BY-LAWS:

In accordance with the By-Laws of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society, the proposed By-Laws are hereby published sixty days in advance of voting on said By-Laws. At the regular meeting of the society on October 8, 1981, voting will be held. In the meantime, please read these By-laws and be familiar with them before the October meeting.

PUGET SOUND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I. This organization shall be known as the Puget Sound Genealogical Society.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSES. The Purpose of this organization shall be to

- (a) develop a closer contact among genealogists
- (b) to stimulate education in the study of genealogy
- (c) to encourage and pormote the organization of chapters
- (d) to support the Federation of Genealogical Soceities.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Classes of Members. There shall be four (4) classes of members with the qualifications for each as follows:

BY-LAWS (continued)

- (a) Regular Membership: Regular membership shall be any person interested in family history.
- (b) Family Membership: A family membership shall be a husband, wife, and children under 18 years of age. Those joining at the family rate shall receive only one club Bulletin.
- (c) Honorary Membership: Any chapter membership by their vote may recognize exceptional service, distinction and loyalty to the organization by recommendation to the Executive Board a member or non-member as an Honorary Member for one (1) year. Recommendation is subject to the approval of the Executive Board.
- (4) Lifetime Membership: Lifetime Membership may be granted upon recommendation by the Executive Board and voted by the membership of each chapter.

ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS

- Section 1. The officers of this organization may be a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and a Treasurer. All officers must have been a paid-up member for at least one year.
- Section 2. These officers shall hold office for one term, or until their successors are duly installed. A period of twelve (12) months shall constitute a term. Officers may serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms in any one office.
- Section 3. If any office except that of Chairman becomes vacant during the year, a successor to fill the unexpired term shall be named by the Executive Board. A vacancy in the office of Chairman shall be filled by the Vice Chairman for the unexpired term.

Section 4. Duties of Officers

- (a) Duties of Chairman
 - (1) Preside at all meetings of this organization.
- (2) Appoint all committees as necessary and be ex-officio member of these committees.
 - (3) Supervise all activities of this organization.
 - (4) Be empowered to sign checks.
 - (5) Perform other duties as pertain to this office.
 - (b) Duties of the Vice Chairman
 - (1) Perform the duties of the Chairman when absent.
 - (2) Chair the seminar committee
- (3) Receive monthly membership reports from chapters and furnish membership lists as requested.
 - (4) Perform other duties as pertain to this office.

BY-LAWS (continued)

- (c) Duties of Secretary
 - (1) Keep a complete record of all meetings of this organization.
 - (2) Provide a copy of the minutes for the Chairman and library.
 - (3) Keep an accurate record of attendance at each meeting.
- (4) Conduct all correspondence and keep copies of all correspondence on file.
 - (5) Perform other duties as pertain to this office.
 - (d) Duties of Treasurer
 - (1) Make deposits monthly.
 - (2) Pay all bills as authorized by this organization.
 - (3) Sign checks.
 - (4) Issue receipts for all monies received.
 - (5) Submit monthly reports to the Chairman.
 - (6) Maintain an up-to-date set of record books.
 - (7) Present the books for auditing quarterly or as directed

by the chairman.

- (8) Chair the Budget committee of this organization.
- (9) Perform other duties as pertain to this office.

ARTICLE V. EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the elected President of each chapter, the Junior Past President and one elected representative from each chapter for a total of three (3) from each chapter. The aforesaid officers shall each have one vote on all Executive Board decisions. Also the Librarian, Bulletin Editor and Special Projects Chairman will be members of the Executive Board. The Chairman shall vote only in case of a tie.

- Section 2. The Executive Board shall determine and control all financial expenditures in accordance with the budget of this organization.
- Section 3. The Executive Board shall meet four (4) times each year. Special meetings may be called by the Chairman or by a majority of the Board at any time and place they shall designate.
- Section 4. The Executive Board shall elect their own officers and shall appoint the Librarian, Bulletin Editor and Special Projects Chairman.
 - Section 5. A majority of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI. DUES

Section 1. Dues of this organization shall be \$10.00 per year for an individual member and \$12.00 per family, due and payable by January 1 and delinquent after February 1 of each year. New members joining between July 1 and November 30 may pay one-half year's dues (\$5.00 single, \$6.00 family). New members joining in December shall pay a full year's dues - this payment to cover dues through the following December.

BY-LAWS (continued)

Section 2. Members may not vote, hold office, or receive any official publications until dues are paid. When half-year's dues are paid, that member will receive only half of the organization's bulletins for that year; family memberships receive only one volume of the bulletin per year. Memberships are automatically cancelled if dues are not paid on or before February 1.

Section 3. Seventy percent (70) of each members dues will be deposited with the Puget Sound Genealogical Society Treasurer, the remaining thirty (30) percent to be retained by each chapter.

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Board shall appoint the following committees unless they are otherwise provided for in these by-laws, within thirty (30) days of election. These committees shall serve as standing committees for the Club year:

- (a) Ways and Means, (b) Budget, (c) Librarian and Books,
- (d) Bulletin, (3) Auditing, (f) Special Projects.

Special committees may be appointed from time to time as they are deemed necessary.

Section 2. All committees will make monthly reports to the Chairman. At the December meeting each year, all committees will make a written report of their operating expenses for the year to the Chairman Elect.

Section 3. Ways and Means. This committee shall devise ways and means for increasing the revenue of the organization.

Section 4. Budget. This committee shall be composed of the outgoing Treasurer, the incoming Treasurer, the incoming Chairman, the incoming Vice Chairman, and the immediate Past Chairman. Within sixty (60) days after election, they shall prepare and submit to the membership an estimated budget for the coming year, to be approved by the membership of all the Chapters. This committee shall review the budget quarterly or at the request of the Executive Board for possible adjustments.

Section 5. Librarian and Books. This committee shall be responsible for all duties pertaining to the Library:

- (a) Cataloging and shelving all acquisitions monthly.
- (b) Be in charge of the inter-library loan system.
- (c) Keep up-to-date the Resource Notebook.
- (d) Submitting a list of suggested books for purchase to the membership.
- (e) Submitting monthly reports to the Chairman and the Book Review columnist.
 - (f) Be in charge of re-ordering of supplies.
 - (g) Be in charge of care of our microfilm readers.

BY-LAWS (continued)

- Section 7. Auditing. This committee shall be composed of the Past Treasurer, the Past Chairman, and one (1) member appointed by the Chairman and shall be rresponsible for auditing the Treasurer's books annually or at the request of the Chairman and/or Executive Board. This committee shall also audit the Chapter's books upon request of the Chairman.
- Section 8. Special Projects. This committee shall be responsible for any on-going statistical extraction programs, such as courthouse extracting and cemetery indexing, or as established during the year.
- Section 9. Bulletin. This committee shall be chaired by the Editor and shall be responsible for the publishing and distribution of our club quarterly bulletin, <u>Family Backtracking</u>, and shall be in charge of all bulletin exchange requests.

ARTICLE VIII. CHAPTERS OF THE SOCIETY

- Section 1. The Executive Board may approve establishment of a chapter by written petition of at least 10 persons.
- Section 2. All chapter members must be dues-paying members of Puget Sound Genealogical Society.
- Section 3. Each chapter will elect at organization and thence annually in October a president, secretary, treasurer and such other officers as the Chapter decides. After the organizing year, the president must have been a member of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society for at least one (1) year. No elected officer may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms of one year each. Following completion of one term out of that office, a member may be again elected to that chair.
- Section 4. Each chapter will elect at organization and then annually in October, a representative to the Puget Sound Genealogical Society Executive Board. The representative will be a member of the Board. After the organization year, the representative must have been a member of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society for at least one (1) year. No representative may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms of one year each. Bollowing the completion of one term out of that office, a member may be again elected to the Chapter Representative position.
- Section 5. Each chapter will make a quarterly report of its activities and programs to the Executive Board.
- Section 6. The Chapter treasurer must make a quarterly report to the Treasurer of the Puget Sound Genealogical Society.
- Section 7. Each chapter shall be governed by standing rules which shall not be in conflict with Puget Sound Genealogical Society By-Laws.

BY-LAWS (continued)

ARTICLE IX. BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

A proposed amendment to these by-laws shall be submitted at a regular meeting of the Executive Board. Upon an approval vote by the board members this proposed amendment shall be taken to each chapter for discussion and suggested changes. The board will then incorporate or reject the suggested changes and publish the proposed amendment. Sixty days after the publication of the proposed amendment each chapter will vote on said amendment. At the next regular Executive Board meeting the board members will cast their vote as directed by their chapter and a change will be effected by a majority vote.

Present policy is to publish queries free of charge to members of Puget Sound Genealogical Society. A nominal fee of \$2.00 per query (no limit on length) is assessed for non-members. Send all queries to Bulletin Editor, 4430 Pine Road NE, Bremerton, WA 98310.

A BIT OF HISTORY From the Federation of Genealogical Societies Newsletter

In 1857, Congress made a \$600,000 annual appropriation for mail delivery semiweekly to California to a company headed by John Butterfield. Butterfield established his line with its eastern terminal at Memphis and St. Louis, and its Western at San Francisco. The postage rate was 20¢ an ounce for letters; passenger fare was \$100 in gold. (Note that postage rates for letters are almost up to the 1857 rate again!) In 1860 the brief but colorful Pony Express was launched, carrying the news some 1975 miles in about 10 days. After only 16 months, the express gave way to the telegraph.
