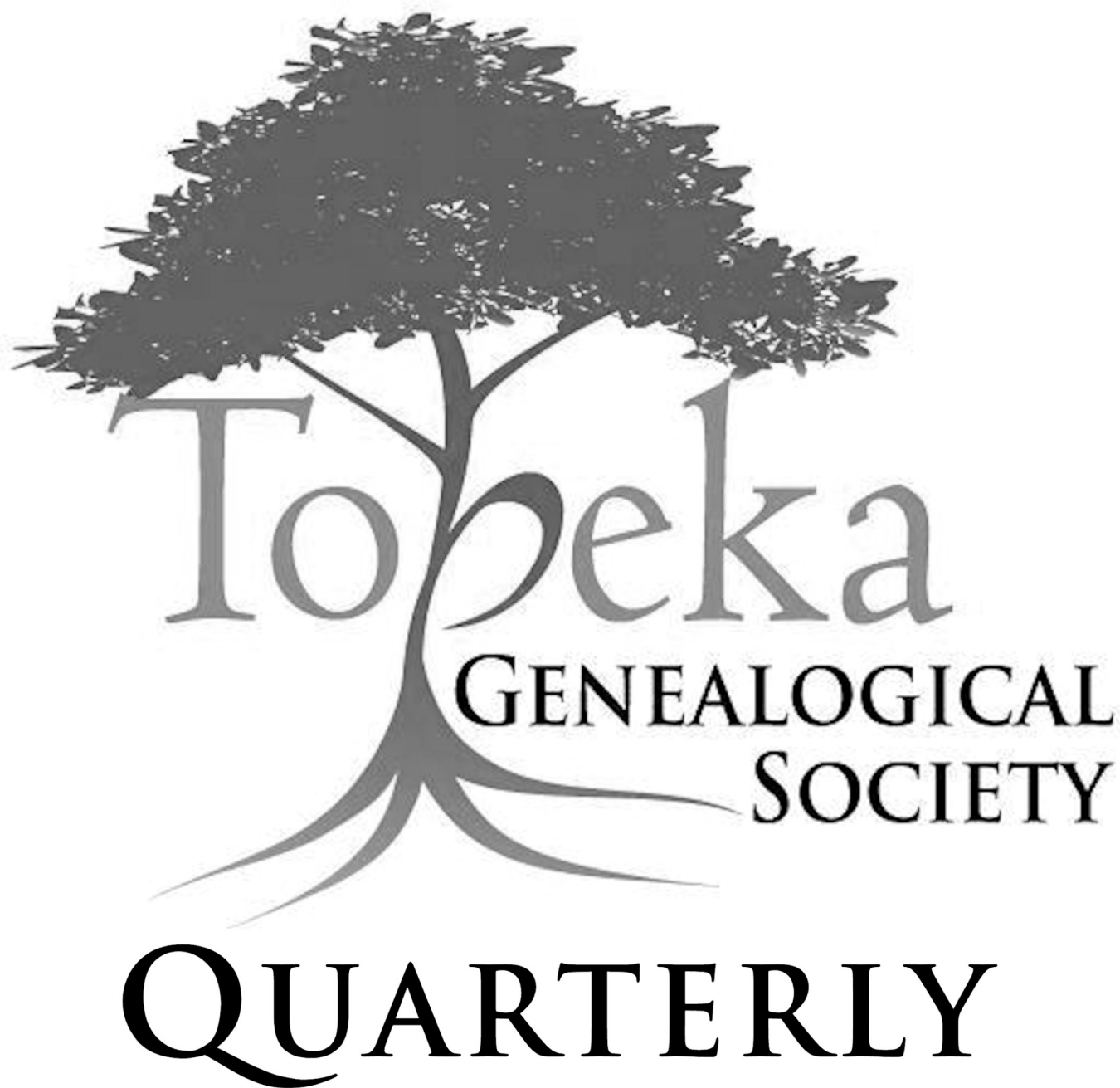

Meet the New 2017 Officers



Vice President - Garry Macha

I am a retired pipeline construction project manager. I was raised on a farm northwest of Topeka, graduated with an engineering degree from K-State and served four years in the Coast Guard before beginning my professional career. I lost my wife Judy, a Washburn University graduate, of 40 years three years ago to ALS. She taught piano and was very active in the Topeka and Tulsa music communities for many years. I have a married son, Brent, living in Austin, TX. He and his wife Melissa have three soccer playing sons 10, 7 and 5. I have a son Greg who lives in Shawnee, KS.

My wife and I lived New Orleans, Tulsa and Oklahoma City before returning to Kansas where we raised our sons. I spent the last ten years of my career in Tulsa, OK prior to my retirement and return to Topeka in 2010. I have had a fairly long term interest in genealogy rooted in the unusual and yet typical American history of my family. My mother's family emigrated from England in the early 1600's settling in New England. Several generations lived in Massachusetts and Vermont. My great grandfather served in the Civil War, left Vermont for Iowa where he was married and moved to Kansas with his wife and son, my grandfather on her lap. My father's parents were both emigrants from small villages in Moravia, now a part of the Czech Republic arriving separately in 1882 and 1895. They both moved to the Czech settlement north of Rossville, Kansas where they met and later married in 1909. The "Bohemian Hall" was the social center of the Czech community for my grandparents and parents. Twenty-six Czech emigrants from within eight miles my grandmother's small home village, Pozdechov, with a population of less than 500, are buried in the Rossville Czech Cemetery.

I had the opportunity to visit Springfield, Vermont where several generations of her forbearers lived in 2015. I visited the town hall and obtained copies of several family history documents. This year I visited the

Czech Republic with my older brother. We toured my grandmother's village of Pozdechov including visits to the church where she had been baptized and the site of the old family home (it had been torn down in the 1990's). In Brusperk, my grandfather's home town, we visited the church where he was baptized and the site of his family home-fabric store (again the family home had been removed years before our visit).

Treasurer - Jan Wilkes

Jan has been interested and involved with genealogy and family history work since she was a teenager. She began gathering information by interviewing and writing to relatives. Fortunately, her mother's father shared his extensive research and as well as records, pictures and stories preserved by his own ancestors that went back a number of generations. These are her Irish, Scotch, English ancestors. After his death, she inherited all of his research material, which included 15 notebooks and numerous hard bound family histories.

Her father's ancestors immigrated from Bohemia and Moravia between 1856 and 1869. In her teens, she visited and interviewed those of the oldest generations. She learned important information from them that helped to make the leap across the Atlantic to the Czech Republic. In addition, she researched in libraries such as the Kansas State Historical Society, the Topeka Library, Topeka Genealogical Library, as well as libraries in New York City, Boston and the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. She was blessed to connect with other researchers both in the USA and in the Czech Republic. Thus she has shared and collaborated with those she is distantly related. In the summer of 2014, she visited the ancestral villages and homes of both her Bohemian and Moravian ancestors and met these Czech relatives. She has given various presentations at the Czech Festival in Blue Rapids, Kansas and the Topeka Genealogical Society.

Jan has served as a Family History Consultant and Director of the Topeka Family History Center. She has taught numerous individuals in classes as well as one-on-one to search for recorded information on their families.

Corresponding Secretary -

Nancy Wilson Brock

I am your new corresponding secretary. I acquired this position by sheer luck! I attended a TGS program meeting last summer and President Marty Flanagan said (with a smile on her face) no one was leaving the room until someone volunteered for some positions. She started appointing people to various committees so I figured I better volunteer for a job I might like rather than be appointed to something I had no interest in. Actually, being newly retired, I had been looking for a volunteer position where I had a good fit, although I would never tell Marty that! The best part about my job is that I get to see all of the new quarterlies that come in to the TGS library. These publications are so informative and include so many ideas and stories that can't be found elsewhere. I actually feel lucky to have this position! I highly recommend browsing our TGS library. You may be surprised at the extent of the acquisitions.

I graduated from Topeka High, Kansas State and Washburn with degrees in exercise science, teaching, and physical therapist assistant. Teaching is my love and I have embraced it in preschool through senior adult arenas.

Since retiring, genealogy has become my new hobby. I first became interested in genealogy when my dad and I took a class at Washburn from the late Helen King. She was so good and so meticulous in how she taught that I caught the genealogy bug. I was spurred on by the relentless storytelling of my father about his ancestors.

My genealogical claim to fame is my great-great grandfather, Edmund Francis, who loved to paint. He painted pictures on everything from greeting cards to items he carved from wood. He painted hundreds of pictures, many of which were painted with the black snow of Chicago, 1896. One in particular is in the Smithsonian in Washington D. C. Other works include a 4' by 5' 3D landscape piece complete with miniature railroad, tunnel and people in the railroad cars. This piece hung in my dad and grandad's flower shop, Wilson Florist, for nearly 60 years. I still have his paints and brushes.

I encourage you to become involved in the Topeka Genealogical Society, whether through volunteering, submitting ideas/suggestions or using the library. TGS is a great community to be a part of.

She recently retired from USD #501, and is looking forward to having more time to do research. The Tech Corner

Are You Backing Up Your Devices Or Overwhelmed By It All?

Before we get started, we want our articles to cover topics you care about. We take requests and would love to hear from you. Send requests to tgstopeka.tech@gmail.com. There are so many devices, each with their own intricacies, that thinking about backing up your devices can seem rather daunting. We all know we need to do it yet, well, most of us are procrastinators on at least one topic or another and backup up your computer, phone, tablet or whatever can easily be one of those topics. Some people think backing up our data is like going to visit the in-laws, you know you need to, but simply don't want to so we put it off. We always have a choice! Backing up your devices is a risk mitigation activity. Anytime risk is present one needs to assess the level of risk and then take the appropriate action to mitigate it. So, if you're comfortable that you'll never lose any data, break or lose your phone, or any other kind of calamity, then a backup is not required for you. If you are one of these folks, I would urge you to reconsider for we've all heard news reports where someone is pleading for the thief to return their pictures. For all the rest of us mortals backups are a requirement.

Now that you have made a commitment to backing up your devices, where do you start? If you research the subject online, you will find a large amount of information available and much of it is, in one way or another, trying to sell you a product. You also find technical terminology and again, the overwhelmed feeling starts to set in quickly. What you really want is the bottom line; what do I need to do and how do I set it up. Fact is there are some details that you need to know. This article will dispense with the technical jargon so you can set your mind at ease. Don't let the length of this article scare you, it takes a lot of words to discuss it. We'll take the issues one at a time and provide some guidance on each as we move along.

Issues to consider:

- What devices do you own?
- What do I back up, the whole device or just part of it?
- How often should I back up?
- Where should I locate my backed up data?
- What software should I use?
- What else is important to know?

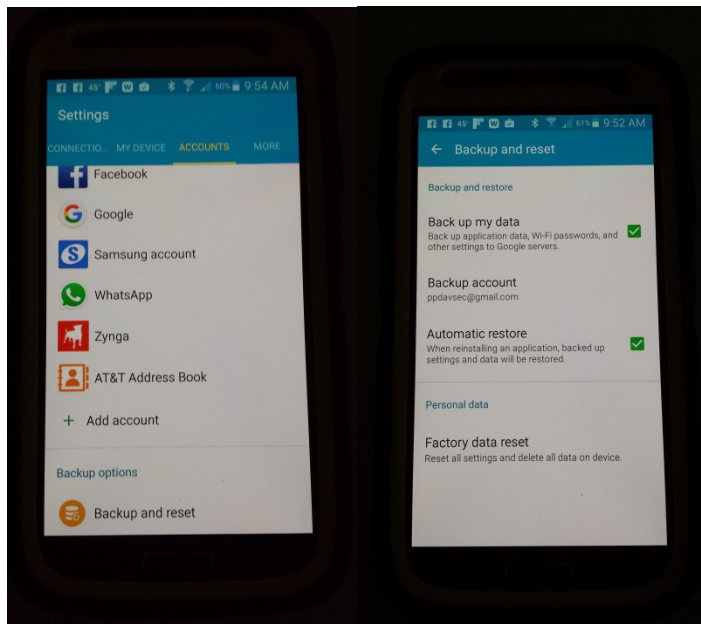
What devices do you own?

Mobile Devices:



Many of us have several mobile devices and/or tablets. They are all computers and all need backed up. Phones and tablets come with preinstalled applications "apps" that are anxious to back up your data. Let one of them. They all backup your device to the cloud and if you lose a file, picture or whatever, you can retrieve it. If you lose your device it is very simple to reload it. You have data on them you don't want to lose so please back them up! Once set up it is all automatic. If you are already doing that, then great, you are already done. Determining if the device is being backed up depends on the manufacturer.

Samsung devices have been shipped with backup options built in for a long time now. To check if backups are being done go to Settings, Accounts, then Backup options. Here if "Back up my data" is checked all is well, if not then touch it to enable it. Ensure under "Backup account" that all your accounts are listed. Then ensure "Automatic restore" is checked, if not enable it. At this point your device is automatically being backed up and reloading after a new phone purchase is automatic as well.



Each manufacturer provides backup capabilities so search your device for a similar feature is shown above. Further help can be found on the internet, calling your device provider or ask a friend to assist. Backing up your mobile devices is just as important as backing up your PC. You will be very glad you did!

Personal Computers (PC):



We tend to think that backing up our PC's is a bigger deal than backing up our mobile devices. Well, it is getting much easier to perform this task than it used to. There are still some hurdles to jump and we will take each, one at a time. First, if you are just stressed out about the whole backup thing, then hire a service or someone, to get it set up for you and be done with it. That would be much better than taking the risk of losing your data. If you are still reading then you must be interested in a hands on approach so read on.

The PC backup software tends to be more involved than for mobile devices. Mobile backups are generally little more an activation of the app and you are done. PC's require more effort. Let's keep our objective in mind, no matter the device, back up our data in case it is lost, damaged, or compromised in some way and you need it back. You may need to restore a single data file, folder, or all your data in the case of a hard drive crash or lost device. These are files you have created directly e.g., photos, or software aided files you created (e.g. Quicken files), NOT what your software has loaded as examples or for promotional purposes. Important Stuff! Ok, nuts and bolts of the issue are next.

What do I back up, the whole device or just part of it?

As the preceding paragraph implies, we are only interested in backing up your data. The entire device includes the operating system (Windows, ...), software applications (Quicken, ...), and supporting files the keep your device operational. If you have a hard drive crash, all those files can be reloaded from their original source.

Speaking of which, it is a good idea, imperative actually, to know where the source is for your operating system and application software. This could be online, DVD, or external storage device, and its key activation code. The key activation code is the 20 or 25 character code normally found on the sleeve of your DVD is in, or on your receipt for software purchased online. No need to regularly back this software up. Your data files created from hard work and lots of time is where the real value lives. That is what we want to back up.

With all of that said it is a good idea to create a system image. A system image is primarily used to restore your PC if the PC is unable to boot. A system image combined with regular data backups is the best way to protect your PC investment. Creating a system image is a multi-step process and is a discussion all its own so look for "Creating a System Image" in the next quarters newsletter.

How often should I back up?

This is always a point of discussion. This really depends on how you use your PC. If you are using it for business purposes, then your backup needs could be continuous, such as every 15 minutes, rather than a snapshot in time such as weekly or monthly. On the other hand casual use could suggest a monthly or quarterly backup. This is

so very dependent upon your use and risk tolerance. The only wrong answer is no back up at all.

Think about how you would feel if someone stole your laptop. One minute you have it and are comfortable, the next you don't and you are in a panic. The level of stress will be dependent on the frequency of your backups. My wife and I had this exact situation when one of our PC's were stolen and our last backup, I'm sorry to say, was just over 60 days old. We survived but did lose some pictures from our trip to Cabo Mexico. We had just moved them to our laptop 2 days before it was stolen. Yes, they broke into our home. It could have been much worse. We backup much more often now. Just decide what you are comfortable with and go with it.

Where should I locate my backed up data?

Data backed up from your hard drive, to your hard drive, is no backup at all. Data backed up to a local thumb drive or other external device is good but not really good enough. Why? A fire, tornado, flood, or any other type of calamity will destroy both your device and your backup. Backing up to a local external device is a good option, when handled correctly, if you are comfortable with that risk. Look for another newsletter article on this option. The remainder of this article will focus on the best option, offsite backup storage.

The primary options for offsite storage are cloud or a manual swapping procedure. The swapping procedure is a process requiring two external storage devices where you keep one onsite, at your home or office, and one offsite preferably far enough away a single event would not take out both your site and the offsite location. The offsite storage device is the most current version while the onsite device is the previous. Each time a backup procedure is completed, using the previous version, swap the storage devices. This procedure provides offsite storage and two versions of your data at all times. In that it is manual it takes more discipline to maintain it.

Cloud storage is the safest and the most convenient. Don't let the term confuse you. Cloud storage is nothing more than hard drive space over the internet existing in an unknown physical location which is where the term comes from. The main disadvantage is that it requires an internet connection. If you find yourself in a situation with no connection for whatever reason, any restore activities will be delayed until you do. If the connection is slow that too can delay your restore efforts. In either case the data is still safe and available.

How does one acquire and use cloud storage space? That will be discussed in the software discussion up next.

What software should I use?

This is a great question because there are so many options. My objective in this article to not get into the weeds so let's explore the requirements of our software selection and then offer good solutions, knowing that clearly there are others.

I offer the following requirements of an automated software selection that once setup will perform automated unattended backup services. These requirements are

capabilities the software should offer before we would consider making a purchase.

- Ability to set backup frequency, by month, week, day and time of day
- Automated backup services requiring no manual intervention
- Ability to backup and restore any given file, folder, or all folders and files
- Provides versioning services for all data files
- 24/7 availability
- Provides compression and encryption services
- Provides local and cloud backups
- Can complete a backup during normal use hours
- Provides unlimited cloud storage at no additional cost
- No, or limited, impact on PC performance
- Receive 4 stars or better by at least one third party reviewer
- Offers customer service support

Although not a requirement, I would propose targeting a worry free automated backup process.

Tools:

This brings us to the tools needed to accomplish these requirements.

Windows 10 provides software tools to backup and restore data files however; these tools do *not* support offsite storage, aka cloud backup services. This motivates us to look into purchasing software or subscribing to a backup service. Purchasing software means repurchasing the software from time to time as major releases become available. While some software vendors do not offer free cloud storage services, most do, normally, with a storage size limit. If additional storage is required it would have to be purchased. Subscribing guarantees no additional software purchases and the trend in the backup software space is a subscriber model rather than a software purchase model. There are several reasons for this but one is that subscriber services often provide unlimited cloud space.

There are at least two subscription based solutions that meet our requirements. Both received the distinguished Editor's Choice award from PC Magazine in January 2016 and both are rated at 4.5 stars. A few things you need to know first. All products, including the two suggested, perform an initial backup whereby all the data files and folders you designate are backed up. This backup, depending on your data volume can take a considerable amount of time. It does not require any of your time, the software will manage it, and you can use your PC while it's in progress but it is best, not required, if the PC remains on and connected the entire time. After that, the only files backed up are those that are added or changed, which is much quicker and there is no need to be concerned with leaving your PC on and connected, it will take care of itself.

Now we'll discuss the suggested products and point out the primary differences between the two products. This is not intended to be an all-inclusive pro's and con's list of the products, just the main differences. They are both excellent products.

CrashPlan Pro <https://store.crashplan.com/store/>

- Rate: \$5 a month for one PC or \$12.50 a month for 2 – 10 PC's. The subscription pays for the unlimited storage space not the software itself. The software is free.
- Allows backups of your data to another location (local or offsite), e.g., another computer (usually local), a friend's computer (usually offsite), or a local external drive. If used in this way a subscription is not required and the software is free. Free backup and recovery yet it also introduces a little more complexity.
- Unlimited online storage.
- Unlimited file versions.
- Keeps deleted files forever. Never lose a file.
- Software is for PC's only (Windows and Mac)
- TGS uses this product to back up their PC's. We did not have a need for the multi-device capabilities and we needed the unlimited space.
- CrashPlan Pro exceeds our requirements with continuous backups, meaning they can be set to occur every few minutes, hours, days, weeks, or months. Very flexible.
- Customizable status reporting.
- Back up will automatically pause if the PC battery is low or loss of internet connection. When the issue is corrected it will pick up where it left off. If the PC is turned off, turned on later and the issue has been corrected, it will again, pick up where it left off. No manual intervention required.

IDrive <https://www.idrive.com/>

- Rate: \$5.83 a month (\$4.34 first year) for as many PC's as you want.
- IDrive fails our requirement of unlimited online storage. The rate quoted above is for 1TB. Additional storage will add to your cost. 1TB is a fair amount of space and it will take a while to use that up however that depends on how many PC's are being backed up, how often and how much data is on each.
- Software is for all devices, phone, PC (Windows and Mac), tablets, whatever. This is a nice feature; it will use online storage space. To take advantage of this you would need to download and install the mobile app on each device. If your mobile devices are already being backed up, it would be redundant to duplicate that here.
- Weekly backups
- Offers IDrive express. They offer to send you an external drive to complete the initial backup. The drive will need returned to them. This is intended to speed up the initial backup process when a large back up is anticipated. This is a free service.

- Offers an IDrive One Device. The One Device is shipped to you to keep and acts as a second "local" backup which complements the cloud backup. With this device you actually have two active backups which the software manages for you. Beyond setup, no additional effort on your part. It offers quick local restores when needed. This drive is encrypted when used with IDrive Online Backup App otherwise it is not encrypted. There is an additional charge for this service.

While there are differences between the products they are both strong candidates. Personally, I have not used iDrive but would not be afraid to use it; it comes highly recommended and has a rich set of features. I have used CrashPlan and have found it to be an excellent choice.

What else is important to know?

If you would like additional software choices, performing an internet search "Review Backup Software" will provide a list of organizations who have reviewed the top products. Read the review results carefully and consider reading reviews from more than one source.

If you are already backing up your devices on a regular schedule then I congratulate you! I would encourage to you to ensure the backed up files are either on an external drive that is secured away when not in use, or is on the cloud. An article in a future newsletter will address backing up with local storage.

File and folder placement on your hard drive is important. Whenever possible placing all file folders in the "My Documents" or "Documents" folder will ensure your files are backed up. While software applications usually provide a default folder location they also allow configuration options for folder placement. Always check new software installs and direct your data to a folder as already described. It would be a good idea to check those already installed as well.

Downloading and installing the backup software of your choice is a straightforward task. Taking all the defaults is a good choice; it will likely catch everything you need, just take care where your data folder is placed. Most applications will provide include and exclude options, which will allow for specialized situations. Backing up your data will provide real peace of mind so you can enjoy your computing adventures.

by Nathan Dylan GOODWIN

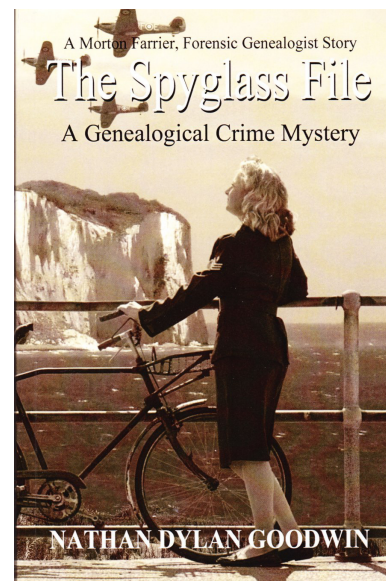
This is the 4th book in the Morton Farrier genealogical crime mystery series. I have not read the other three books in the series, but had no difficulty following the story in this one.

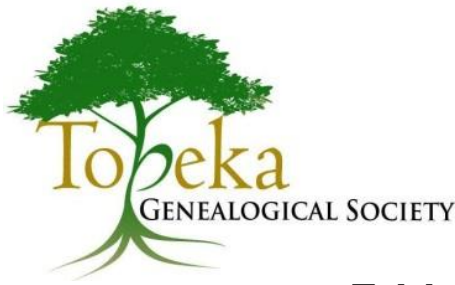

Certain restrictions were put on who could legally be married, including a prohibition of the granting of a marriage license to males under age 21 and females under age 18. Persons younger than that who wished to be married had to provide the Probate Judge written permission from their parent or guardian. For most applications where the applicant was under the age limit, TGS has the written permission along with the original marriage license.

This is not an all inclusive collection due to some applications being given away in prior years.
