendation is subject to the approval of the Executive Board.

## BY-LAWS AMENDMENTS (continued)

(d) <u>Lifetime Membership</u>: Lifetime Membership may be granted upon recommendation by the Execustive Board and voted by the membership, however to maintain the lifetime membership, the person must actively support our club.

#### ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 2 These officers shall be elected at the October meeting, and shall hold office for one term, or until their successors are duly installed. A period of twelve (12) months shall constitute a term. Officers may serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms in any one office.

## ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

#### Section 3. Secretaries

(b) The corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence and keep copies of all correspondence on file. She shall be responsible for keeping the Club's pedigree, surname and locality files up to date. This person shall perform other duties as pertain to the office. This person shall be chairperson of the Research and Surname Committee.

#### ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the six (6) elected officers of the Club and the immediate Past President, the Chairpersons of the Library Committee, the Ways and Means Committee and the Bulletin, a total of ten (10). This Board shall be the governing body of this Club. The President will vote only in case of a tie.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Executive Board should meet four (4) times each year. Special meetings may be called by the President, or by a majority of the Board at any time and place they shall designate.

#### ARTICLE VII - DUES

Section 1. Dues of this society shall be \$10.00 per year for an individual member and \$12.00 per family, due and payable by January 1 and delinquent after February 1 of each year. New members joining between July 1 and November 30 may pay one-half year's dues (\$5.00 single, \$6.00 family). New members joining in December shall pay a full year's dues—this payment to cover dues through the following December.

<u>Section 2</u>. Members may not vote, hold office, or receive any official publications until dues are paid. When half-year's dues are paid, that member will receive only half of our Club bulletin; family memberships receive only one volume of our Bulletin per year. Memberships are automatically cancelled if dues are not paid on or before February 1.

#### ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. The annual election of officers shall be at the October meeting each year. The Club year begins January 1 and ends December 31.

#### ARTICLE IX - COMMITTEES

Section 1. The President shall appoint the following committees unless they are otherwise provided for in these By-Laws, within thirty (30) days of her election. These committees shall serve as standing committees for the Club year: (a) Nominating, (b) Educational, (c) Membership and Publicity, (d) Ways and Means, (e) Budget, (f) Hostess and Refreshments, (g) Librarian and Books, (h) Bulletin, (i) Auditing, (j) Special Projects, (k) Research and Surname. Special Committees may be appointed from time to time as they are deemed necessary and approved by the Executive Board.

## BY-LAWS AMENDMENTS (continued)

#### ARTICLE X - DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. Nominating. This committee shall consist of the immediate Past President and two (2) members to be elected by the membership. The duties of this committee shall be to nominate candidates for each office and present their nominations at the September meeting. Election will be by voice vote at the October meeting. If more than one nominee for any office, that election shall be by ballot.

Section 3. Membership and Publicity.

(a) Membership. This committee shall be chaired by the 2nd Vice President and shall be responsible to: (1) collect all dues and submit same to the Treasurer, (2) issue membership cards for all chapters, (3) prepare name tags and maintain nametag boards, (4) maintain the membership file, (5) provide monthly new member list to all officers and the Bulletin Editor.

Section 5. Budget. This committee shall be composed of the outgoing Treasurer as chairman, the incoming Treasurer, the incoming Vice President, the incoming President and the immediate Past President. Within sixty (60) days after their election, they shall prepare and submit to the membership an estimated budget for the year, to be approved by the membership. This committee shall review the budget quarterly or at the request of the Executive Board for possible adjustments. Section 9. Auditing. This committee shall be composed of the Past Treasurer, the Past President, and one (1) member appointed by the President and shall be responsible for auditing the Treasurer's books quarterly or at the request of the President and/or Executive Board.

Section 11. Research and Surname. This committee shall answer any genealogical correspondence received by the Club.

### ARTICLE XIII - CHAPTERS OF THE SOCIETY

Section 1. The Executive Board may approve establishment of a chapter outside of Bremerton School District 100C upon written petition of at least 10 persons.

Section 2. All chapter members must be dues-paying members of Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

Section 3. A chapter may collect chapter dues as agreed upon by its members in addition to the dues submitted to the Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

Section 4. Each chapter will elect at organization and thence annually in October a chairperson, a treasurer and such other officers as the chapter decides. After the organizing year, the chairperson must have been a member of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society for at least one (1) year. No officer may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms of one year each. Following completion of one term out of that office, a member may be again elected to that chapter chair. The Chairperson and the Treasurer are members of the Executive Board of Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

Section 5. Each chapter will elect at organization and thence annually in October a representative to the Puget Sound Genealogical Society Executive Board. The representative will be a member of the Board. After the organizing year, the representative must have been a member of Puget Sound Genealogical Society for at least one (1) year. No representative may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms of one year each. Following the completion of one term out of that office, a member may be again elected to the chapter representative position.

Section 6. Each chapter will make a quarterly report of its activities and programs to the Executive Board.

Section 7. Each chapter will be budgeted annually from the general account of Puget Sound Genealogical Society. The chapter Treasurer must make a quarterly report to the Treasurer of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

# A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

In this issue of your Bulletin you will find the suggested By-Laws Amendments for the addition of Local Chapters to our Society. Please read them over very carefully because we will be discussing and voting on them at our October meeting.

One change in the By-Laws, the raising of dues, I would like to tell you the reasoning behind it. Our dues have been \$6.00 since the establishment of our club in 1974. We have never had an increase in dues but, because of rising costs, we have found it necessary to have fund raisers to cover our club's running expenses. I am sure all of us are aware of the increase in the cost of everything. Your Board of Directors recommends that we raise dues to cover the expenses of our club and that the Fund Raisers be only for the purchase of books for our library or for equipment for our club room and library. This would eliminate the pressure on the members to raise money just to keep our club going.

Remeber, this will be voted on at our October 9th meeting. Please express your feelings on this by attending the October meeting and voting or by sending a letter to me or any of the club officers, telling us how you wish to vote on the amendments as a whole or on any single amendment.

## FEDERATION OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES -- VITAL RECORDS UPDATE

## CANADA -- VITAL RECORDS -- ARCHIVES

#### NEW BRUNSWICK

The Provincial Archives of New Brunswick, P. O. Box 6000, Fredericton has a large collection of genealogical material at the Bonar Law-Bennett Building, University of New Brunswick. Included are microfilms of marriage records, by counties, prior to 1888. Some of these films are indexed, some are not. These records start at various dates; in the County of Westmoreland they go back to 1790. Each county has its own cut off date, but most are up to 1887 or 1888.

## NEWFOUNDLAND & LABRADOR

The Provincial Archives located on Military Road, St. John's, NF A1C 2C9 has approximately 80 volumes of Vital Statistics records, some of which date back to the 1750's. These were copied from Parish Registers in the 1940's and until recently were held by the Department of Health, Vital Statistics Division. They go only up to 1890-91. These records are open to the general public, but no microfilming or photocopying of the records is permitted.

## ONTARIO

Located at 77 Greenville St., Queen's Park, Toronto, the Archives contain church records, cemetery records, marriage records, Upper Canada marriage bonds, marriage licenses, and marriage certificates. The marriage registers are in 86 volumes and in some instances go to the year 1934.

#### NEW BRUNSWICK EARLY MARRIAGE RECORDS -- A WARNING!!!!!

The following item appeared in the March Newsleaf from the Ontario Genealogical Society: "WARNING. If you receive publicity notices from an address in St. John, N.B. for a book entitled above, it would be prudent to check very carefully before sending any money. We have received a warning from a correspondent who says that she sent a checque but did not receive a book, and who states she has found others in the same position."

#### UNITED STATES -- VITAL RECORDS

## NEW MEXICO -- ARCHIVES

From the State Records Center and Archives, 404 Montezuma, Santa Fe: "In New Mexico, civil records of deaths and births were not created until 1907. Records of marriages, on the average, date from the 1860's. Persons doing genealogical research in New Mexico must relie (sic) greatly on the Archives of the Archdioceses of Santa Fe. These Roman Catholic Church records have been microfilmed and the microfilms made available to researchers working at this agency. As the State Records Center continues to transfer County Marriage Records, for the territorial period (1846-1912) from the various counties, we will microfilm these records and make the microfilm available."

# THE SUTRO LIBRARY -- SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

An excellent genealogical library, the Sutro Library in San Francisco is in danger in the California State Senate!! The Library Subcomittee of the California State Senate is analyzing whether it is a proper function of the California State Library to operate and maintain the Sutro Library. Until this vital question is settled, the Legislature is also considering the elimination of the Sutro's entire acquisition budget. # WISCONSIN -- ARCHIVES

From the State Archivist: "The State Historical Society of Wisconsin and the Genealogical Society of Utah are currently engaged in a program to microfilm all Wisconsin vital records for the years prior to 1907. Microfilming has been underway for over one year now, with completion of the project anticipated in approximately eighteen months. Once completed, copies of this microfilm will be deposited and available at the State Historical Society. It is anticipated that an additional copy will be made available for interlibrary loan through the Society's library. . . . Copies will be available also through the Genealogical Society of Utah's wide system of branch libraries. . . . We do not anticipate that any of these materials will be available for general use earlier than January 1982."

We believe that Wisconsin will probably be the first state to provide genealogists with access to all old vital records at their State Archives.

#### WASHINGTON

Due to circumstances beyond our control, the Federation's Bills (1) To Open Vital Records for Genealogists and (2) To Prevent the Fraudulent Use of Birth Certificates, missed the deadline for filing new Bills in the 1980 legislature. While we regret the delay, we are assured that a member of the legislature will see that these Bills are introduced on time for the 1981 session. We intend to use the interim in getting better prepared for 1981.

#### DIFFERENT FROM NOWADAYS

Living in an age of computers and facts, we become accustomed to dates and factual information on our tombstones. The genealogist of tomorrow thus may have better information, but he may miss out on the folklore, humor and fancy of the old tombstones that present day genealogists find as we search the weathered monuments of our ancestors.

Our ancestors lived closer to death, and death was a part of their lives, to be looked on somewhat as a friend to be joked with and taken rather lightly sometimes. Often the humor was intentional and deliberate, such as one Arthur Haine who placed on his stone "Haine Haint". Often times, however, unintentional humor resulted, as when a stonecutter left the final "e" off an important word on the stone: "Lord, she is thin", leaving the reader to wonder if this was an error or a comment of the husband on his wife's condition.

Sometimes, a few scattered gravestones are all that mark the site of a once thriving town. In the western United States, many cemeteries also bear testimony to the fact that little fuss or ceremony was accorded the deceased. For example, one westerner who innocently bought a stolen horse and was hanged is buried under a marker which simply reads, "Hanged by mistake". Another faded marker reads, "Here lies Lester Moore, Four slugs from a forty-four, No Les no more".

Sometimes, much can be learned about the person's life, an example of this is found in the terse tale of a Nova Scotia woman: "18 years a maiden, 1 year a wife, 1 day a mother, then I lost my life". Or, how about: "Talked to death by friends", or the macabre information "Mr. Gilman Spaulding killed with an ax by an insane brother". (One wonders what the brother's stone read).

So, before many of the old gravestones are lost to time and "progress", try and sample a way of life that is fast becoming extinct and certainly is "different from nowadays".
