LEARNING FROM LIBRARIANS by Dorothy Lower

The following article is reprinted from the Federation of Genealogical Societies Newsletter.

CITY DIRECTORIES

Among the many sources available to the genealogical researcher, one which is often overlooked is the city directory. Of course, this type of publication doesn't exist for all areas of the United States, but they have been published for a great many towns and cities as well as some counties. Many public libraries attempt to collect directories for their own area.

In 1961 the American Antiquarian Society published A Bibliography of American Directories Through 1860, compiled by Dorothea E. Spear. This is a compilation of all directories which existed at the time of publication and indicated the depositories in which they were held. Incidentally, the earliest was a manuscript listing the inhabitants of Baltimore in the year 1752. The first printed directory was for the city of Philadelphia which was published in 1785. Mrs. Spear's bibliography is available in most large libraries and a set of microfiche based on the book reproduces the directories themselves. The latter can also be found in some large genealogy collections.

One of the principal advantages of these directories to the genealogist is the frequency of their publication. They can be valuable supplements to the Federal census schedules which were taken at ten year intervals while the directories were usually published much more often. Particularly in recent years many are published yearly. They contain an alphabetical listing of the head of the household, ordinarily giving his address, the first name of his wife and his occupation. These facts can be used as proof of the whereabouts of the family at a particular time and can often give a lead for further search. They are of particular assistance in searching a Federal census for a large city for which no index exists, since the directory gives the street address where the family resided. A city map shows the number of the ward in which the street was located and then only that ward of the city need be searched. This can be a great saving of time and energy for the genealogist.

While it is not recommended that a genealogist write to a public library asking for help with his research, it is not too much to ask a librarian to check a directory for a particular family. Of course, a self-addressed, stamped envelope and an offer to pay copying costs should always accompany such a request.

White House History. Volume 1, Number 1. 1983. White House Historical Association. (Donated by the publisher.)

P.S.G.S. Library has received the first issue of a new journal, White House History, devoted exclusively to the history of the White House.

Articles in this issue of White House History include the recollections of Rachel Lambert Mellon on her development of the Rose Garden for President Kennedy; a report on the restoration of early stonework at the White House; a look at the beautiful White House silver, some of which has been in daily use by the presidents since before the Civil War; a collection of photographs of historical interest; and the story of the White House Historical Association, founded under the guidance of Mrs. John F. Kennedy in 1962. Also included is a memoir of Paul Jennings, (a slave at the White House & a servant of James and Dolley Madison) which was first published in 1865.

Additional copies of Volume 1, Number 1 of White House History is available through the White House Historical Association, 740 Jackson Place N.W., Washington, DC 20506 for \$6.00, postage included.

The White House Historical Association intends to publish future issues of White House History on an occasional basis, with proceeds from the sale used to publish other materials about the White House and to acquire historical furnishings and objects for the White House.

The Source. A Guidebook of American Genealogy. Edited by Arlene Eakle and Johni Cerny. 1984. Ancestry Publishing, P. O. Box 476, Salt Lake City, UT 84110. \$39.95. (Donated tö PSGS Library by Ancestry Publishing.)

This recently-published source book is the most comprehensive guide to American research sources and techniques I have seen! There is something here for everyone. The volume opens with a not-for-beginners-only introduction to genealogical records and techniques which, among other things, presents a fine survey of sources for printed and manuscript materials and other collections available for the genealogist; an overview of some of the laws pertaining to use of information; plus a helpful bibliography of how-to publications with a guide to selecting the right one for you.

Following this introductory material is a large section covering the major U.S. record sources, including "at-home" sources; vital statistics; local, state, federal and special censuses; church records; court, land and military records; "institutional" sources, such as prisons, mortuaries, schools, orphanages and hospitals; and business and employment records.

Part II of <u>The Source</u> is devoted to various types of published genealogical sources: newspapers; indexes; biographies; and directories of various types, e.g. city directories, professional directories, religious directories, post office directories.

Part III forcuses on "Special Resources." Here you will find help with sources and research approaches for your immigrant ancestor; for special ethnic groups: Native-Americans; Spanish- and Mexican-Americans; Afro-Americans; Asian-Americans; and Jewish-Americans; and for locating urban ancestors. There are separate chapters on the use of computers and genealogical data bases in your research and on the records produced by hereditary and lineage societies.

By referring to <u>The Source</u> you can quickly ascertain what records exist for the area and time period you are searching; the type of information the record is likely to provide; where to find the record; and how to use it when you find it. <u>The Source</u> also provides a glossary of genealogical and research terms, an appendix of addresses of record repositories; and <u>many</u> bibliographies (a great asset!!).

I think you are going to want to refer to <u>The Source</u> again and again. I know I am!

Mercer Centennial 1872-1972. Mercer Centennial Committee. Unindexed. (Donated by the Kitsap County Historical Society).

In an attempt to provide a more complete and better researched record of the Mercer County, Missouri, community than had been previously done, the 1972 Centennial Committee of the town of Mercer compiled a 311-page history as part of their Centennial observance.

The book includes an outline of the settlement and development of the town of Mercer, Missouri, illustrated with many photos of groups and buildings associated with the town; and a 255-page biographical section of past and current (at that time) residents. There is a great deal of excellent material here which could provide a good boost for a researcher--the major drawback being that the material is unindexed.

This volume is a good example of the type of material available to you in the <u>many</u> centennial and jubilee books published by cities, towns and counties all across the country. It is well worth looking for this type of book for the area your ancestor (or his descendants!) lived in.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Effective May 1, 1984, all requests for copies of military service records or passenger arrival records must be submitted on NATF Forms 80 and 81, respectively. After May 1, prior versions of these forms (NATF Form 26 and NATF Form 40) will not be accepted for processing. All forms other than the NATF Form 80 or 81 that are received after May 1 will be returned.

A change in payment policies will also take effect on May 1, 1984. NARS has in the past required that payment accompany requests for copies of veterans records and passenger arrival records. After May 1, 1984, payment should not be sent with the NATF Forms 80 and 81. NARS will research the request, prepare copies of any records located, and HOLD THE COPIES for 30 days or until payment is received, whichever is sooner. As soon as records are located and copied, researchers will receive a bill and instructions on returning their remittances.

Separate forms should also be submitted for each file (pension or bounty-land or compiled military service) desired. To obtain NATF Form 80 or 81, write to Reference Services Branch (NNIR), National Archives and Records Service, 8th and Pennsylvania Avenue NW, Washington DC 20408.
