Current Genealogical Publications. Volume 3. 1984. Compiled by Claudette Maerz, P. O. Box 37010, Bloomington, MN 55431.


This publication is the third in a series of catalogues distributed at no cost to genealogical societies, newspapers with genealogical columns, book stores, etc. As the title indicates, it contains a description of 100 current genealogical publications (books, family histories, family newsletters and quarterlies, etc.) available for purchase. Quite a wide variety of genealogical material is represented here, and the items are indexed both by surname and locality. (Donated by the compiler.) Shelf No. FAM 43

Genealogical and Biographical Research: A Select Catalog of National Archives Microfilm Publications. National Archives Trust Board. 1983.

This catalogue is one of a series which describes National Archives microfilms relating to special groups of Federal Records. Each of these films is available for purchase from the National Archives Trust Board. This volume contains a detailed description of the following record groups, with roll-by-roll descriptions and roll numbers for use in ordering:

- 1. Land Records--including Military Bounty Land Warrants, Donation Land Claims, Private Land Claims, etc.
- 2. Civilian Government Employees--including records relating to Federal Judges, Attorneys, Marshals and Postmasters, etc.
- 3. "Old Loan" and Tax Records
- 4. Southern Civilians -- including some Confederate records, District Court records, civilians in military prisons, etc.
- 5. District of Columbia Residents
- 6. Records of the Spanish Governors of Puerto Rico
- 7. Amnesties and Pardons
- 8. Naturalizations

OHIO HOUSE BILL 319 PASSES. This bill would raise the cost of birth/death records to \$5 each and any probate record to \$10 each. For further information call Toll Free 1-800-282-0253. Hopefully this is not the sign of a trend across the country. It could be very costly to researchers and individuals.

MICROFICHE OF 1910 CENSUS STREET INDEX AVAILABLE. The Federation has accumulated enough funds through National Archives Gift Fund to complete the first project of microfilming. On the 50 fiche of this microfilm publication are reproduced an index to city street and census enumeration for 39 cities in the 1910 Federal population census. The records produced in this publication are part of the Records of the Bureau of the Census, Record Group 29. See pages 26 and 27 of the May/June Federation Newsletter for list of cities involved.

GERMAN EMIGRANTS FROM HESSEN-KASSEL. Virginia Reynolds, 2617 N. Ridgway Ave., Chicago, IL 60647 reports that Hessisches Staatsarchive Marburg is compiling names and personal data of all emigrants from Hessen-Kassel between Jan. 1, 1840-Dec. 31, 1866 by computer. The archives advised that some of the information may not be available until 1987. A book will be issued on the subject at that time.

BRITISH SOCIETY OF GENEALOGISTS MOVING. Effective Aug. 1, 1984 the society will move to new headquarters at 14 Charterhouse Buildings, London EC1M 7BA. The new location is about 3/4 mile due north from St. Paul's Cathedral, about halfway between the Guildhall Library and St. Paul's "tube" or bus station.

NEW YORK COUNTY GUIDES COMPLETED. New York Historical Resources Center at Cornell University is offering County Guides for 37 New York counties and preparing guides for four more.
