Miscellaneous Iowa Records, Volume II. Rita Goranson & Jo Ann Burgess. 50 pp. Indexed. \$5.95. (Donated by Family Researchers, 115 Lakeview Dr., Mason City, Iowa 50401.

This is the 2nd volume of a continuing series designed to record Bible records and other manuscript materials found in private Iowa homes or antique shops. The majority of the information is restricted to pre-1900 events. Besides Bible records, there are some marriage and funeral records of a "Rev. John Todd"-Fremont Co., Iowa; a "birthday book;" extracts of family letters; a voters list; and names from an autograph album. These are often "impossible" to find records! This type of compilation can be of real service and value to researchers. (The compilers also have published a series of volumes on Bible records found in Iowa libraries and museums--these would be worth investigating, especially if you have Iowa lines.)

As a special note, in the process of compiling this volume and the other series on Bible records, Family Researchers has accumulated a number of family Bibles and other miscellaneous records which they are selling at cost-these are the original records. Bibles included are: AMUNDSON, BRADLEY, BROWN/IRWIN, CRAFTS, DAY/BONNEL, HERRICK, IRWIN, KVAMME, LEMON/LUCUS, MADISON, MANLEY, McMEANS/SCOTT, MERRITT, OTTLEY and PORTER, PARIS and YOUNG, PEREGORY, SCHNEIDER and ULRICH, SPAFFORD and CROCKER, THOMPSON, HOPKINS, YEOUMANS, McCOY, and BLOUNT; plus some family records for: CASE/CARTER, HARKER and KNEE, HUDSON, THAYER, TOWNSEND, and LORD.

This is a fine addition to our PSGS Library. By the way, a look at the index shows that there are other states included in the records besides Iowa. Don't overlook this volume, even if you don't think your lines were in Iowa.

We often hear that our ancestors "homesteaded" land, but it is important to read the original paperwork on their property to see under what laws they actually fell under when securing the land. Following are the various laws and acts under which early residents of Washington Territory and Washington State secured their land.

PRE-EMPTION LAW: Up to 160 acres secured by paying \$1.25 per acre plus a fee of about \$13 if they citizens of U.S. and lived upon the land.

HOMESTEAD ACT: Title to 160 acres could be secured in five years without paying any payment except a fee of about \$30. Must be a U.S. citizen and reside on the land.

SOLDIERS' HOMESTEAD ACT: Same as homestead except that years served in the Army were deducted from the five year residency.

DONATION CLAIM ACT: Passed by Congress Sept. 27, 1850.

(a) Settlers prior to 12/1/1850 in Territory could get 320 acres if single, 640 acres if married, one half to each in his/her own right.

(b) From 12/1/1850 to 12/1/1853 160 acres if single, 320 if married. White settlers or occupants, including half breed Indians, abofe 18, a citizen or having made declaration of citizenship.

Early settlers secured land by Donation Act or Squatters rights.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW WHEN HIRING A PROFESSIONAL GENEALOGIST BY Sue P. Williams, Genealogical and Historical Researcher

The following information is excerpted from the Federation of Genealogical Societies Newsletter of June-July 1983:

One of the most commonly asked questions to the genealogists is, "If I were to pay you \$200 or \$300, how many generations would you be able to extend my pedigree?" No researcher can responsibly predict or pre-determine the number of generations that can be proven for a certain fee. Each genealogical problem is unique. Some problems are easy to solve, and if the family lived in a geographic area and during a time period when records were well-kept, then tracing this line may be quite productive. In such cases, the amount of information one can find may be extensive.

On the other hand, some research problems are most difficult. The family may be living in a locality where the usual types of records were destroyed—courthouse burned, church or vital records not kept or lost, families moved frequently, etc. In these cases, more in-depth research may be required in supplemental records to solve a difficult problem.

Perhaps an understanding of what the consumer is actually paying for when hiring a researcher would be helpful. If the consumer is aware before hiring a genealogist that the researcher is being paid for the TIME he or she spends "searching", not necessarily "finding", then misunderstandings might be averted.

What can you expect from the genealogist for your money? A good researcher will: 1. Provide you with a research report outlining in detail what searches were

made and an explanation of the results.

2. Provide you with a research calendar showing a complete list of the searches

that were made during the project.

3. Provide you with copies of all research findings. Copies of the researcher's extracts, and pertinent documents found, such as church and vital records, birth, death, and marriage certificates, census enumerations, probates, military records, biographies, histories, etc., should be provided to the client. A duplicate copy of everything should be maintained by the researcher for future reference.

4. Provide you with family group records and pedigree charts. These should be updated and documented as new information is found during each project.

Remember, researchers vary greatly in their methods of reporting and in what they provide clients. If you hire a researcher who does not provide all of the above basics, you certainly can request it. You will be billed for xerox costs so the researcher can maintain duplicate files, but this is usually quite minimal when one considers the cost of re-doing the research should the original documentation be lost or accidentally destroyed.

Fees vary considerably from researcher to researcher on a per hour basis from about \$5 an hour to \$75 an hour. The "average" fee <u>currently</u> ranges somewhere between \$10 and \$30 per hour for the professional in the United States. Some researchers prefer to charge a flat daily fee — such as \$100 to \$300 per day for their services. Many researchers require a "retainer" in advance.

Try to provide the researcher everything that you know in order to provide a better foundation on which to build. Having access to previous research, if any, will avoid costly duplication.
